NOMINATIONS SENT TO THE SENATE ON JANUARY 12, 1967:

John F. Henning, of California, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to New Zealand.

David S. King, of Utah, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Malagasy Republic.

Robert L. Payton, of Missouri, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Federal Republic of Cameroon.

Everett Hutchinson, of Texas, to be Under Secretary of the Department of Transportation. (New Position)

John E. Robson, of Illinois, to be General Counsel of the Department of Transportation. (New Position)

Arthur E. Goldschmidt, of New York, to be the United States Representative to the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, vice James Roosevelt.

Eugene Victor Rostow, of Connecticut, to be United States Alternate Governor of the International Monetary Fund for a term of five years and United States Alternate Governor of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development for a term of five years.

Elsie H. Wooten, of Tennessee, to be a Member of the Federal Coal Mine Safety Board of Review for the term expiring July 15, 1969.

William B. Buffum, of Maryland, a Foreign Service Officer of Class one, to be the Deputy Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations with the rank and status of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary.
