When the President read the letter he said that he wanted the man to come in to see him. The President walked the Arata's out of Marvin Watson's office, down the hall 12:00n to the Cabinet Room. He introduced the Arratas to his Cabinet, saying to Acting Attorney General Ramsey Clark, "These are friends of mine, and we've been visiting. The Artatas shook hands w/ each Cabinet member. he was a short man w/ a face bearing the signs of time and hard work. She was short and plumb, and clutched in her hand a brown envelope filled with gifts from the President. Both appeared very, very nervous and frightened. From the Cabinet Room, he walked Mr. and Mrs. Arata to the West Lobby where he introduced them to the members of the press
