The Army Band was heard in the distance playing "Onward Christian Soldiers" and "Faith of our Fathers."					to a point by grave site. Commentator announced these young men were hand-picked for this ceremony. "Onward Christian Soldiers" was played ... as Caisson drawn by black horses appeared. The President stood with the mourners as the casket was placed in position, then he was seated with the family of Lt. Col. Virgil Grissom. (He appeared on the right side of the screen, seated to the left of Col. Grissom's mother.) After brief remarks by the minister, an honour salute was fired, "Taps" played, the salute of a formation of jets flew over with the vacant spot signifying the loss of a comrade, and the Honor Guard folded the American flag which they had held over the casket during the ceremony and then presented it to Col Grissom's widow. The President then offered his sympathy to Mrs. Grissom, (Col. Grissom's widow), the Grissom children, then his parents.
