**MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD**

**March 10, 1967**

The President left the White House at 12:35 p.m., accompanied by Mrs. Johnson, George Christian, Helen Thomas of United Press International, Frank Cormier of the Associated Press, Bob Pierpoint of CBS, and Chairman Mahan of the House Appropriations Committee. On his arrival at the Constitution Avenue entrance to the Justice Department, he was greeted by cheers from the crowd which was standing on each side of barricades adjacent to the entrance. On his way into the building, he stopped to shake hands with some of the Justice employees.

Assembled in the Great Hall of Justice were approximately 400 of Ramsey Clark's friends and associates. Upon entering, the President greeted Ramsey's wife and son and smiled as he shook hands with the about-to-be sworn in Attorney General. He then walked to the front row of the crowd, where he embraced Mrs. Tom Clark, then grasped the hand of his old friend, Justice Tom Clark. He then proceeded down the line shaking hands with FBI Director Hoover, Chief Justice Earl Warren, and New York Senator Robert Kennedy.

He was introduced to the audience by Solicitor General Thurgood Marshall who also sat on the platform.

The President delivered a very well received speech, highlighting his aspirations for the new Attorney General in dedication of his administration to elimination of crime in America. He said that he thought he had the type of Commander in Chief to fight this "other war -- the war against crime in the streets of this country."

The crowd applauded warmly as the President recalled his early remembrance of Ramsey Clark, particularly when he was serving in the Justice Department in knee britches. He recalled that the Attorney General Tom Clark had instituted a suggestion box at the Justice Department for employees who wished to make productive remarks about changes which could be made in the Department. One suggestion he received irritated him a bit, however. He asked the FBI Director to find out who had submitted a suggestion which said that the Attorney General should not be wearing such bright bow ties. Reluctantly the FBI Director advised the Attorney General that it was Tom Clark's young son, Ramsey, who had made the suggestion.

After his speech Justice Tom Clark swore in Ramsey as the new Attorney General, with the President looking on proudly from behind. Several of the women in the audience were visably moved by the speech and by the warmth

of the ceremony. The President departed at 1:07 p.m. and returned to the White House accompanied by the same members of the press.
