The President ate chipped beef, melon balls, and tea while he talked with Jake Jacobsen (the only person who preceded the President in getting up this morning), mf, and marys. The President and JJ were talking about the meeting with the governors of the preceding day-they agreed that Rhodes was very impressive and had given a very good speech. The President said he thought Governor Paul Johnson of Mississippi was a good man and that we should do more with him. Governor John Burns of Hawaii came out of his bunk which he had shared with Mrs. Burns 7:30a in the back of the airplane and added his ideas about the conference -- saying that several of the governors, including Governor Romney, said it was the best thing that had been done and had proved most helpful. As a result of the conference Governor Bryant and his group had been invited to ten or fifteen more states. The President questioned JJ closely about those trips wanting to know who the impressive speakers were, etc. Secy Robert McNamara --- He had been asked earlier to join the President for breakfast, 7:45a but had been asleep. He now came to the back of the plane and sat on the bench by the typing table for breakfast. Secy Rusk came out, and the President suggested that they all go back into the bedroom 8:00a for further talks.
