Henry Cabot Lodge, of Massachusetts, to be Ambassador at Large.

Ellsworth Bunker, of Vermont, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the Republic of Viet-Nam, vice Henry Cabot Lodge.

William W. Heath, of Texas, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Sweden.

John M. McSweeney, of Nebraska, a Foreign Service Officer of Class one, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Bulgaria.

Douglas MacArthur II, of the District of Columbia, a Foreign Service Officer of the Class of Career Ambassador, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Austria.

Richard H. Nolte, of Connecticut, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to the United Arab Republic.

Karl F. Rolvaag, of Minnesota, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Iceland.

Claude G. Ross, of California, a Foreign Service Officer of Class one, to be Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States of America to Haiti.

Manuel F. L. Guerrero, of Guam, to be Governor of Guam for a term of four years. (Reappointment)
