Kappel, the recently retired Chairman of the Board of AT&T Today sent memo to heads of all Federal departments and agencies on the subject of aircraft noise and compatible land used in the vicinity of airports. The President today delegated to the Secy of Agriculture authbrity to designate grazing lands as "acute distress areas" whenever the Secv determines that drought, hurricanes, floods, blizzards, or other natural catastrophies materially increase the economic distress of needy Indians. Today made available an additional \$4 million in Federal disaster. relief funds for use in Calffornia. Today released the statutory report transmittal to the Congress of the First Annual Report on the operation of the Automotive Products Trade Act of 1965 The President accepted the resignation of Aaron S. Brown as Ambassador to Nicaragua, to be effective at a date to be determined. Prime Minister Harold Holt of Australia accepted President Johnson's invitation to stop over in Washington on June 1 en route to Montreal.
