					According to yb's translations when the speeches were carried on television, all the Presidents mentioned their own economic progress and the need for unity in the common market (she was speaking of the Presidents of Chile, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Mexico). The subjects ranged from Alliance for Progress, world trade, international education, agrarian reform, U. S. assistance in development of technical sciences, etc.

					The President was talking on a variety of subjects--his impressions of the other Chiefs of States, his ideas for the speech tomorrow, etc.	
					He said that on the Alliance for Progress we have lived up to expectations--we had claimed that we would spend \$10 billion dollars in programs in Latin America in ten years--in six years we have spent over \$9 billion already. In the past three years alone we have spent more than \$5 billion dollars.	
					The President said we needed more vigorous planning and follow-through on the programs.	
					The President said more schools, food, trade, tax reform, land reform were essential--sights must be held high. We do these things in the United States by lading taxes and collecting them. The President again asserted that he had put over five billion dollars in the Hemisphere in the past three years.	
					The President said that although many people think he never listens, he had spent the day listening and was convinced that he had learned more than many of our supposed Latin American experts seemed to know. The President said that he thought that Central America was with us all the way and so was Brazil.

					The President said that he and Roosevelt were two activists and idealists of administration.	
					The President said that it was remarkable to him how he had been able to become a national leader from a state like Texas which produced such a wide span of political men such as Yarborough and Tower.	
					The President said if you really searched deep into his heart and tried to find what he was proudest of, it would be his going into the Dominican Republic--"The only thing I would do different if I had it to do over again, would be to go in an hour earlier."	
					The President said that although we have come a long way since then, Mr. Monroe had a very sound Doctrine and in essence it still held--we should be all for one and one for all.	
					The President said if he were going to choose someone to go out and be on his side in a fight it would be Costa e Silva of Brazil. The President said that was one country which might not believe in our Bill of Rights, but they were strongly anti-Communist and would never become Communist. Costa e Silva was our friend and could be depended upon.	
					The President said the Dictator of Paraguay had come up to him and said in essence that he and his country were for the President and the United States "all the way." The President said he wasn't even sure where Paraguay was, but he wanted to find out and wanted to go there.

					The President remarked that it was strange that those countries which we try to ignore because they are dictatorships seem to be our closest friends and our most trustworthy friends and would be the last ones to become Communist--examples he cited were Brazil, Paraguay, Nicaragua, El Salvador.	
					The President evaluated the speeches of the day as the best ones being made by President Frei of Chile	
					President Jose Trejos of Costa Rica	
					and President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz of Mexico

					The President was amazed to hear Secy Rusk's view that the speech of President Robles was good in the Secy's view--Secy Rusk said it could have been much stronger and worse. The President and Ambassador Hoyt agreed that it was the worse of the speeches of the day though for it dealt exculsively with the Panama Canal--whdh succeeded in boring 19 Presidents.	
					The President, Amb Hoyt, and Secy Rusk all agreed that there had been nothing said today which they could take hometo show the American tax-payers that their money was appreciated. Secy Rusk said perhaps the Dominican Republic would provide something good to take back in tomorrow's speech, but he thought that would be the only hope.	
					The President and Secy Rusk said that unless some evidence was presented that the money was appreciated, they did not know if they could pass any <del>kind</del> kind of AID bill.
