Jha of India, Secretary to the Indian Prime Minister Walt Rostow (he had been to Moscow for a visit) Under Secy of State Katzbach recommended that the President see Mr. Jha. He is in Washington after visiting Moscow and prior to going on to London. Mr. Wriggins made notes for the President's diary -- excerpts from which follow: "Jha sought the President's views on a security declaration paralleling a similar, though not identical, Soviet declaration to be made public at the time of signing a non-proliferation treaty. Jha obtained from Moscow a purported Soviet draft text which the President had seen only the previous evening. The President expressed interest in the text; he takes this problem seriously; his staff would look into the problem promptly and be back in touch with the Indians. The President also stressed our many efforts to reach peace in VietNam, and hoped that with Ambassador Bunker now there, the Indians might be able to be more helpful. He thanked Jha and Ambassador Nehru for an invitation to come to New Delhi. It might be possible next year; but of course he could make no commitment this far in advance." (Wriggins memo to DT)
