When Father Schneider was silent, the President again asked, "What time do you want to get up in the morning?" This time Father Schneider replied he didnot even know where he was going to sleep tonight. When the President replied that he was going to stay at the White House, Father Schneider's face lit up and he replied that if the President would let him go to bed rather early, he might sleep until about eight o'clock. Thereupon the President set the watch. The President then gave Father Schneider a bookmark pointing out it was made from deerskin from the Ranch. Next he presented Father Schneider a knife, demonstrating all the parts that were on the knife. Father Schneider said he had never had so many things at once.
