					Upon arrival at the Americana Hotel the President moved quickly and uneventually to his suite on the 10th floor, to dress and wait for Lynda Bird and Mrs. Johnson. (Yolanda Boozer and Juanita Roberts waited outside door designated as one where typewriter would be available for retyping the State Democratic Dinner speech. As more men went into the room to change into evening clothes, -- further delaying the start of retyping the speech, another room was opened and set up for this work. When the speech was retyped by Yolanda Boozer and proofed, she and MJDR found all on that floor gone downstairs. The party was located at a reception ... in a room off the ballroom.	
					YB and MJDR located the entrance for the President's next appearance and waited there for the party which formed about pm. The President and Mrs. Johnson stood in the kitchen anti-room to the ballroom for approx 6:57p to 7:06p without talking with each other nor with anyone else except Arthur Krim who apparently had a message for the President and spoke to him for a moment. Also, an unknown gentleman brought and offered a chair to Mrs. Johnson (who then was patting and rubbing the President's back). Mrs. Johnson declined the chair. During this period the head table guests filed by and took their places on the dais.	
	6:30pm				The President, Mrs. Johnson, Lynda to Head Table Reception - pictures <del>President entered ballroom - The Americana Hotel. The Vice President immediately presented Lynda to the audience.</del> Applause. The Vice President said "Lynda is my date as Mrs. Humphrey is not feeling well tonight. The Vice President then presented Mrs. Johnson. The applause was slightly louder and longer followed by the VP's presentation (accompanied by Hail to the Chief) of the President. There were a couple of shouts ahead of an encouraging applause.

There was a delay here -- someone calling out "wait for Sen. Kennedy." The wait seemed much longer than time would indicate it to be. No one made an effort to talk with the President. He just leaned back against the side wall and sniffed his inhalator. (accompanied by Mrs. Johnson, Lynda, Sen. Robt Kennedy, Ed Weisl )	
					The short drive from the Americana to the Waldorf was relatively quiet and uneventful. Intersections were heavily populated with people who, tho quiet, seemed friendly. -- no ugly signs, no shouts.
