He felt that President Nasser, in accusing the US and Britain of involvement in Israeli air attacks, was trying to trigger a cutoff of bil supplies by the oil producing Arab countries, thereby shifting the confrontation on to other shoulders. The meeting closed with the President expressing his hope that the Shah would be able to reschedule his visit to Washington and asked Ambass dor Meyer to convey his warmest wishes to the hah, the Empress, and their children.
