The President and motorcade arrived the airstrip at Dulles International Airport and drove to the area between the waiting 707 for the Prime Minister & his party to fly to Los Angeles in (from L. A. the PM and his party and the Clarks will fly by Pan Am to Honolulu for the night. Tomorrow night they will continue by Quantas to Australia.) and the waiting helicopter for the President to return to the White House. There was a small PRESS POOL waiting to greet the two heads of state and record their farewells.

8:20a

The President said goodbye to all the guests, and then boarded his helicopter to join mf. mary s. Oke, Lt. Cdr. Hobbs, Dr. Fox, and USSS personnel.

The helicopter waited until USAF 86972 w/ the Prime Minister and his party began rolling, then as the 707 turned one way onto the runway, the helicopter turned the other direction

8:25am

Marine One departed Dulles International Airport en route the White House-- the President read over the copy of his remarks which he was to give at State Department this morning. (The President had requested and received some press copies of the speech, which he gave to the Prime Minister at the airport. The President had kept two for himself. After reading the speech over, the President asked that he be given the number of words and then leaned back for a short nap.
