Mr. Das has just come from Thailand, SoVNam, Manila and Tokyo. He said he has talked to leaders of all those countries and wants to discuss some of the subjects he discussed with them. He expressed strong admiration for Pres.'s Asian policies saying he feels the President is "doing a grand job in Asia" and there is no doubt that the U. S. intervention is preventing Asian nations from falling to Red China. Mr. Das is retired as Chief Editor of the Hindustan Times (a major English daily) in 1959, has since founded the India News and Feature Alliance of which is presently Managing Editor. More than 100 Indian newspapers subscribe to the Alliance's syndicated service. He is preparing a book which will include an appraisal of India as seen from abroad by both foreign leaders and common people. In addition he expects to prepare a series of articles on his trip which will be released by his own syndicated service.
