Mr. S. Pillen Ripley of the Smithsonian Senator William Benton, Chairman of the Board of the Encyclopedia Britannica and President of the Encyclopedia Britannica The President then went upstains to a RECEPTION attended by approx. 450 guests (invited). Mr. Ripley opened the ceremony and briefly introduced Sen. Benton. Sen. Benton then spoke approximately 10 minutes about the great work done by the Encycopedia. He then concluded his remarks by presenting approximately I million dollars in retail value worth of Encyclopedia Britannicas to 1000 schools to be selected by the Office of Education and the Encyclopedia. The President then spoke -- REMARKS -- for approx. 25 minutes on education and health. He was in great good humor and his speech was enthusiastically received.
