					Hawaiian music playing, girls in long red flowered mumus, putting leis on the newly arrived necks. "Hail to the Chief," and a 21 gun salute... the national anthem... good signs, a very large one, "God Bless you, Mr. President."	
					Most signs centered around peace effort, with central theme being "good luck on your trip toward peace."	
					The President reviewed the troops.	
					He then went to a small podium and with Governor Burns at his side, faced the crowd. Just in front of the podium was a group of Jobs Corpsmen who sang a traditional aloha welcome song for the President.

					Good crowds along the way, many, many children along the route - schools had been let out for the President's arrival, waving and yelling, lots of homemade signs, "Aloha to little Lyn's Grandpa, " "We're still with LBJ" "God Bless you, " "We like Lyn, " and "Where's Lady Bird. "	
					In one section of downtown Honolulu, the crowds were throwing literally buckets and waste baskets full of confetti. . . . they didn't just throw the stuff, they just dumped the baskets -- and much of the crowd was obliterated by confetti from above windows.	
	1:40p				The President's motorcade arrived the Iolani Palace	
					--the cars stopped at the rear of the Palace and the President went through the halls and freshened up a bit before coming outside. Outside the crowd -- approx 4,000 -- waited... a good band playing the "Hawaiian War Chant," and several hula girls dancing at the bottom of the steps...but in the very front several anti-Vietnam demonstrators were located. They were fairly noisy, and before the President came out on to the Palace balcony, their signs using Jesus' name and their loud cries XXXX could be heard, "Hey, Hey, LBJ, how many boys did you kill today, "....but there was a large group of Johnson sympathizers in
