Cyrus Vance Hon. Wm. P. Bundy, Ass't Secy f East Asian and Pacific Affairs Gen. Charles Bonesteel, III, Comdr-in-Chief United Nations Command, Korea for exchange of greetings and then the President joined mjdr for a tour of the main house.	
	9:51a					Returned to the entrance to await the arrival of His Excellency PARK Chung Hee, President of Korea. The President visited with staff and others while waiting -- asking Rostow and Vance about the results of their discussions of last evening	
	9:54a					General Earle G. Wheeler, Chmn, Joint Chiefs of Staff, arrived with: Gen. Dwight Beach, Comdr-in-Chief, US Army, Pacific Admr. U. S. Grant Sharp, CINCPAC Admr. John McCain, Jr., Comdr-in-Chief, US Naval Forces, Europe (CICNCUSNAVEUR) [REDACTED] They stopped to greet the President and, without further conversation with him, walked on into the living room.

C					The President introduced to President Park General Wheeler, General Bonesteel, Admiral McCain, Admiral Sharp, General Beach, Ambassador William J. Porter (Amb to Korea) Ambassador Winthrop G. Brown (former Ambassador to Korea and now Special Assistant to the Secretary of State for Liaison with Governors), Mr. Vance, Mr. Bundy, and Mr. Rostow ---- formed informally into a receiving line at the entrance to the living room.	
					The two Presidents moved on into the living room and around and out onto the lanais (porches or galleries surrounding the living room and pool areas). President Johnson "showing" the house and views of the sea and the mountains. Okamoto followed taking pictures.	
	10:03a	10:05a			Two Presidents took seats in the living room for "posed" picture-taking by American and Korean photographers accompanying the two Presidents. After some moments of talk in this location, the two Presidents moved into the Library to begin their discussions. Interpreters were:

					While the two Presidents, with their interpreters, met in the library, the American and Korean counterparts met in various parts of the living room and lanais.

					The Koreans had not brought gifts, but a note to the President so advising him asked if he wanted to go ahead and present his gifts to President Park. He did. It was then discovered that the saddle which had been brought to Hawaii as a gift for President Park was not the correct one but one that had been a gift to Vice President Lyndon Johnson, recently on display at the Smithsonian in the Presidential Hobbies Room -- a new exhibit. A note was typed up for President Johnson to use in showing the saddle as an example of one now being made for President Park and that would be shipped to him when completed.
