					When the President landed at the LBJ Ranch, he was greeted by Mrs. Johnson, Liz Carpenter, and Simone Poulain. His first words to Mrs. Johnson were, "Should we stay here, or should we go to Haywood. We're just passing through." She laughed, and said "no indeed, things will be fine here."	
					Mrs. Johnson is in the process of doing some filming in the Ranch house-- a decision made after her visit to Oyster Bay to Theodore Roosevelt's Home. She is recording on film some of the personal and historical events at the LBJ Ranch. The President assured her that he and his staff would cause no trouble, that we would get up early in the morning and leave the area, and not be in her way. She explained that things would be fine, and was sure we could work it out. Traffic in and out of the house was kept to a minimum.	
					The house itself was a collage of cameras, cables, and lights. Outside windows were covered w/ large sheets of heavy orange cellophane. When the recording itself was taking place, no sound could be allowed in the house. Phones had to be shut off and business service machines were shut off. The President planned his days so as to be out of the house during the recording hours. Staff members left their rooms in the morning and were prepared to operate mobile on the move. Typing
