

Others besides Presidents who were present at the signing included the luncheon guests listed above. Briefly, the Declaration of San Salvador states three things: (1) the accomplishment of the Central American Common Market: (2) the 13 major tasks that the Central American Common Market faces in the time ahead; and (3) the United States' support of the Central American Common Market and the United States' commitment to future support with to the Central American Common Market.

President Johnson arrived at the residence of the 4:20p American Ambassador (Raul Castro) whose house had been vacated by the Castro family and made available for the President and Mrs. Johnson, Luci Nugent, Helen Williams, Marie Fehmer, Yolanda Boozer, and Mary Rather, Mrs. Noemi Wilson, 19 Av. N. 139, San Salvador, an American school teacher for 35 years at the American school in San Salvador, was among the people waiting on the street to see the President. Said she had been there all day. Rafael A. Meza D and his two young sons Wilfredo and Hector who lived a short distance from the Ambassador's house spoke to the President, and the boys gave the President a large bouquet of beautiful red gladiolas. President looked at the downstairs briefly and remarked about how nice it was and whether anyonee had used the swimming pool. and then went to his room upstairs to rest. President sent for Chief Mills to give him a massage.
