January 6, 1969
Monday - 8:30 p.m.


The President and Mrs. Johnson departed the White House for Capitol Hill accompanied by Senator Howard W. Cannon. Cannon and the President visited on the trip up Independence Avenue to the Longworth House Office Building cafeteria.

The President and Mrs. Johnson were met at the entrance of the Longworth Building by Speaker McCormack, Congressmen Carl Albert, Hale Boggs, Gerald Ford, and Senator Mike Mansfield. They proceeded to the cafeteria where the President shook hands with the 500-600 Members of the House and Senate and wives who attended the reception.

Congressman Albert acted as Master of Ceremonies and introduced Senator Mike Mansfield and Congressman Hale Boggs to make brief welcoming remarks. Congressman Fred Schwengel of Iowa presented a set of books on the Capitol. Mrs. Johnson made brief remarks and thanked everyone for the books.

Senator McCormack then introduced the President and the President spoke, after which the Members of Congress spontaneously sang Auld Lang Syne.

The President and Mrs. Johnson shook hands with all attending and then left with Mike Manatos, Barefoot Sanders, and myself in the car to return to the White House.
