- 1/1 **LBJ (Lyndon Johnson)** flies to Dallas with **CTJ (Lady Bird Johnson)**, **WJ (Walter Jenkins)**, **MMW (Mary Margaret Wiley)**, and Moursunds; they meet the Gene Chambers, Mrs. West, and Mr. & Mrs. Charles McGaha, attend Cotton Bowl game, return later to Ranch.
- 1/2 LBJ flies to Palm Beach, Florida for conferences on defense matters with JFK, McNamara and others.
- 1/3 Continued defense meetings. LBJ returns Austin, late afternoon.
- 1/4 Meets with Bobbitt, Rodney and Jim Ross re: Rodney's future. Johnsons and MMW drive to Ranch.
- 1/5 Spends day at Ranch and at Moursunds. **CTJ (Lady Bird Johnson)** goes to Austin.
- 1/6 No entry.
- 1/7 LBJ drives into Austin for contact lens fitting. In afternoon, Johnsons MMW, Helen and Gene Williams, and Lee and Edgar Gregg fly to Washington.
- 1/8 WH leadership breakfast. Leadership lunch at Rusk's office. LBJ meets with Tom Wicker and Bill Theis, and talks with Edgar Perry (C.C.), Mary Lasker, Jerry Holleman, Les Carpenter, and Sen. Dirksen.

- 1/9 Bipartisan leadership breakfast and then cabinet meeting at WH. During afternoon, LBJ calls Carl Rowan to ask him to help on speech for Jewish Congress dinner; then calls Bobby Baker about whether or not to accept invitation from Jewish Congress.
- 1/10 Democratic Conference. Then LBJ meets with Texas delegation. During afternoon meets with Walker Stone, talks with Thornberry re: Will Wilson wire (?), and later to Lee White and Arthur Goldberg re: Bobby Troutman.
- 1/11 Talks with Goldberg re: Troutman. At 12:30 Kennedy delivers State of Union Message before Joint Session. LBJ later meets in Mansfield's office with people from White House and DNC. Dinner party at home with REA and LCRA members.
- 1/12 Arthur Goldberg hosts black-tie dinner at Labor Dept. in honor of LBJ and CTJ.
- 1/13 LBJ presents Mr. Sam Award to Joe Martin, Jr., at Touchdown Club Annual Awards Dinner.
- 1/14 Attends dedication ceremonies for new Alexandria, Va. hospital.
- 1/15 Meets with Sec. Hodges and members of Trade Commission going to Burma. At noon, hosts lunch in P-38 with Ambassador Carrillo Flores, Mexican singers, the Miguel Guajardos, the Henry Gonzaleses, others. Attends Ed Shelton and Show publishers and editors party at National Press Club. Stops by Philippine Embassy to say goodbye to Amb. and Mrs. Romulo.
- 1/16 WH leadership breakfast. LBJ later makes speech to Civil Service Commission. Attends Policy Committee lunch at Skeeter's.
- 1/17 Meeting of Democratic senators at White House. Apparently hosted dinner for Mexican group (above) at The Elms.
- 1/18 WH coffee for Democratic congressmen, followed by NSC meeting. Talks during afternoon with General Maxwell Taylor. Meets with John Young, Palmer Hoyt, Mary Lasker and Anna Rosenberg, Mrs. H.H. Weinert, and Marvin Watson.
- 1/19 P-38. Meets with Stanley Marcus, Ed Connally, Mr. Choate (*Boston Herald-Traveler*), Mr. & Mrs. Hobart Taylor, Jr., Jim Pipkin and Augustus Long of Texaco, and Frank Mayborn. Talks with Woodrow Seals and with Secy. Freeman.
- 1/20 Lunch at White House for [Democratic?] contributors. Mayor Wagner's reception. First anniversary celebration of Democratic Dinner at Armory.
- 1/21 Hosts reception for out-of-town Texans in town for Demo. dinner. Attends Hale Boggs' reception and buffet for House leadership.

- 1/22 Addresses AFL-CIO Legislative Conference and attends luncheon in his honor. During day talks with Halaby (FAA) re: J.T. Rutherford and with Rutherford re: conversation with Halaby, and later with Jerry Holleman re: J.T. Holleman [Rutherford]. Meets with Rutherford, Hobart Taylor, Jr. Calls George Weaver to apologize for incident at Houston Shamrock Hotel, and later talks with Angier Biddle Duke re: Weaver and Shamrock incident.
- 1/23 WH leadership breakfast. LBJ meets with Dan Jones and Harold Decker of IPAA. Lunch at WH with editors, publishers and JFK. Meets with Erwin James, Mr. Hold and Mr. Robinson of Alabama in EOB, later with Hank Brown. Burros Club reception.
- 1/24 Attends WH luncheon--briefing session before JFK press conference. Meets with Chalmers Roberts; Congressman Fisher and Lewis Seibert; Willard Simmons; J.R. Parten. Addresses Big Brothers Dinner at Mayflower.
- 1/25 Smithsonian Board of Regents meeting. Meets during day with Sen. Hayden; Clark Thompson; Roland Boyd; Fred Korth. Talks with Arthur Goldberg; Tiger Teague; Ramsey Clark; Henry Gonzales; with Yarborough re: Dobbs for Marshal in San Antonio. Makes television and phone call to Graham Purcell with JFK at WH. Attends reception for oil industry leaders.
- 1/26 Meets with Arthur Goldberg. Speaks to administrative assistants to Democratic senators and congressmen at State Dept.
- 1/27 7 a.m. LBJ watches television at Webb's office, but space shot is called off. Sometime early that morning he and CTJ call Anne Glenn.
- 1/28 At home all day, except for meeting Mr. & Mrs. Graham Purcell at Friendship and stopping by Thornberry office staff party.
- 1/29 Attends coffee in McCormack's office for Purcell. Meets with Gene Chambers; Bob Donovan (*Times Herald*); Andrew Heiskell (*Life*)--discussed *Life* problem and inaccurate *Life* report on Bashir, read him Ambassador Rountree's letter.
- 1/30 WH leadership breakfast. Meets with Jim Rowe; Clark Fisher (re: Goodfellow); Roger Hilsman re: report on Vietnam. Talks by phone with Houston Harte re: governor's race, Ray Roberts and Slagle race, and Goodfellow AFB; with Mr. Dreyfuss of *New York Times* re: inaccurate story of VP supporting Slagle; with Henry Gonzales; with Lew Deschler re: National Indignation Congress petitions.
- 1/31 Meets with Sen. Jackson and Anderson and Mr. & Mrs. Laurence Rockefeller; A.J. Hayes of Machinists Union; Walter Gray (COPE) and Cliff Carter.

February

- 2/1 Meets with John Young, Mayor Spikes of Beeville, and Cecil Burney re: broom corn tariff; later talks with Mike Feldman and with Sen. Kerr re: tariff and Mayor Spikes. Talks during day with Jerome Weisner (JFK's science adviser); Troutman; Ed Clark; Jim Wright; Gov. Ellington of Tennessee; Henry Gonzales re: governor's race; Charlie Boatner. Meets with Holmes Alexander. Attends reception at WH for Rusk to welcome him back from Punta del Este conference. Drops by reception for legislative Brotherhood of Railroad trainmen, and Al Chesser; speaks and receives award at Silver Quill dinner.
- 2/2 Talks with Houston Harte re: governor's race and Goodfellow AFB. Meets with Hugh Sidey of *Time*. Dinner at McGeorge Bundys.
- 2/3 P-38.
- 2/4 Meets Mr. & Mrs. Ray Roberts at National Airport. Drops by Perle Mesta's reception and Ceylon anniversary reception. Dinner with Mr. & Mrs. Georges Litman.
- 2/5 Attends coffee for Ray Roberts in Board of Education room given by Wright Patman. Talks with Cliff [Carter?] re: Oscar Wyatt; with Sam Low, Charles Kazen and Mrs. Minnie Zoller re: their confirmation as customs collectors. Attends WH luncheon for Premier Adoula of Congo.
- 2/6 WH leadership breakfast. Presented with sword from Spain by Henry Gonzales and Charlton Heston. Talks with Sec. Ribicoff re: using Liz Carpenter to write Gridiron speech. Meets with Negro leaders.
- 2/7 WH breakfast with JFK, Salinger, others, for pre-press conference briefing. Attends signing of Plans for Progress at WH. Flies to Atlantic City to address Automobile Dealers Convention and attends reception with Texas automobile dealers. Returns to D.C.
- 2/8 Cabinet meeting at WH. Meets with Loye Miller of *Time*, later with Cliff and Jack Scaggs. Talks with Sen. Jordan re: Elon College, later with Palmer Hoyt. Meets CTJ at National Airport .
- 2/9 Talks with all departmental secretaries--Rusk; Dillon; Postmaster General; Udall; McNamara; Freeman--and Byron White, re: vacancies, "make sure no discrimination; make study of the Negroes you have employed; see if we are taking proper action in upgrading and promoting them." Inspects B45. Attends WH dinner-dance for Mr. & Mrs. Stephen Smith.

- 2/10 Attends wedding of Clark Clifford's daughter. Travels to Newark, N.J. that evening with CTJ and Stu Knight to speak at Democratic dinner. Returns to D.C.
- 2/11 Attends church services at National City Christian Church, and later Texas State Society reception in House Ways and Means Committee Room.
- 2/12 P-38. Drops by luncheon for Sen. Moreno Sanchez of Mexico and Justo Sierra, hosted by Mansfield. Meets with Reedy, Goldberg and Fortas in EOB. Hosts reception at home for President's Commission on Status of Women.
- 2/13 Speaks to compliance officers at Brookings Institute. Attends luncheon meeting with Rusk and senators on Congo policy, at State. Meets with Goldberg, Reedy and Fortas at EOB. Calls Joe Moody, National Coal Policy Conference, per Bobby Baker's request. Stops by Mayflower for old Truman Committee reunion dinner. Attends WH stag dinner for King Saud, afterwards goes to Sargent Shriver's dinner-dance for Amb. and Mrs. William Blair with JFK and Powers.
- 2/14 Pre-press conference briefing at WH breakfast with JFK and Salinger. Makes farewell remarks to King Saud at Andrews. Watches JFK's press conference on television. Calls: Gov. Price Daniel to invite him to lunch or dinner with Walter Lippmann; Pierre Salinger re: RFK's statement in Indonesia about Texas and Mexican war; Lawn Thompson re: whether or not safe to take steam bath, Thompson says it's all right; Adam Yarmolinsky in Defense re: meeting of EEOC tomorrow. Salinger calls twice re: RFK statement.
- 2/15 Attends EEOC meeting. Meets with Goldberg, Holleman and Roy Wilkins.
- 2/16 P-38. Talks with: John Macy; Bill Theis re: story in *Times* about yesterday's meeting with Goldberg and Wilkins; Clark Fisher; Horace Busby, asking him to go to Texas. Flies to Houston with CTJ, Liz Carpenter, and MMW. MMW gets off in Houston, group flies on to Austin; Johnsons apparently go to Ranch.
- 2/17 Shows Walter Lippmann the Haywood Ranch at Llano. (Lippmann apparently houseguest) Johnsons host dinner at Ranch for Lippmann, Liz Carpenter, Jack Valenti, MMW, Dean Ahmstead, Dean Haggerty, Moursunds, Price Daniels, Bill Steven of *Houston Chronicle*, Paul Bolton.
- 2/18 Lying in sun talking to Lippmann. Joined at lunch by CTJ, Valenti, MMW, John Connallys, Harry Ransoms, Liz Carpenter, Angus Wynne, Jr. and wife. Late afternoon LBJ, CTJ, Liz Carpenter and MMW fly to Andrews, return to The Elms.
- 2/19 Attends lunch at WH for Hugh Gaitsell. Meets in afternoon with Hank Moon and others (aircraft workers). Talks with Loye Miller of *Time*, re: story on VP in this week's issue. Also talks with Reedy re: *US News & World Report* stories and other

- stories on VP. Calls Bob Ruth of *US News* re: "Capitol Whispers" column, tells him he has no such feelings about "intellectuals" and doesn't mind RFK's trips at all.
- 2/20 WH leadership breakfast. Calls Jim Webb to congratulate him on Col. Glenn's flight into orbit. Attends WH dinner honoring VP, Chief Justice and Speaker.
- 2/21 Attends briefing session with JFK prior to bipartisan meeting at WH. That afternoon attends working session at WH with Salinger and JFK prior to his press conference. Meets in afternoon with Sen. Clements; Levy of Machinists Union; Loye Miller. Dinner at Shriver's home.
- 2/22 P-38. Talks with Lew Deschler; Cong. Fulton; Kerr; Weaver; Frank Ellis; John McCone (CIA); Jim Webb. Has dinner at home with Lynda and goes to bed early in order to get up and take plane at 2 a.m. for Grand Turk to meet Col. Glenn.
- 2/23 Dinner with President and Mrs. Kennedy, Prince and Princess Radziwill at Kennedy house in Palm Beach; spends night at Charles Wrightsmans.
- 2/24 (Apparently LBJ returns to Washington.) Speaks to press secretaries of governors at State Department, with Salinger presiding.
- 2/25 The Elms.
- 2/26 Goes to White House in late morning to wait for President and Col. John Glenn. Attends Joint Session of Congress to hear Glenn speak. Hosts luncheon at State Department for Glenn. After meeting with Speaker, meets with Jim Webb and Bill Lloyd in P-38 to discuss going to New York with Glenn. Talks with Busby re: *US News* story and other matters. Meets CTJ's plane that evening. Meets with Busby, Reedy and Howard Burris at home to prepare for NSC meeting tomorrow.
- 2/27 WH leadership breakfast. Attends National Security Council meeting at WH. Meets with Lynda's school class and CTJ in P-38 for refreshments. Meets with Keith Kahle and Ed Connally, later with Carl Rowan. Calls Sec. U. Alexis Johnson re: palace bombing in Saigon. Calls Cong. Curtis and apparently resolved some problem relating to EEOC. Meets with Walker Stone; Howard McMahon. Attends Sec. Korth's buffet for Col. Glenn in Pentagon dining room, later goes to NASA headquarters for supper for astronauts.
- 2/28 Meets with Texas delegation with Mike Guajardo, and again with Mike Guajardo and Ed Clark; Loye Miller and Champ Clark; Claude Wild. Talks with Jim Webb and with Mayor Wagner re: coming to NYC with Col. Glenn. Goes to WH at 5 p.m. (for unspecified reasons) (?). Hosts chili supper for Texas press at home and attends reception for RFK at WH on his return from round-the-world trip.

March

- 3/1 Presidential Prayer Breakfast at Mayflower. Flies to NYC with Col. and Mrs. John Glenn, other astronauts, and George Reedy. Motorcade begins from airport for ticker tape parade; followed by ceremonies in front of City Hall with Glenn and luncheon at Waldorf Astoria in his honor. At 4 p.m., flies to Austin with MMW and Charlie Boatner; met by Kellams.
- 3/2 No entry. Attended meeting of Third Banking District of Texas at city auditorium for reception and dinner. (speech file)
- 3/3 Addresses meeting of high school counselors at UT. At noon flies to NYC with Moursunds, MMW, Boatner, Glynn and Youngblood.
- 3/4 Flies to Atlantic City, apparently to drop off Moursunds (and Glynn and Youngblood?), before going on to Washington.
- 3/5 P-38. Calls Frank McCulloch. Picks up Busby on way to Bethesda Hospital to see Dr. Davis about his hands. Talks with Robert West, regional director of Small Business in Dallas, and with George McGhee on how to handle invitations to embassy receptions.
- 3/6 WH leadership breakfast. Makes remarks to President's Conference on Occupational Safety at Constitution Hall. Goes to WH for NSC meeting on disarmament, and later to Sec. of Navy dinner for Mrs. John B. Connally at Pentagon.
- 3/7 White House pre-press conference briefing. Meets with Mrs. Rosa Gragg, pres. National Assoc. of Colored Women's Clubs, Inc. Goes to WH at 5:45 (for undisclosed purpose). Attends dinner of Texas State Building and Construction Trades Council at Sheraton. (speech?)
- 3/8 8:30 a.m. flies to Greensboro with Sen. Ervin, Sen. & Mrs. Jordan, Cong. Kornegay, Charlie Boatner, Bill Cheatham., and Mrs. Bess Cheatham. Makes speech and receives degree from Elon College at 10 a.m. Returns to Washington at 1:30 with Same group, goes to P-38. Takes call from McNamara at 4 a.m.
- 3/9 P-38. Brief talk with Cong. Albert Thomas, then long talk with Cong. George Mahon about B-70. Meets with Mahon and Alvin Sahmbeck of Lubbock briefly before going to WH at noon for continuation of meeting on disarmament (from 3/6). Lunch with McNamara in P-38. Meets with Bill Theis and Jack Bell in afternoon.
- 3/10 Flies to Minneapolis for Jefferson-Jackson Day Dinner with CTJ, Reedy.

- 3/11 Returns to Washington with group. Attends Texas State Society brunch honoring Lynda Bird at Statler.
- 3/12 11 a.m., delivers speech to International Telecommunications Study Groups on Space at State Dept. Talks with Busby about helping on speeches. Meets with Speaker. Meets with Goldberg and Reedy at 5:30 re: letter from Mr. Stone of Afro-American [?] on Equal Opportunity Committee.
- 3/13 WH leadership breakfast. During morning he meets with Morris Jaffee, Mayor Gaines of San Antonio, and Cliff Carter; Stanley Marcus, Dale Miller, and John Stemmons to present picture of LBJ Freeway proposed to be built in Dallas; Oscar Chapman; Commissioner Hewitt; Joe Kilgore re: seeing Col. Hewitt. Attends lunch at WH for President of Cameroon. Goes to Bethesda Naval Hospital at 3 p.m. for check-up for insurance. At 5:30 attends WH reception for OAS Ambassadors.
- 3/14 WH pre-press conference breakfast briefing. Talks with Fred Kappell, inviting LBJ to Business Council on May 13 and other matters. Meets with Bob Kleberg at 4:45. Calls Gov. Kerner of RI re: invitation from Committee for 100, decides to decline. Meets with Lloyd Bentsen, Jr.
- 3/15 [Starts day at National airport - why?] Attends signing of Manpower Bill at WH at 10:30. Meets at 11 a.m. with Mrs. Phil Hart and Jerry Cook re: women's role in space. Meets in afternoon with Bob Hinckley; Tom Mann; George Brown and Mr. Geneen of IT&T.
- 3/16 Meets with: Cong. Anfuso re: plans for his future as result of redistricting in NY; Mr. Cleveland, asst. sec. of state for discussion of procedure in Congress re: UN bond issue; Jim Mathis; Commissioner Kaplin of IRS and Frank White re: Austin Internal Revenue Center; Ed Clark and John Gray of Beaumont; group of Negro leaders, Hobart Taylor et al. Rocket Society Goddard Memorial Dinner at Sheraton at 9 p.m.
- 3/17 Attends Gridiron Dinner at Statler and various receptions at Statler (acc. to Secret Service).
- 3/18 No entry.
- 3/19 P-38. During day, talks with Pierre Salinger re: Col. Hewitt of Boundary Commission; and with John Brademas re: speaking in Indiana for his re-election campaign. At 5:30 he goes to Lew Deschler's office for meeting with Speaker.
- 3/20 WH leadership breakfast. In morning, talks with John Hope (EEOC); Roland Boyd; Walker Stone re: story in *Daily News* about B-70 [RS-70?], telling him that McNamara didn't ask LBJ to endorse his position of opposition to plane, LBJ didn't fight it, and it hasn't been argued in WH conferences (see clip); Capt. Shepherd re:

JFK's asking LBJ to be host on USS Forrestal on April 13 and 14. Spends few minutes at EEOC meeting before going to WH lunch for President of Togo. That afternoon talks with Bill Ahmstead of UT. At 8 p.m. makes remarks to Red Cross at Departmental Auditorium.

- 3/21 WH pre-press conference briefing breakfast. At P-38, meets with Marvin Watson and regrets invitation to speak for Project Hope in Dallas. Meets then with Truman Wright of West Va., and then talks with Mansfield re: his visit with Wright. He talks with Ed Welsh at 11:40 re: calling off Space Council meeting this afternoon, but meeting is still held, at 4 p.m. in EOB. Calls Albert Thomas during afternoon re: Secret Service and appropriations. Attends National Press Club annual congressional night dinner and show that evening.
- 3/22 9:45 a.m., gives sendoff to Pres. of Togo at National Airport. Sits in on staff meeting in P-38 at 11 a.m. Holds Texas press conference in P-38 at 3 p.m. Attends dinner for Sen. Russell given by Jim Webb.
- 3/23 P-38. Meets with Drew Pearson at 10:30 a.m. Has lunch with Goldberg and Ted Kheel of Urban League. Meets with Jack Bell and Bill Theis. Calls Conrad Hilton in NYC re: Shamrock Hotel and reservations of Negroes.
- 3/24 P-38. Goes to Bowie, Md. for races at 2 p.m. with CTJ, Russell, Bobby Baker, Jenkinse, Geraldine Williams, Lynda Bird, Bernie Rosenblatt.
- 3/25 Hosts 6 p.m. reception honoring Cong. and Mrs. Graham Purcell, Cong. Gonzalez, Cong. and Mrs. Ray Roberts.
- 3/26 Noon, WH presentation of award from JFK to Robert Frost. Talks with Ed Ray in Houston re: Rotary lunch there on April 19.
- 3/27 WH leadership breakfast. Meets at EOB with group of doctors who favored medical care under social security. 6:30 p.m. reception for U.S. customs collectors.
- 3/28 No entry. (Apparently Johnsons fly to Austin, go to Ranch.)
- 3/29 Barbecue lunch at ranch house, Round Mountain, with CTJ, MMW, and Kellams. Riding over new ranch Moursund and LBJ bought near Llano, then go to Haywood Ranch for rest and dinner before returning to LBJ Ranch.
- 3/30 KTBC board meeting in Austin at 12:30. CTJ flies to Washington, a.m.
- 3/31 Riding around Haywood ranch and boat riding in afternoon; dinner at Haywood with Thomases, Moursunds, and MMW.

April

- 4/1 Spends day with Moursunds and Thomases.
- 4/2 Returns to Washington, apparently. Attended President's Missile Sites Labor Commission meeting at the Pentagon (from note re: speech file).
- 4/3 WH leadership breakfast, followed by presentation of EEOC Report to the President. 11 a.m., calls McNamara re: astronauts and houses (in Houston?). Lynda Bird accompanies him to luncheon at WH for the President of Brazil (Goulart). 4 p.m. press conference. Drives to Baltimore to American Jewish Congress meeting.
- 4/4 Meets with Pres. Aleman, Amb. Carrillo Flores, and aide Mike Guajardo at 10:30 a.m. Attends joint session of Congress. Attends swearing-in of Herb Walters at 4:15.
- 4/5 Bids farewell to President Goulart at MATS. Attends 10 p.m. cabinet meeting. Talks with Magnuson and Ed Clark about going to Seattle.
- 4/6 Delivers remarks to NASA group of technical people at 9:30 a.m., speaks to Labor editors at 10:15. Hosts dinner for Pres. Aleman and his party. Later attends Cherry Blossom ball.
- 4/7 10:30 a.m., meets with JFK on Berlin negotiations (in cabinet room or his office), arriving at P-38 at 2 p.m. 2:25 a.m., President calls to ask if he could be at Glen Ora. Hosts 5 p.m. reception at home for staff of EEOC. Drives to Huntland, Middleburg, W.Va., with CTJ, Thomases, Bob Waldron, Geraldine and MMW for the night.
- 4/8 Middleburg. Spends day at Huntland with above group.
- 4/9 Returns to Capitol with his party. Meets at 10 a.m. with members of Urban League. Attends baseball lunch, goes to WH and then to baseball game with JFK, opening day of Washington Senators. Arrives back at P-38 at 5:40 p.m., apparently for meeting with Dr. Martin Luther King.

- 8/3 P-38. LBJ has morning meeting with Ted Kheel, Steve Shulman, Whitney Young and Reedy. 1 p.m., goes to Blair House for Shriver luncheon to acquaint foreign ambassadors with plans for Middle Manpower Conference to be held in Puerto Rico in October. 2:45 p.m. Space Council meeting.
- 8/4 P-38. Attends briefing on Jamaica by Gordon Knox. CTJ, Reedy, Busby, Liz Carpenter, Lynda Bird, Juanita Roberts and Bob Skiff sit in.
- 8/5 LBJ, accompanied by CTJ, Lynda Bird, MMV, Sen. and Mrs. James Watson (NY) and Cong. Adam Clayton Powell, flies to Jamaica. He pays courtesy call on Mr. Bustemante and they go to Victoria Square, where LBJ makes extemporaneous remarks. That evening LBJ and CTJ go to King's house to sign guest book and meet Princess Margaret and her husband. They then go to Blue Mountain Inn, where they host reception and dinner for Jamaicans. 11 p.m. they go to Stadium for parade and Jamaican flag-raising marking Jamaica's independence.
- 8/6 Jamaica. LBJ receives Minister Lightbourne and he tours Jamaica Coffee Co. with Ministers Lightbourne and Seaga. Attends luncheon with CTJ in honor of Prince Margaret, given by Lord Blackburne, former governor of Jamaica. That afternoon he tours model housing project. He and CTJ attend reception at Vale Royal for Princess Margaret and Lord Snowden, accompanied by Mr. and Miss Doherty. Returning to his hotel he has talk with Busby and Moyers, before dining with Mr. & Mrs. Jan Owens, director, Peace Corps in Jamaica. At 10:20 p.m. they go to Grand Ball in honor of the above.
- 8/7 9:20 a.m., LBJ goes to Gordon House for opening of Parliament, with CTJ, Sen. and Mrs. Watson and Mr. Dougherty. Later he takes helicopter for visit to Innswood and speaks to sugar cane workers. 11:40 a.m., goes to Chestervale Peace Corps camp and makes speech, then visits Cobbla PC Unit, where Lynda Bird speaks. LBJ purchases 3 works of art that afternoon, and then hosts reception for Jamaicans at American Embassy. That evening they attend state banquet.
- 8/8 Johnson party flies to Montego Bay, are met by officials of Parish of St. James, then goes to Charles Square for remarks. They spend afternoon at Thomas House at Tryall Hotel complex, then host dinner with all of above, Col. Jackson, the charge d'affaires of American Embassy, Mr. & Mrs. Irving Cheslaw, and Gordon Knox of State Department.
- 8/9 Johnsons fly from Montego Bay to Austin. LBJ, CTJ, Lynda and MMV leave plane to spend several days in Texas without staff or Secret Service.

- 8/10-8/13 No entries. (Apparently return to D.C. on 8/13.)
- 8/14 WH leadership breakfast meeting. Goes to P-38, meets with John Crull and Al Atkinson of Communications Workers and 5 trainees, and later with Reedy and Hobart Taylor. 11:25 a.m., meeting with Carl Kaysen of State for briefing on Mideast trip.
- 8/15 P-38. Goes to Pier 2, navy yard annex, to visit Coast Guard Barque (?) Eagle as guest of Kennedy. Back at P-38, he took Cecil Long, John Babcock, Sim Gideon, Bill Southwell and Sam Arnin to Texas delegation luncheon as guests.
- 8/16 P-38. Receives briefing on Near East trip by Bill Crockett, Mr. Bohling, Mr. Schott and Mr. Elseth of State Department. Reedy is present.
- 8/17 P-38. Talks with Bobby Kennedy by phone. His briefing on Mideast trip is continued by State Dept. and WH personnel.
- 8/18 P-38. Talks with the Attorney General by phone. Spends late afternoon at The Elms. Guests include Mr. & Mrs. Tom Miller.
- 8/19 The Elms.
- 8/20 P-38. Continued briefing on Mideast trip. Lunch with Secretary Rusk. That afternoon William Crockett and LBJ discuss schedules for Mideast trip.
- 8/21 WH leadership breakfast. P-38, makes calls and opens Senate. Returns to WH for briefing on Mideast trip. He drops by Secy. Dillon's luncheon in honor of Secy. Celebreeze, and the President calls him there. Attends Demo. Policy Comm. luncheon.
- 8/22 LBJ goes to WH for working breakfast with President in preparation for press conference. Opens Senate, attends Texas delegation luncheon, and then returns to WH for discussion with President before Kennedy's farewell ceremony on WH lawn. He helicopters to Andrews and he and his party leave for Mideast and Italy. They have stop in Lajes, Azores, and then fly on to Beirut, Lebanon.
- 8/23 Johnson party arrives Beirut 11:30 a.m., local time, and makes speech at airport, mentioning Eddie Joseph family. He goes to Ambassador Meyer to visit Industry Institute and a super highway project. 6:30 p.m., LBJ calls on President Chehab at Presidential Palace and later calls on Prime Minister Karame.
- 8/24 Beirut. Johnson party tours American University and then leaves Beirut after goodbye ceremony. They then fly to Tehran, Iran, and are met by Iranian officials and US Ambassador Holmes. They go to Marble Palace and then to reception at

Foreign Ministry for reception. That evening they attend state dinner at Shah's residence. Spend night at Marble Palace.

- 8/25 Iran. LBJ meets with Prime Minister and Foreign Minister for discussions, and then goes to Shah's palace for visit and substantive talks. They go to village of Varamin for informal picnic. That evening LBJ makes talk at Iran-American Society reception and then appears on radio interview. Attends Prime Minister's dinner at Foreign Ministry.
- 8/26 Iran. Johnson party goes to Rey to visit tomb of Reza Shah; wreath-laying. After departure ceremony, they fly to Ankara, Turkey, where they're met by Prime Minister, U.S. Amb. Hare, other officials, and very enthusiastic crowds.
- 8/27 Turkey. Wreath-laying at tomb of Ataturk. LBJ makes courtesy call on President Gursel, and then goes to Prime Minister Inonu's office for discussions and LBJ and Foreign Minister signed Peace Corps agreement. Luncheon at presidential palace. That afternoon he goes to Grand National Assembly to meet President of Senate and President of National Assembly. He attends dinner hosted by Prime Minister at Turkish officers' club. Returning to Hotel Balin, he joins Turkish press party at hotel. He has informal birthday party in suite with traveling party.
- 8/28 Turkey. LBJ goes to CENTO headquarters, meets with council of deputies. Participates in ceremony honoring Turks trained under U.S. assistance program. Johnson party travels to Izmir, Turkey, where there is official greeting. They go to U.S. pavilion on fairgrounds for American Day. That evening they fly on to Istanbul, where they are met by Istanbul Governor and Mrs. Aki and crowds.
- 8/29 Istanbul, Turkey. Johnsons, Governor and Mrs. Aki go to Bazaar, where they meet huge crowds. Dinner in suite with American and Turkish personnel connected with trip.
- 8/30 Istanbul, Turkey. Spends most of day resting and in conference with his staff. Johnson party then leaves for Nicosia, Cyprus, where they're met by VP Kutchuk and large crowds. LBJ calls on President Makarios and attends reception.
- 8/31 Nicosia, Cyprus. Makes impromptu talk from balcony of Turkish VP Kutchuk's private residence. Meets large crowds on way to inaugurating 1962 CARE school lunch program, where he is introduced by Min. of Labor Papadopoulos (sp?) and makes informal talk. 11:10 a.m., he goes to Parliament Building to make formal address, and then holds discussions with VP Kutchuk and Cypriot leaders. Attends luncheon hosted by President Makarios. Johnson party afternoon flies on to Athens, Greece, where they are met by Prime Minister and Mrs. Caramanlis, U.S. Amb. and Mrs. Labouisse and other senior Greek and U.S. officials. After private dinner, LBJ works with Crockett and other staff.

September

- 9/1 Athens, Greece. LBJ lays wreath at Tomb of Unknown Soldier and goes to American Embassy and the Prime Minister's office for discussions. 5:30 p.m., LBJ, CTJ and Lynda go to Koropi for community festival and dance in the streets, then return to Athens. They attend dinner at American Ambassador's residence and meet with group of 50 leaders in all fields. After returning to hotel at 9:30 a.m., LBJ works "nearly all night" with Bill Crockett et al.
- 9/2 Athens, Greece. Johnson party flies to Corfu and meet local officials, goes to summer palace and luncheon with King Paul and Queen Frederika. They return to Athens that evening and attend dinner hosted by Prime Minister.
- 9/3 Athens, Greece. Johnson party flies to Thessaloniki, meet officials, and travel to American Farm School for ceremonies. They then visit government housing project for refugees and homeless workers. They attend International Trade Fair that evening, then return to Athens.
- 9/4 Athens, Greece. LBJ visits Central Farmers Market project. 4 a.m., after farewell ceremonies, Johnson party departs for Rome, Italy. Welcomed by P.M. Fanfani and Deputy P.M. and For. Min. Piccioni. En route to hotel they stop at American Embassy and then walk to hotel accompanied by Amb. and Mrs. Reinhardt.
- 9/5 Rome, Italy. LBJ meets P.M. Fanfani for discussions. Discussions at Foreign Ministry with Foreign Min. Piccioni; they sign and exchange notes on San Marcos project. Then meets with President Segni at Quirinale Palace before luncheon.
- 9/6 Rome, Italy. Johnson party flies to Naples, visits shipyard, and goes to NATO headquarters where he makes informal remarks to servicemen, then tours headquarters with Ambassadors Reinhardt and Admiral Russell. They return to Rome late that afternoon.
- 9/7 Rome, Italy. LBJ visits the Pope, and then goes to Italian Space Research Center, and Boys Town. Johnson party then flies back to Washington by way of Shannon, Ireland. They are met by Secretary Rusk and other dignitaries.
- 9/8 P-38. Kennedy calls LBJ to express appreciation for the splendid job done on Mideast trip. 2:30 p.m., LBJ meets with Rusk in EOB (apparently to report on trip). Also present were Komer, Bob Lincoln, Carl Rowan, John Bowling, Reedy and Busby. LBJ then holds press conference to report on trip.
- 9/9 The Elms.
- 9/10 LBJ meets with Kennedy in morning before going to P-38.

- 9/11 LBJ picks up James Webb and Cong. Albert Thomas and they go to Andrews to accompany Kennedy on space activities trip (in separate plane). They stop at Redstone Arsenal, in Huntsville, Alabama, and then go on to Cape Canaveral, Florida, and Houston, Texas.
- 9/12 LBJ accompanies Kennedy to Rice University Stadium and Space Installations in Rich Building.
- 9/13-9/15 No entry.
- 9/16 LBJ gives address at ceremony issuing Sam Rayburn stamp.
- 9/17 LBJ Ranch. LBJ has conference with Rufus Youngblood at the Ranch.
- 9/18 LBJ flies to Miami Beach, Florida, where he addresses Steelworkers' Convention, then flies to Washington, where he meets Kennedy and boards the yacht *Sequoia* for informal party.
- 9/19 P-38. Meets with Moyers and Bill Haddad on Middle Manpower Conference in Puerto Rico. He calls Dick Maguire about confusion on VP's role and commitment to speak before Ohio State Democratic Convention on 9/22. Kenny O'Donnell calls LBJ later regarding the invitation.
- 9/20 WH leadership breakfast meeting. Goes to P-38 for long day of meetings and telephone conversations. Ernest McFarland calls him re: his appointment as director of Space Corporation. He also talks with Chairman John Bailey about the Ohio convention invitation, as well as with Ohio committeeman Bill Coleman.
- 9/21 P-38. LBJ leaves this afternoon for Texas to dedicate Somerville Dam. He is accompanied by CTJ, the Thornberrys, Kivett and Glynn.
- 9/22 LBJ Ranch. Johnson party goes to Somerville for ground-breaking ceremonies at the reservoir site, returning to Austin that afternoon and then on to Ranch.
- 9/23 LBJ Ranch. Johnsons are visited by Maronite Patriarch of Antioch who arrived from San Antonio accompanied by Phil Kazen and approximately 100 people of Lebanese extraction from all over Texas, including Eddie and Raymond Joseph, Chick Kazen, and Jimmy Kazen. They tour the Ranch, departing around noon. That evening Johnson party returns to Washington.
- 9/24 LBJ addresses President's Commission on Status of Women, 10 a.m. Back at P-38, he talks with Gov. Brown of Calif., who asks VP to make campaign appearances in Calif. in behalf of the Party.

- 9/25 WH leadership breakfast. Goes to P-3, then goes to The Elms for meeting with Pres. Ayub Khan of Pakistan, Ambassador and Mrs. Aziz Ahmed and CTJ. That afternoon LBJ meets with Chester Bowles to discuss Cuba.
- 9/26 LBJ goes to WH for “wrap up” meeting with Senate candidates and then goes to airport to bid farewell to Pres. Ayub Khan. Later he goes to WH for signing of Hanford Reactor Bill and signing of Sam Rayburn Gold Medal (bill ?) by President.
- 9/27 LBJ goes to WH for meeting with congressional candidates, introduces the President, then speaks with army compliance officers before going to P-38. Later he returns to WH for President’s signing of Farm Bill.
- 9/28 P-38. Meets with Deputy Prime Minister of Afghanistan. Later he meets with Hobart Taylor and goes with him and Reedy to EEO Comm. staff meeting. 12:30, LBJ goes to WH for President’s signing of Padre Island Bill. 12:50, Space Council Meeting. Later LBJ, CTJ, Sarah McClendon, Bob Baskin, Vernon Louvier, Felton West, Youngblood, Glynn, and Yolanda fly to Austin. Spends night at Haywood (?).
- 9/29 LBJ Ranch, with reporters visiting.
- 9/30 LBJ flies to Midland, makes remarks at Jaycee luncheon and at airport in honor of Air Force Day. Returns to Austin and addresses Texas School Superintendents and Administrators.

October

- 10/1 LBJ goes to Supreme Court to see Justice Arthur Goldberg sworn in, then goes to P-38. Visits with Jerry Holleman, works with staff.
- 10/2 WH leadership breakfast, followed by Kennedy’s signing of UN Bond Bill and Wetlands Bill. He opens Senate at 10 a.m. and remains on the floor. Attends WH luncheon for Latin American Ambassadors, returning to P-38.
- 10/3 P-38.
- 10/4 LBJ flies to San Francisco with Reedy and Marie Fehmer, where he takes a helicopter with Brother Xavier, Roger Kent, Mike Bagan, Lloyd Hand and his staff to St. Mary’s College where he receives honorary degree. They return to San Francisco that evening.
- 10/5 In Los Angeles. He makes film clip with Governor Brown and goes shopping for himself and for Lynda. That afternoon he flies to Albuquerque with staff and Diane Greggains, where he speaks at Democratic dinner. His party returns to the Ranch with Mr. & Mrs. Tony Taylor, Rufe and Kivett.

- 10/6 LBJ Ranch. Sargent Shriver and Bill Moyers are visiting, and more guests arrive for newspaper party and stag lunch. Guests include: Houston Harte, Ed Harte, Albert Jackson, Harry Provence, Waco News Tribune, George Brown, Amon Carter, Jr., Dr. Lamb, Jim Waler, Charlie Gibson, S. B. Whittenberg, Phil North, Bill Stevens, Ed Ray, Dwight Allison, Joe Dealey, Ben Deacherd, Jr., Clyde W. Rembert, Dr. William Crook, Bill Hobby, Sam Kinch, Frank Mayborn, and Charlie Green. Newspaper people leave after lunch.
- 10/7 LBJ Ranch. Johnsons fly to Austin for dinner, dancing and boating; stay at KTBC.
- 10/8 Austin. Johnsons lunch with Thornberrys and Connallys, and LBJ leaves for Washington mid-afternoon. 9:15 p.m., LBJ meets with Mr. McComb (McCone?) of the CIA at The Elms.
- 10/9 LBJ, Reedy, Marie Fehmer, Yolanda Boozer, Glynn, Youngblood and Kivetts fly to New York, where he is met by Cardinal Spellman and rides with him to St. Regis hotel for Tom Deegan luncheon attended by 50 leading executives. LBJ then goes to Waldorf Astoria and meets with Morgenthau, Bill McKeon, and Phil North. That evening he is met in his suite by Cardinal Spellman and the party attends Spellman's reception preceding the Al Smith Banquet Dinner. LBJ speaks after Spellman, Mayor Wagner, and Gov. Rockefeller. At 11:45 p.m., LBJ, Reedy, Yolanda, Bill Moyers, Abe Fortas, 2 Secret Service men and 8 Peace Corps people fly from NYC to San Juan, Puerto Rico.
- 10/10 Puerto Rico, Dorado Beach Hotel. LBJ opens Middle Level Manpower Conference and makes address. He attends reception and dinner for conference delegates, and introduces Secy. Wirtz, who delivers address.
- 10/11 Puerto Rico. LBJ breakfasts with Shriver and Moyers, opens conference session for the day, and talks with Rep. Adam Clayton Powell for half-hour while session is going on. He flies from hotel to San Juan, where he is met by Abe Fortas, Governor Munoz Marin, and an assistant to the Governor. He and his party then return to Austin, are met by CTJ, Liz Carpenter, Jesse Kellam and Woody Woodward. They go to Haywood Ranch.
- 10/12 LBJ Ranch. 12:45, delegation of OAS Ambassadors arrives from San Antonio, accompanied by U.S. State Dept. and OAS staff, and press people. After lunch on lawn and presentation of Honorary Texan Certificates to all visitors, they go on school bus tour of Ranch. Ambassadors and visitors leave ranch at 4:30 p.m. LBJ, CTJ, Liz Carpenter, Reedy, Yolanda, and Kivett take helicopters to San Antonio to Trinity University, where LBJ addresses students before they proceed to banquet for OAS Ambassadors. They return to LBJ Ranch.

- 10/13 LBJ Ranch. LBJ and Moursund go to cattle auction, and then to Haywood Ranch with others. CTJ, Liz Carpenter, Sgt. Glynn, and Secret Servicemen leave at 8:45 to return to Washington. LBJ and Lynda Bird stay at Ranch.
- 10/14 LBJ flies to Houston with Reedy, Yolanda, Youngblood and Kivett. There he is met by Jack and Mary Margaret Valenti, and they go with him and his party to Miami, Florida. There they are greeted by Sen. Claude Pepper, candidate for Congress Dante B. Fascell, and other state and local officials. Johnson party apparently goes to Negro section (of town?) where he is met by reception, band, crowds, etc;; he shakes hands. He then goes to Torch of Friendship statue at Bayfront Park in downtown Miami, where he makes brief address. That evening he speaks at Democratic banquet.
- 10/15 Miami, Florida. Johnson and his party make campaign stops in Charlotte, North Carolina, Salisbury, North Carolina, at Rowan County Courthouse, at Statesville (where CTJ joins him, just arrived from Washington). At Statesville he is greeted by Gov. Sanford and Sen. Ervin. Back at Charlotte they attend rally at Park Center for Cong. Kitchin. That evening he speaks at dinner honoring Sam Ervin, before returning to Washington with his party and William A. Creech, a member of Sen. Ervin's staff.
- 10/16 LBJ meets Crown Prince of Libya at National Airport and attends luncheon for him later. Spends day in P-38, talks with Dr. Webb, Jack Anderson, Rhea Howard, Bill White, and others. He goes to WH at 6:20 (apparently for talk with Kennedy), leaving at 7:50 a.m.
- 10/17 LBJ flies to Kansas City with staff, drives to Independence with Senator Long and meets with President and Mrs. Truman and other guests, before attending Democratic Dinner and giving brief speech at Democratic rally at Music Hall.
- 10/18 Independence, Missouri. LBJ and staff fly to Omaha, Nebraska, where he is given keys to city. They fly then to Casper, Wyoming, go to open air rally at city hall, and then fly on to Riverton, Wyoming for brief stop. Then they fly to Salt Lake City, where LBJ goes with Sen. Moss to Terrace Ballroom and makes speech.
- 10/19 Salt Lake City, Utah. LBJ visits with First Presidency of Church of Latter Day Saints. He and his party then fly to Twin Falls, Idaho for parade and open air rally. They fly on to Yakima, Washington, where they're met by Sen. Magnuson, and LBJ speaks in Harvest Hall. They fly then to Medford, Oregon, and LBJ speaks at dinner for Dem. candidates and at rally at junior high school. They then fly to San Francisco.
- 10/20 Johnson, MMV, Reedy, Marie, Glynn, Kivett and Youngblood fly to Honolulu, Hawaii for parade to Hawaiian village. In late afternoon they fly to Maui, where LBJ speaks

at a luau, and then return to Honolulu where LBJ speaks in Shell Coliseum. Late flight to San Francisco is rerouted to Los Angeles because of fog.

- 10/21 Arriving in Los Angeles at 7:45 a.m., they meet with Lloyd and Ann Hand before departing for Baltimore. Col. Burris meets LBJ in President's helicopter, and briefs him en route to Pentagon Pad and then to White House. There he is briefed by Bundy at 5:30 p.m. on the international situation, and then goes into conference with President until almost midnight.
- 10/22 The Elms. WJ, Busby, Reedy and Carter meet with LBJ for early morning conference. He goes to EOB with Tom Corcoran and lunches in WH mess with WWJ and Corcoran. 3:00 p.m.; goes to WH for NSC meeting, returning briefly to EOB and then back to WH for cabinet meeting and congressional leaders' meeting. 6:40 p.m., he returns to EOB with Sens. Russell and Fulbright. Back at The Elms, he talks with Ed Ray in Houston about Scripps Howard treatment of LBJ news.
- 10/23 10 a.m. WH Security Council executive meeting, with Pres., LBJ, McNamara, Dillon, RFK, General Maxwell Taylor and John McCone. 11 a.m., he visits Dr. Burkley, WH physician, before going to EOB. Holds Texas press conference and meets with Speaker McCormack before 6 p.m. meeting of Executive Committee.
- 10/24 LBJ goes with Col. Burris to White House for NSC Executive Committee meeting. Noon swearing-in of William C. Doherty as ambassador to Jamaica. Goes to P-38. Meets with Walker Stone, head of Scripps-Howard, and Speaker McCormack. He meets with Edward McDermott, chief of emergency planning, on a classified matter on operation of legislative branch. He calls Pierre Salinger to ask if Bill Steven was coming to Washington, possibly to head Office of Censorship. 4:47, he goes to WH and takes Al Smith (?) back to President Kennedy. 5 p.m. WH leadership meeting.
- 10/25 10 a.m. WH NSC Executive Committee meeting. Then LBJ goes to EOB and P-38. He returns to WH at 5 p.m. for continuation of NSC Executive Committee meeting.
- 10/26 EOB. LBJ meets with Reedy, WJ, Ruth Schumm, Charlie Boatner, and Liz Carpenter on Texas situation and popularity polls, etc. 10 a.m., NSC executive meeting. He misses Justice Goldberg's lunch in P-38, and arrives back at EOB at 2:25. He meets with Dr. Thomas W. McNew of National Geographic and George Hamilton at EOE re: becoming vice president and then president of Alfalfa Club. 3:30 press conference with Texas press.
- 10/27 10 a.m. NSC Executive Committee meeting at White House until 12:20. Has conference with Burris. Johnsons have picture made dropping (absentee?) ballots at 17th and F Streets. 4 p.m., attends NSC Exec. Comm. meeting until almost 8 p.m., goes to EOB briefly, and then returns to Exec. Comm. meeting at WH until almost 10 a.m.

- 10/28 11 a.m. NSC Exec. Comm. meeting at WH. Returns to The Elms in early afternoon.
- 10/29 10 a.m. NSC Exec. Comm. meeting at WH. Goes to EOB, meets with Mr. & Mrs. Hobart Taylor Sr. and Hobart Taylor, Jr. Attends 6:15 p.m. Exec. Comm. meeting.
- 10/30 LBJ goes with Col. Burris to Dept. of Interior for swearing-in of Lewis Flagg. Goes to Exec. Comm. meeting at 9:49 a.m. Goes to EOB and joins WJ on call to Rhea Howard. Goes to NSOB and greets Jill Cooper, new staff member, for first time.
- 10/31 10 a.m. NSC Exec. Comm. meeting at WH. Goes to EOB, meets with Claude Wild, Sr. and Jr. 2:50 p.m., goes to WH dispensary to see Dr. Burkley. At 5:55 p.m., returns to WH for Exec. Comm. meeting.

November

- 11/1 10 a.m. NSC Exec. Comm. meeting at WH. Spends afternoon at EOB.
- 11/2 EOB. Attends Space Council meeting, but leaves to go to NSC Exec. Comm. meeting. He talks with Reedy about appointments of Dr. Lena Frances Edwards, Dr. Joaquin Gonzales, and Mrs. Watson.
