MEMORANDUM FOR
THE PRESIDENT

A suggestion: That you invite to a White House luncheon the American medal winners in the Olympics. The Olympics end October 24.

The Russians easily scored the most points in the last two Olympics. This time the Americans are either going to be first or close to it. The present score is: U. S., 23 gold 15 silver, and 14 bronze medals; the Soviet, 11 gold, 9 silver, and 13 bronze medals.

The American winners include some wonderful human stories, particularly the 26-year-old Marine lieutenant who is part Sioux, Billy Mills. He had hardly ever won anything much and got a chance to compete in the 10,000-meter run only because the U. S. ace had sprained an ankle. Mills not only came in first; he is the only American in 56 years to win this main event and he did it in record time.

I suggest that all the U. S. Medal winners be invited to lunch at the White House, with the whole Johnson family serving as hosts and with a few other great athletes now in government also present Stan Musial, Whizzer White, etc.

I think the country would like this.
