THE LADY BIRD SPECIAL WHIST LEST OP

A proposed 10 day whistlestop through and back from the South with 2 days out at the ranch:

Leave October 6 from Washington with farewell at train station from President. Travel through Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, lower Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas.

Arrive in Austin for big welcome at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 10. Proceed to ranch for barbecue with President of Mexico.

Spend Sunday at ranch.

Leave Austin, 8:00 a.m., travel through Okiahema, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, West Virginia and back to Washington, arriving 8:00 a.m. for welcome back ceremony. Perhaps the President could come meet the train.

Advantages:

- Next to the President, Mrs. Johnson is the ticket's best drawing power in the South and could keep Governors and local politices from feeling neglected as national figures politic elsewhere.
- 2) Fourteen states would be covered in 10 days blanketing the local state papers.
 - 3) Concentrate on 4 big stops each day instead of many little ones.

4) Presswise, it would be a dramatic trip -- much easier to "sell" than piecemeal visits here and there. (Dewey Long who mapped out the Truman train said that the farther Truman went -- 16 days -- the more it snowballed.)

There are several ways to "beef up" the trip at intervals:

- 1) Use Representative Hale Boggs as the train emcee from here to Austin; use Representative Carl Albert as the emcee from Austin back.
- 2) Bring in Hubert Humphrey at two stops along the way for an off-the-train rally. Mrs. Johnson would introduce him which is the best introduction we could get in the South.
- 3) The Governors and First Ladies of each state would board the train as you entered the state, be presented throughout their state.
- 4) Gay, uniformed Johnson "girls" could travel along -- as many as possible from Southern Congressional circles.
- 5) Name entertainment -- Carol Channing, The Christy Minstrels, etc. -- could come in for a brief ride and performance.

There would be periodic steps for local rallies where Mrs.

Johnson would introduce Humphrey who would have arrived by plane for such rallies.

Start in Washington with stops all along the way and major meetings (rallies with Humphrey, Young Citizens, etc.) at Charlotte, Columbia, Augusta, Macon, Jacksonville, Tallahassee, Mobile, Biloxi, New Orleans and Houston.

Two days rest at ranch with big Texas welcome in Austin.

Return via Forth Worth, Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Fayetteville, Little Rock, Memphis, Nashville, Louisville, Lexington, Charleston, West Virginia, Huntington, Washington.

THE WHITE HOUSE

Democratic leaders of eight Southern states will serve as honorary chairmen of the "Lady Bird Special" in the eight states the train carrying the First Lady will travel.

Five governors and four U. S. Senators are among the honorary chairmen. The chairmen are Governor and Mrs. Albertis Harrison of Virginia, Governor and Mrs. Terry Sanford of North Carolina, Governor and Mrs. Donald Russell of South Carolina, Governor and Mrs. Farris Bryant of Florida, and Governor and Mrs. Carl Sanders of Georgia.

Senator Allen Ellender and Senator Russell Long are the honorary chairmen of Louisiana. In Alabama, the honorary chairmen will be Senator Lister Hill and Senator John Sparkman. Directing the campaign in Mississippi is Douglas C. Wynn, Greenville attorney, who is heading up the Johnson for President organization in his state.

In addition, Mr. and Mrs. Dan K. Moore, Democratic candidate for Governor in North Carolina, and Mr. and Mrs. Haydon Burns, Democratic gubernatorial candidate in Florida, will greet Mrs. Johnson and ride on portions of the trip.

Masters of ceremonies for the trip will be Secretary of Commerce, Luther Hodges, former governor of North Carolina, and Congressman Hale Boggs, Democratic Whip of the House of Representatives from Louisiana. They will introduce dignitaries from the Democratic Party leadership in each state who will be on the train, and present the First Lady and her daughters, Lynda and Luci, for their remarks.

Co-chairmen of the "Lady Bird Special" are Mrs. Donald Russell and Mrs. Hale Boggs. Mrs. Hodges will also be on the train. Fifteen Ladies for Lyndon will act as hostesses in the hospitality car and will distribute "Lady Bird Special" souvenirs to the crowd at each stop.

The train will cover 1,682 miles between October 6-9, with scheduled stops in 28 cities. These cities have a combined population of two and a half million in eight states with 86 electoral votes. More than 100 press, radio and television representatives will accompany the First Lady.

Visits to two college campuses and several landmarks of Southern cities are scheduled as part of Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson's four-day whistle-stop train trip through the South, it was announced today.

Although most of the stops along the 1682-mile route of "The Lady Bird Special" will consist of greetings by the First Lady and state dignitaries from the gaily-decorated back platform car of the train, several side visits have also been scheduled.

In Norfolk, Va., Mrs. Johnson will leave the train to see the new Civic Center still under construction in downtown Norfolk. She will participate in a flag-raising ceremony with several Mayors from Tidewater towns.

Mrs. Johnson has been invited to visit and address students at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro -- one of the oldest colleges for women in the South -- and attend a student meeting at the Florida State University at Tallahassee during the annual Homecoming Week. In both instances, she is expected to discuss educational challenges in the South.

During her overnight stop in Charleston, South Carolina, Mrs. Johnson will take an early morning carriage ride along the Battery section of Old Charleston.

Later during the day, during a Savannah stop, she will visit the home of Juliette Low, founder of the Girl Scouts.

In Mobile, Alabama, Mrs. Johnson has accepted the invitation of Mayor Joseph N. Langan to dedicate a 100-year old firehouse which is part of a restoration project in historic Mobile. The dedication is part of the American Landmarks Celebration of which Mrs. Johnson is honorary chairman, and also occurs during National Fire Prevention Week. The early Mobile Fire Station will serve as a Fire Museum with much of the equipment and mementos of the early fire-fighting days in the City of Mobile.





"The world's great age begins anew" -- so wrote the poet Virgil two thousand years ago as he foreshadowed an era of Roman greatness.

We are a party of perpetual renewal, a party which has not only seen great visions but brought those visions into growing, breathing realities into the lives of ordinary people. The history of this Nation records that the great ages of America have been the ages of Democratic leadership, or of Republican leadership, like that of Lincoln and Theodore Reosevelt, which carried the ideals of our party into the ranks of the opposition.

Four years ago young America heard the voice of a young leader, a leader of unique quality who sounded the trumpet call for another great age of national renewal. He asked us to get America moving again. We joined him and proved from strength to strength, from the idea to the reality, from the vision to the accomplishment.

America has moved into a position of undoubted military power -and into a maturity which guarantees the exercise of that power for peace rather
than atomic war. The American economy has moved from dead center into an era of
renewed vigor. There are now more people at work earning more money and living
better lives than ever before in the nation's history.

To strength and prosperity we have joined compassion. Ours is the vision and ours the growing reality of a great society in which the accidents of race and color, parentage and poverty, location and geography, will not be allowed to dim the light of human hope and to cripple the possibilities of human growth.

Just as our party and our country have grown strong through the youthful ideal of self-renewal, so the fates decreed that even John Kennedy's death would be the occasion and inspiration for a national renewal and rededication.

Mr. Valiant-for Truth in <u>Pilgrims Progress</u> said, "My sword I leave to him who can wield it." The might arm of Lyndon Johnson has carried the flashing blade of John Kennedy, signally to an anxious world that the forces of freedom, of compassion, of decency and progress cannot be conquered even by death itself.

For use here -- and I believe for all Americans -- the choice is clear. We choose the survival of humanity, and the seasoned, steady feadership of Lyndon B. Johnson.

Lyndon Johnson -- as a young man -- has known poverty at first hand, has know economic collapse at first hand, and he has known war at first hand.

These are the enemies of youth, indeed the enemies of all mankind, and in the battle against these enemies the young people of this nation will enlist for the duration with Lyndon B. Johnson as their commander-in-chief.
