The enclosed releases were sent to a broad mailing list - including Washington Bureaus, Women's Editors nationally, and to weeklies, dailies, and radio and TV stations in the 8 Southern states.

Dispatch #200 was sent to 1,056 weeklies in the eight states with a single and double column mat of the official picture of Mrs. Johnson. Publicity Coordinators in the 8 states were sent an instruction memo with a press kit and other materials - memo enclosed.

The White House Women's Coordinators took 400 press kits with them and the advance men took 100. Plan to place 250 press kits on the train for your use.

We are getting special release paper for stories on the "Lady Bird Special," using art from the match book covers and the same colors. Reporters from the News & Information Divisionhave contacted sources along the route who will be calling in color stories in edvance and reactions after the train passes through. They will phone reactions to me each night so that I can make available to press on the train. Also, their stories will be sent to the above sources.

SOUTHERN DEMOCRATIC LEADERS TO BE HONORARY CHAIRMEN FOR FIRST LADY

WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 26 (Special) - - Democratic leaders of eight Southern states will be honorary chairmen of the "Lady Bird Special" when Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson makes her eight-state, 28-city train trip through the South on October 6 to 9, the White House announced today.

Following is the text of the announcement released by Mrs. Elizabeth Carpenter, Mrs. Johnson's press secretary.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF MRS. JOHNSON'S TRIP

Democratic leaders of eight Southern states will serve as honorary chairman of the "Lady Bird Special" in the eight states the train carrying the First Lady will travel.

Five governors and four U. S. Senators are among the honary chairmen. The chairmen are Governor and Mrs. Albertis Harrison of Virginia, Governor and Mrs. Terry Sanford of North Carolina, Governor and Mrs. Donald Russell of South Carolina, Governor and Mrs. Farris Bryant of Florida, and Governor and Mrs. Carl Sanders of Georgia.

Senator Allen Ellender and Senator Russell Long are the honorary chairmen of Louisiana. In Alabama, the honorary chairmen will be Senator Lister Hill and Senator John Sparkman. Directing the campaign in Mississippi is Douglas C. Wynn, Greenville attorney, who is heading up the Johnson for President organization in his state.

In addition, Mr. and Mrs. Dan K. Moore, Democratic candidate for Governor in North Caroline, and Mrs. Haydon Burns, Democratic gubernatorial candidate in Florida, will greet Mrs. Johnson and ride on portions of the trip.

Masters of ceremonies for the trip will be Secretary of Commerce, Luther Hodges, former governor of North Carolina, and Congressman Hale Boggs, Democratic Whip of the House of Representatives from Louisiana. They will introduce dignitaries from the Democratic Party leadership in each state who will be on the train, and present the First Lady and her daughters, Lynda and Luci, for their remarks.

Co-chairmen of the "Lady Bird Special" are Mrs. Donald Russell and Mrs. Hale Boggs. Mrs. Hodges will also be on the train. Fifteen Ladies for Lyndon will act as hostesses in the hospitality car and will distribute "Lady Bird Special" souvenirs to the trowd at each stop.

The train will cover 1,682 miles between October 6-9, with scheduled stops in 28 cities. These cities have a combined population of two and a half million in eight states with 86 electoral votes. More than 100 press, radio and television representatives will accompany the First Lady.

SEVERAL SIDE TRIPS TO HIGHLIGHT MRS. JOHNSON'S SOUTHERN TRIP

WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 29 (Special) --- The White House announced today that Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson will make several side-trips along the route of the "Lady Bird Special" campaign train to visit college campuses and landmarks of Southern cities.

Stops along the 1,682-mile route currently include Alexandria, Fredericksburg, Richmond, Petersburg, and Suffolk, Va. on Tuesday, Oct. 6, in the forenoon; and Norfolk, Va., Ahoskie, Rocky Mount, Wilson, Selma, and Raleigh, North Carolina, in the afternoon and evening.

Wednesday, October 7, the red-white-and-blue train, with a gaily decorated rear platform from which Mrs. Johnson will speak, will leave Raleigh at 6:20 a.m. and stop in Durham, Greensboro, Salisbury, and Charlotte, North Carolina, in the morning; and stops in South Carolina that afternoon and evening at Rock Hill, Chester, Columbia, and Charleston.

Mrs. Johnson will make a side visit to the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, one of the oldest colleges for women in the South, where she has been invited to address the students.

Following an overnight stop in Charleston, S.C., she will take an early morning carriage ride along the Battery section of Old Charleston.

Leaving Charleston at 10 a.m., on Thursday, October 9, the "Lady Bird Special" arrives in Savannah, Ga., sometime in the forencen, where Mrs. Johnson will visit the home of Juliette Low, founder of the Girls Scouts of America. Mrs. Johnson is national honorary President of the Girl Scouts.

Thursday afternoon the "Lady Bird Special" stops in Waycross, Valdosta, and Thomasville, Georgia; Drifton, Fla., and overnight in Tallahassee, Florida. Luci and Lynda Johnson are expected to join their mother in Florida to attend a student rally at Florida State University. It will be Homecoming Week at Florida State.

The whistle blows for departure from Tallahassee at 5:40 a.m. Friday with stops in Crestview, Milton, and Pensacole, Florida, that morning; Mobile, Ala. and Biloxi, Miss., that afternoon, and terminating at New Orleans, La., at 7:45 p.m.

In Mobile, Mrs. Johnson has accepted the invitation of Mayor Joseph N. Langan to dedicate a 100-year old firehouse, part of a restoration project in Mobile. The dedication is part of the American Landmarks Celebration this year, of which the First Lady is honorary chairman. The Mobile Fire Station will contain equipment and momentos of early fire-fighting days.

An elaborate celebration is being planned in New Orleans Friday evening, the final stop of the "Lady Bird Special."

Mrs. Johnson has requested that there be enough flexibility in her whistle stop campaign trip through the South, the first ever undertaken by a President's wife, to allow for unplanned stops along the route.

Hostile placards

Goldwater placards at whistle stops are becoming more numerous and as direct as inborn Southern good manners will allow. During an almost silent tour of the solidly Republican ancient port of Charleston early this morning Mrs. Johnson observed without comment a huge notice in the window of a colonial-style house "this house sold on Goldwater."

I have heard open criticism in the crowds at whistle stops of Mrs. Johnson's lone foray into the bitter atmosphere of this part of the South. Even Democrats feel that the President should not have allowed his wife to be exposed to such hostility.
