The Atomic Energy Commission advises that a Q clearance was granted by that agency for Walter Wilson Jenkins, effective 20 February 1958, based on an FBI background investigation of 1958, issued for duty as a member of the staff of the Senate Preparedness Investigating Subcommittee.

SUBJECT: An Atomic Energy Commission "Q" Clearance

Reference: DOD Directive 5210.2

Under the Atomic Energy Law of 1954, as amended, persons permitted access to atomic weapons and nuclear materials information must be specifically approved for such access. To qualify for such access, the Atomic Energy Commission issues a clearance for all persons except for DOD personnel and DOD contractor personnel who are permitted access on the basis of a DOD clearance. By definition a "Q" clearance is equivalent to a Top Secret Department of Defense clearance.

SUBJECT

Access to and Dissemination of Restricted Data

References:

- (a) DoD Directive 5200.1, "Safeguarding Official Information in the Interests of the Defense of the U.S."
- (b) DoD Directive 5210.8, "Policy on Investigation and Clearance of DoD Personnel for Access to Classified Defense Information"
- (c) DoD "Armed Forces Industrial Security Regulation" (established by DoD Directive 5220.22)
- (d) DoD Directive 5210.2, "Access to and Dissemination of Restricted Data," May 6, 1957 (cancelled herein)

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this directive is to establish policies and procedures governing access to and dissemination of Restricted Data by Department of Defense personnel.

II. BACKGROUND

A. Section 143, Atomic Energy Act of 1954 as amended, (42 U.S.C. 2163) provides that:

"Section 143. Department of Defense Participation.--The Commission may authorize any of its employees, or employees of any contractor, prospective contractor, licensee or prospective licensee of the Commission or any other person authorized access to Restricted Data by the Commission under subsection 145b to permit any employee of an agency of the Department of Defense or of its contractors, or any member of the Armed Forces to have access to Restricted Data required in the performance of his duties and so

certified by the head of the appropriate agency of the Department of Defense or his designee: Provided, however, That the head of the appropriate agency of the Department of Defense or his designee has determined, in accordance with the established personnel security procedures and standards of such agency, that permitting the member or employee to have access to such Restricted Data will not endanger the common defense and security: And provided further, That the Secretary of Defense finds that the established personnel and other security procedures and standards of such agency are adequate and in reasonable conformity to the standards established by the Commission under Section 145."

B. In implementation of section 143 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Secretary of Defense has notified the Atomic Energy Commission that the established personnel and other security procedures of the Department of Defense and its agencies are adequate and in reasonable conformity with the standards established by the Commission.

III. BASIC AGREEMENTS.

A. The Atomic Energy Commission has authorized its employees, employees of its contractors, employees of certain other Federal Agencies who have been cleared by the Atomic Energy Commission and holders of Access Permits and their employees to permit any employee of an agency of the Department of Defense or its contractors, or any member of the Armed Forces to have access to Restricted Data required in the performance of his duties and so certified by the head of the appropriate agency of the Department of Defense or his designee.

Under AEC regulations holders of Access Permits and their employees are authorized access only to categories of Secret Restricted Data specified in the particular access permit and to all Confidential Restricted Data available under the access permit program.

- B. The Department of Defense and the Atomic Energy Commission have mutually agreed that:
 - The Department of Defense will assume responsibility for the safeguarding of Restricted Data and further dissemination of it to employees of the Department and its contractor organizations after it has been initially furnished to them.
 - 2. The Department of Defense will assume responsibility for insuring that Restricted Data made available pursuant to regulations implementing the provisions of Section 143, Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, will not be disseminated outside of the Department and its contractor organizations as

set forth in reference (c) except to persons cleared by the Atomic Energy Commission or as otherwise provided by the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, or other statutes.

- 3. The Department of Defense will assume responsibility for insuring that those persons who sign certifications as set forth in paragraph VI. B. below are in fact authorized to sign them.
- 4. Military commanding officers of those atomic weapons storage facilities which have Atomic Energy Commission custodians are authorized to certify personnel under their command only for access to Restricted Data from the Atomic Energy Commission representatives at that facility under Section 143 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and the Atomic Energy Commission facility custodians are authorized to approve such certified requests for access.
- C. The Department of Defense has further agreed that Atomic Energy Commission clearances will be accepted as the equivalent of Department of Defense clearances for personnel of Federal agencies other than the Department of Defense who have a need to know in performance of their official duties for access to classified information (including Restricted Data), as follows:

AEC Clearances

DOD Clearances

"L" "Q" Confidential Secret or lower

"Q" (with specific AEC Top Secret or lower authority for TS access)

This acceptance of Atomic Energy Commission clearances is not intended to change present clearance requirements for Department of Defense personnel (defined in IV. D. below), who must possess appropriate Department of Defense clearances for access to classified information (including Restricted Data) in accordance with reference (b).

- D. The Atomic Energy Commission will no longer issue "Q" clearances to Department of Defense personnel, except for DOD personnel assigned to the AEC or to other Government agencies for which the Department of Defense is unable to provide necessary need-to-know certifications upon request of the agency concerned.
- E. Under section 304(b) of the National Aeronautics and Space Act of 1958 (Public Law 85-568), the Administrator, National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), has made a determination that the personnel and other security procedures of the NASA are adequate

and in reasonable conformity to the standards established by the AEC. The DOD and NASA, accordingly, have agreed that exchanges of Restricted Data relating to aeronautical and space activities between personnel of the two agencies and their contractors will be handled in the same manner and under the same rules as classified defense information. See paragraph V. C. below. The NASA has agreed that such information received from the DOD will be safeguarded in the manner prescribed by NASA regulations for classified defense information and that it will not be disseminated to unauthorized persons or outside the jurisdiction of the NASA except in accordance with law or regulations issued by the AEC. The AEC has agreed to permit AEC personnel to release Restricted Data relating to aeronautical and space activities to NASA personnel, on the same basis as release of Restricted Data to Department of Defense personnel as stated in paragraph A above.

IV. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this directive the following definitions apply:

- A. Classified Defense Information: Official information the safeguarding of which is necessary in the interests of national defense and which is classified for such purpose by appropriate classifying authority pursuant to Executive Order 10501.
- B. Restricted Data: All data concerning (1) design, manufacture or utilization of atomic weapons; (2) the production of special nuclear material; or (3) the use of special nuclear material in production of energy, but shall not include data declassified or removed from the Restricted Data category.
- C. Formerly Restricted Data: Data removed from the Restricted Data category upon determination jointly by the Atomic Energy Commission and the Department of Defense that such data relates primarily to the military utilization of atomic weapons and that such data can be adequately safeguarded as classified defense information. Such information is, however, treated the same as Restricted Data for purposes of foreign dissemination. See paragraph V. D. below.
- Department of Defense Personnel: Military personnel in the Armed Forces, including members of the Reserve Forces and Federally recognized members of the National Guard; employees of an agency of the Department of Defense, including consultants, full time and temporary or part-time employees as well as personnel paid from non-appropriated funds; and contractors, prospective contractors and contractor employees of an agency of the Department of Defense (see Paragraph 1-208, Reference (c)).
- E. Atomic Energy Commission Personnel: The Atomic Energy Commission and its employees; Atomic Energy Commission contractors and their employees; and Department of Defense personnel assigned to the Atomic Energy Commission for duty.

- F. NASA Personnel: Any officer, employee, member of an advisory committee, contractor, subcontractor, or officer or employee of a contractor or subcontractor, of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and Department of Defense personnel assigned to NASA for duty.
- G. Department of Defense Security Clearance: A clearance granted pursuant to the provisions of references (b) and (c).
- H. Atomic Energy Commission Security Clearance: A clearance granted by the Atomic Energy Commission under provisions of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.
- I. NASA Security Clearance: A clearance granted by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration pursuant to regulations issued by the NASA.
- J. Commanders of Atomic Weapons Storage Facilities: Military Commanding Officers responsible for the operation of atomic weapons storage facilities which have Atomic Energy Commission custodians, including the commander of an installation when the operation of a storage facility is his responsibility.
- K. Certifying Official: A person authorized by the Secretary of Defense, the Secretaries of the Army, Navy and Air Force, the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Chairman, Military Liaison Committee (AEC-DOD), the Chairman, Civilian-Military Liaison Committee (NASA-DOD), the Director, National Security Agency, the Director, Defense Communications Agency, the Director, Defense Intelligence Agency, and the Chief, Defense Atomic Support Agency, as heads of the appropriate agencies of the DOD, to certify the need of personnel under their jurisdiction to have access to Restricted Data in the possession of AEC personnel and AEC-cleared personnel of other Federal agencies designated by the AEC.

V. DISSEMINATION OF RESTRICTED DATA BY DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE:

- A. Knowledge or possession of Restricted Data shall be permitted only to Department of Defense personnel whose official duties require such access in the interest of promoting national defense and who possess a DOD security clearance commensurate to the classification of the information to which they have access. In all other respects, dissemination of Restricted Data to Department of Defense personnel will be governed by the same procedures and criteria as govern the dissemination of other classified defense information.
- B. Department of Defense personnel may disseminate Restricted Data to Atomic Energy Commission personnel and Atomic Energy Commission cleared personnel of other Federal agencies designated by the Atomic

Energy Commission only after they have positively:

- 1. Identified the individual:
- 2. Ascertained that the Atomic Energy Commission clearance of the individual as indicated in paragraph III.C. is at least equal to the classification of the information to be disseminated.
- 3. Ascertained that the individual's official duties with his agency require that he have access to such information in the interest of promoting national defense.
- C. Department of Defense personnel may disseminate Restricted Data to NASA personnel under the following conditions:
 - 1. Restricted Data relating to aeronautical and space activities may be released to NASA personnel after:
 - (a) The recipient has been identified;
 - (b) It has been ascertained that the recipient has been granted an appropriate NASA clearance, or in the case of NASA contractors and their employees, an appropriate NASA or DOD clearance; and
 - (c) Receipt of appropriate assurance, either orally or in writing, that the recipient requires such access in the performance of his official duty.
 - 2. If the Restricted Data does not relate to aeronautical and space activities, it may be released to NASA personnel only in accordance with paragraph B above.
- D. Dissemination of Restricted Data and Formerly Restricted Data to any nation or regional defense organization or a representative thereof is prohibited except in accordance with agreements for cooperation entered into pursuant to Section 123 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.
- E. Except as provided in paragraph V. D. above, Formerly Restricted Data will be treated and disseminated in the manner prescribed for classified defense information.
- VI. ACCESS TO RESTRICTED DATA IN CUSTODY OF THE FEDERAL AGENCIES OTHER THAN THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE AND THE NATIONAL AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION.
 - A. Department of Defense personnel are authorized to have access to Restricted Data in possession of Atomic Energy Commission personnel

and Atomic Energy Commission cleared personnel of other Federal agencies designated by the Atomic Energy Commission if such Department of Defense personnel have:

- Been granted a Department of Defense clearance equivalent to the security classification of Restricted Data to be received, and
- 2. Been certified in accordance with subparagraph B. below.
- B. Requests for access to Restricted Data in possession of Atomic Energy Commission personnel and Atomic Energy Commission cleared personnel of other Federal agencies designated by the Atomic Energy Commission, other than the Department of Defense and NASA, will be processed as follows:
 - 1. The Secretary of Defense, the Secretaries of the Army, Navy, and Air Force, the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Chairman, Military Liaison Committee (AEC-DOD), the Chairman, Civilian-Military Liaison Committee (NASA-DOD), the Director, National Security Agency, the Director, Defense Communications Agency, the Director, Defense Intelligence Agency, and the Chief, Defense Atomic Support Agency and their designees are authorized to certify the need of DOD personnel under their jurisdiction to have access to Restricted Data in the possession of AEC personnel and AEC-cleared personnel of other Federal agencies designated by the Atomic Energy Commission. These officials will forward their lists of designees to the Chairman, Military Liaison Committee, for transmittal to the Atomic Energy Commission. In addition, a Commander of an atomic weapons storage facility (defined in paragraph IV. J.) is authorized to certify personnel under his command for access to Restricted Data from the Atomic Energy Commission representatives at his facility. AEC will accept only those certifications which are signed by persons who have been properly designated under this Directive.
 - 2. All requests for access must be signed by or in the name of the appropriate certifying official.
 - 3. Requests for access to Restricted Data may be made directly to the Atomic Energy Commission headquarters in Washington, D. C., by those persons listed in paragraph B. 1., above, except commanders of atomic weapons storage facilities, and such additional officials as may be designated by the Secretary of Defense and the Secretaries of the Army, Navy and the Air Force.
 - 4. Requests for access to Restricted Data in the possession of Federal Agencies other than the Department of Defense and NASA will be signed by one of the persons listed in or designated according to subparagraph B. 1. above.

- 5. Each request for access to Restricted Data in custody of personnel of Federal Agencies other than Department of Defense and NASA will be forwarded to the appropriate agency concerned from which the access is desired and will include the information as listed in 5(a) through (f) below. AEC Form 277 may be used.
 - (a) Name of person(s), organization represented, and, if other than Department of Defense agency or military department, the organization's relationship to the Department of Defense.
- (b) Information in such detail as to enable the other Agency to recognize the subject area involved and to determine the degree of access.
- (c) The Department of Defense clearance status of each person (Top Secret, Secret or Confidential).
 - (d) Certification that the person needs the access in the performance of duty.
 - (e) Statement of determination that permitting the persons access will not endanger the common defense and security.

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- (f) If applicable, anticipated date of visit to Atomic Energy Commission or other Government facility, and names of persons to be visited, as appropriate.
- 6. Requests to the Atomic Energy Commission for access to Restricted Data pertaining to the Army Package Reactor Program, Navy Reactor Program, and Aircraft Reactors and Nuclear Propulsion Programs will be submitted by the requester to the Manager of the appropriate Atomic Energy Commission Operations Office or as indicated to the requesting authority by such office or by the Washington Division of the Atomic Energy Commission responsible for the program to which access is required.
- 7. Requests to the Atomic Energy Commission for access to Restricted Data pertaining to weapons programs will be submitted by requesters direct to the Managers of the Albuquerque or the San Francisco Atomic Energy Commission Operations Offices, or to those officials designated by these Managers, as appropriate, only if:
 - (a) The requesting activity is performing work with or for the Atomic Energy Commission agencies under the jurisdiction of Albuquerque or San Francisco Operations Offices pursuant to a formal written agreement; or

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- (b) The requesting activity has been specifically authorized to make requests direct to Atomic Energy Commission Managers of Operations for specific areas of mutual interest within the weapons programs.
- 8. The Commander of an atomic weapons storage facility will submit requests for access to Restricted Data in possession of Atomic Energy Commission personnel at his facility to the Atomic Energy Commission Custodian at that facility.
- 9. Requests for access to Restricted Data in the custody of the Atomic Energy Commission personnel for which direct access arrangement is not specifically authorized will be forwarded to the Washington Division of the Atomic Energy Commission having responsibility for the subject matter involved.
- 10. Authorization for requesting activity to submit requests direct to Atomic Energy Commission Managers of Operations may be established by submitting a request to the Washington Division of the Atomic Energy Commission responsible for the program to which access is required.
- 11. The Atomic Energy Commission has authorized AEC personnel to accept verbal requests in emergencies, giving all of the information required in subparagraph 5 above, to be followed by an appropriate written request. Determinations of emergency conditions will be made by personnel authorized to approve requests for release of Restricted Data.
- 12. If an individual requires repeated access to the same type of information under the cognizance of the same approving authority, the request shall so specify and local arrangements for continuing access may be made for a specified period not to exceed one year, except that arrangements for continuing access by members of the Armed Forces may be made for the specified period of the assignment for which access was originally approved.

VII. ACCESS TO RESTRICTED DATA IN CUSTODY OF THE NATIONAL AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION.

- A. Department of Defense personnel are authorized to have access to Restricted Data in the custody of NASA personnel if such Department of Defense personnel:
 - 1. Have been granted a Department of Defense clearance equivalent to the security classification of the Restricted Data; and
 - 2. Have a need for the access in the performance of their official duties.

- B. Requests for access to Restricted Data in the custody of NASA personnel will be submitted orally or in writing to the NASA custodian of that Restricted Data with appropriate assurances that:
- 1. The requester has an appropriate Department of Defense clearance.
 - 2. The requester requires the access in the performance of his official duties.

VIII.REQUIRED ACTION.

Each military department shall forward to the Assistant Secretary of Defense (MP&R) for information two copies of the regulations, procedures or instructions or other form of transmittal to implement this directive. However, if existing departmental regulations are consistent with this directive and two copies of such effective regulations have been previously furnished it will not be necessary to forward additional copies. Two copies of any subsequent clarifications, additions, deletions, or modifications to such regulations implementing this directive shall be submitted to the Assistant Secretary of Defense (MP&R).

IX. CANCELLATION.

Reference (d) is canceled.

X. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Directive is effective immediately.

Acting Secretary of Defense

Walter Jenkins received an interim and final TOP SECRET clearance from OSD Security on December 23, 1957. This was based on a favorable National Agency Check during the same month and a favorable Air Force OSI personnel security investigation dated 11 January 1956. Jenkins was cleared as a member of the staff of Johnson's Missiles and Space Committee. The clearance was requested by Johnson (letter attached). On February 13, 1961, OSD Security received a letter from Gordon A. Nease, Acting Staff Director, Preparedness Investigating Subcommittee, with the statement that "Our records reflect that the following are carried on the Subcommittee security list and should be corrected to read as follows". Among the names listed was "Walter Jenkins, Vice President's Office."

- 1. Top Secret clearance was granted Jenkins on 5 April 1956. This was based on a background investigation which was started on 3 November 1955 and completed on 19 January 1956.
- 2. Jenkins did not have an interim clearance.
- 3. Request for a background investigation, on which to base a security clearance, was initiated by Captain Von-Platen, Chief, Security Branch, Office of the Secretary of the Air Staff.
- 4. The request for background investigation, on which to base a security clearance, was initiated on 1 November 1955.
- 5. The requirement for a clearance was justified on the basis of a scheduled two week tour of active duty as a Mobilization Assignee in the Legislative Liaison Division, Office of the Secretary of the Air Force.
- 6. The top secret clearance applies to all armed services and other agencies of the Department of Defense on a mutual and reciprocal basis. Authority is DOD Directive 5210.8, dated 15 February 1962.

Dear Mr. Moyers:

Reference is made to my letter dated October 22, 1964, pertaining to an investigation conducted concerning Mr. Walter Wilson Jenkins.

Andy Choka, the individual who was arrested with Mr. Jenkins October 7, 1964, was reinterviewed by Special Agents of this Bureau on October 28, 1964, in Washington, D. C. Choka reiterated his previous statements that he had not been a part of any plan to "frame" Mr. Jenkins or to embarrass anyone. He emphasized repeatedly that his meeting with Mr. Jenkins was "accidental" and that he had never heard of Mr. Jenkins before their arrest.

Choka also stated he never heard of Dean Burch or John Grenier, Chairman and Executive Director, respectively, of the Republican National Committee. He denied speaking to or knowing anyone employed by the Republican National Committee, Washington, D. C.

A copy of a sworn signed statement furnished by Choka in connection with the above is enclosed.

"I, ANDY CHOKA furnish the following voluntary sworn statement to JAMES E. GREEN, Jr., and JAMES C. SMITH who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me. I am willing to testify before a Security Hearing Board.

"I wish to state that the information I furnished previously to FBI Agents GREEN and JOHN R. ALE on October 20, 1964, is true and correct.

"I wish to emphasize that I was never approached by any one at any time to make any approach to the person I was arrested with on October 7, 1964, later identified as WALTER W. JENKINS. I categorically deny that I spoke to or knew anyone employed by the Republican National Committee at 1625 I St., N. W., Washington, D. C. I have never heard of Mr. R. DEAN BURCH or JOHN GRENIER, Director and Executive Director respectively of the Republican National Committee. If any members of the Republican National Committee Head-quarters ever came into the Army-Navy City Club where I was employed they would have come in by another entrance and I would not have seen them.

"I wish to again state that no one ever showed me a photograph of WALTER JENKINS No one ever mentioned his name to me at any time prior to the time I was arrested with him on October 7, 1964, at the YMCA.

"I wish to state that my meeting with WALTER JENKINS was not prearranged in any manner. After having my dinner and several beers I went to my car parked on H St., N. W., facing west between 12th and 13th Streets, N. W. Upon arriving at my car I felt the urge for a bowel movement and I thought of the YMCA. I had been to the men's room a half dozen times in the past year, always in the afternoon before going to work. I never had any homosexual experiences in the men's room at the YMCA prior to the time I was arrested there on October 7, 1964. After parking my car on F Street N. W., facing east between 17th and 18th Streets N. W., I walked north on 18th Street N. W. to G Street N. W., then to the YMCA on G Street N. W. I did not see anyone enroute and did not talk to anyone during this time.

"The individual later arrested with me and identified as WALTER JENKINS made the approach to me and touched me first in the men's room of the YMCA on the night of October 7, 1964. No words were ever spoken.

"I wish to again state that this incident was a perchance meeting and was not prearranged. It was in no way a 'frame-up' or any kind of arrangement to embarrass anyone.

"I have read the foregoing statement of 2 pages and declare it to be entirely true.

In accordance with the request of Mr. Abe Fortas, Miss Larrie O'Farrel of New York City was interviewed on October 28, 1964, by representatives of this Bureau at which time she furnished a signed statement concerning information furnished her by Mr. John Witt indicating that Mr. Walter W. Jenkins had been the victim of a "frame-up." Enclosed herewith is a copy of her signed statement.

Miss O'Farrel further advised that on October 27, 1964, she furnished the same information, in the form of a deposition, to one Sydney Baron, whom she believes to be connected with the Democratic Party. She took such action at the request of her superior, Mr. Woodrow Wirsig, Editor, "Printers' Ink," a magazine for advertising and marketing men, published in New York City. She advised that Mr. Wirsig had called Drew Pearson about the matter and shortly thereafter Mr. Baron appeared at her office. She stated she gave Mr. Baron several copies of the deposition which she assumed he furnished to Drew Pearson.

No further investigation is being conducted in this matter in the absence of a specific request.

"I, Larrie O'Farrel, make the following voluntary statement to John E. Warren and William A. Harwood, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I desire that my identity be concealed in this matter.

I, Larrie O'Farrel, was born in Cessnock, Australia, and I reside at Thirty Four Monroe Place, Apartment One D, Brooklyn, Heights, New York.

Several months ago I was contacted by John Witt of The Thomas Deegan Company, by telephone and asked if I would consider doing a story on trade exhibitions. He made an appointment to discuss the matter in my office the following week. We talked and I said that I would think about the story but that I did not feel it was something that I was interested in.

He called several times after that and invited me to lunch even though he understood it would not guarantee him a story in this magazine. He became quite friendly and in September asked me out to dinner. I accepted. He picked me up on the evening of Tuesday, September Twenty Two after work (Five Fifteen P. M.) and we drove to the West Side and picked up another dinner guest whose name I have forgotten. Then we drove to his home in Riverdale.

Present at the dinner were John Witt's father, Erwin Witt, Mrs. Lou Guylay, the other lady and myself. It was a strained evening. I learned that John has been seeing Mrs. Guylay's daughter for some time and gathered the impression that there is an understanding between John and the daughter of the Guylays.

Much of the conversation revolved around politics, specifically about the Republican Party, and I learned that Lou Guylay had left (or been granted a leave of absence from) The Thomas Deegan Company to go to Washington to work with The Republican Committee. There was some talk about the fact that Mrs. Guylay, who also worked for the Deegan Company had been receiving calls every hour on the hour from her husband in Washington.

After dinner, everyone (excluding the elderly lady and myself) rushed to the television set to watch Mr. Goldwater whose speech was telecast that evening. They were disappointed that something that might have been disclosed was not.

Last week, John Witt called me at my office (Thursday, October Twenty Two) and asked if I was planning to still vote for Mr. Johnson. I said that I was, and he asked if this was the case in view of the Jenkins disclosure. I said yes. asked what I thought of the Jenkins case. I told him that I thought it was the most terrible thing that I had ever heard of and I felt terribly sorry for he and his family. I also said that I wondered how the young daughter was taking it and that Jenkins and his family must be going through a terrible ex-I also told John that in my opinion Jenkins had been the victim of a frameup, that I did not believe that a man in his position would be forced to go to a YMCA to meet people. John started laughing and said, "Do you know who set it up" and I said that I didn't. He said .. "My boss, Lou Guylay. Why do you think he went down to Washington."

He called me again last night, October Twenty Seven, at home at about midnight. He reported that he had been contacted by Drew Pearson and queried about his conversation with me on the Jenkins case. John is convinced that my telephone here at the office is "bugged." He said that he told Pearson he had only been kidding around and that it was an inside joke. He kept telling me that it was not true and he had been joking. He also reported that he had been "edited," that Pearson had said that Witt had told me "Guylay had set it up." Witt told me that he had actually said "Guylay had dug it up."

He called me today at the office (October Twenty Eight, Sixty Four) and asked if anyone had contacted me. I said no. He said that he was sure it was going to be alright and if questioned to say nothing. I read the above statement consisting of two pages and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge."

However, I feel that several points made in the report released on October 22, 1964 need clarification:

- (1) The FBI states in its report that "Mr.

 Jenkins admitted having engaged in the indecent acts." I do
 not remember making such an admission. If I did so, it was
 unintentional. Perhaps my failure to express myself clearly
 because of the sedation which had been given me resulted
 in a misunderstanding on the part of the agents who interviewed
 me. However, I find it difficult to conceive of having admitted
 engaging in the acts because I do not know whether I did or not
 and have so said to every person that has discussed the matter
 with me.
- (2) The report states that I did not recall any other such acts. This sentence is accurate. However, it goes on to say if I had been involved in any such acts, I had been under the influence of alcohol and in a state of fatigue. I am disturbed

I have great confidence in the Federal Bureau of Investigation, based on a working relationship with them over a number of years and I know neither the FBI nor any member of it would intentionally wrong anyone or misquote anyone or intentionally leave the wrong impression about anyone. However, I feel that the report they released on October 22, 1964 is erroneous on at least one essential point and may be susceptible to misunderstanding on others. I am sure this was not by intent. Accordingly, merely to clarify the FBI's own records, I want to make some comments about some points that were not clear in its report:

The plain fact is that I have no recollection of such instances and I respectfully ask to be recorded as so stating, without qualification.

(3) The report contains the following two sentences:

"According to Mr. Hoover, the investigation which the FBI launched last week has disclosed that Mr. Jenkins has had limited association with some individuals who are alleged to be, or who admittedly are, sex deviates. Mr. Hoover stated there was no information reported to indicate that Mr. Jenkins has ever engaged in improper acts with them."

I appreciate the care and sense of fairness which induced the statement in the report that "there was no information reported to indicate that Mr. Jenkins has ever been engaged in improper acts with individuals who are alleged to be, or admittedly are, sex deviates.

I am particularly disturbed that a person reading this report in the future may be led to believe that I have knowingly associated with Government employees—even that I might have had improper relationship with Government tolds, to may be have been employees—who, to my knowledge, are or were sex deviates. I realize that the quoted statements do not so allege, but in the interest of clarity I wish to make the following unequivocal statements:

Never in my years of Government service did I consciously or knowingly recommend or approve the appointment to any position of any person whom I had reason to suspect was a homosexual. To the contrary, in several instances I have successfully recommended that the applicant against the appointment of applicants because the file practices, & contained information providing reason to suspect that they engaged in homosexual practices.

Never in my years of Government employment did I permit or tolerate any person known to me to be a homosexual, or whom I had reason to suspect to be a homosexual, to be or remain on any staff in which I held a position of responsibility.

Never in my years of Government employ, with one single and limited exception hereinafter stated, did I associate with any person employed by any branch of the Government, or with any other office, whether employed by the Government or ocahower desityetor otherwise -- known to me to be a homosexual The one exception is Mr. Bob Waldron. 
