#### Mr. President:

During the period November 3 - 8, various peace groups throughout the U. S. plan to conduct demonstrations against the war in Vietnam.

In Washington, D. C. Sheila Ryan has formed the Ad Hoc Committee to End the War in Viet Nam. About 50 persons from this group plan a "vigil" in front of the White House on November 3 and 4 from 3:00 p.m. until midnight. Ryan was previously arrested in the White House "sit in" on March 11, 1965. Her conviction for that offense is presently being appealed.

On November 5, approximately 500 persons plan to picket the White House from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. They will then march to Dupont Circle for a "peace rally" from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. From Dupont Circle they plan to go to Secretary McNamara's residence at 2412 Tracy Place, N. W., and picket further.

Dear Mr. Watson:

I thought you would be interested in the following information.

Women Strike for Peace, a pacifist group, Washington, D. C., plans to picket the President upon his return to Washington on November 2, 1966. At the present time, representatives of Women Strike for Peace are attempting to ascertain the location of the airport at which the President will arrive.

In this connection, Lynda Stein, Secretary of the Washington Chapter of Women Strike for Peace, advised a source of this Bureau, who has furnished reliable information in the past, that she had contacted a Mrs. Califonte (phonetic), a member of the White House Staff, in an attempt to determine this information. Mrs. Califonte advised Stein that she did not know the location of the airport and would not disclose this information even if she did as it would be a breach of security. Mrs. Stein then said that Larry Stern (phonetic), a member of the staff of "The Washington Post and Times Herald," will know the airport prior to the President's arrival and will advise her.

Subsequently, Gabriel Huck of the Catholic Peace Fellowship, a recently formed pacifist group which has been active in protesting United States policy toward Vietnam, advised our source that Mrs. Helen Chalfonte is a member of the Fellowship. Mrs. Chalfonte may be identical with Mrs. Califonte.

### Honorable Marvin Watson

Mrs. Chalfonte was investigated by this Bureau in 1956 and in 1964 in connection with her employment at the White House, the results of which were disseminated to the White House.

They carried placards which reflected they needed funds and indicated they were in favor of eliminating poverty now. They met with several United States Congressmen yesterday afternoon. Most of them left Washington following the Congressional meetings.

The Poverty Rights Action Center is a Washington, D. C. Organization set up to instigate protest demonstrations for Poverty and Welfare groups. This organization is sponsoring the demonstration today. Approximately 2,000 individuals are participating. These include delegations from Paterson, New Jersey, Louisville, Kentucky, and St. Louis, Missouri. The demonstrators will visit various members of the United States Senate and House of Representatives, after which they will assemble on the Mall at Fourth Street, N. W. and march to the Sylvan Theater where a rally will be held.

Typical of the groups is the one from St. Louis, Missouri. Seven individuals left St. Louis by Greyhound bus at 7:30 A.M. 9/26/66 to protest handling by Congress of the War on Poverty Program. These seven individuals are employed in the War on Poverty Union-Sarah Gateway Center of the Human Development Corporation, which agency administers the War on Poverty program in St. Louis. \$500.00 of expenses for these individuals were paid for by three politicians in St. Louis. An extremely confidential source indicated that the politicians in question were William C. 



SUBJECT: Demonstration at the White House - September 26, 1966 (United Community Corporation, Newark, New Jersey)

Information has been received from Secret Service sources and other police agencies the above organization is sponsoring a trip to Washington, D. C. on September 26, 1966 to lobby for increased federal funds for the war on poverty in Newark, New Jersey.

Timothy Still is the Chairman of the group, and the Honorary Chairman is Mr. Hugh J. Addonizio, Mayor of Newark and a former Congressman.


The group estimates at 1,000 persons; they will depart Newark, New Jersey by bus at 6:30 a.m. arriving in Washington around noon. From 12:00 to 2:00 p.m. the demonstrators are to eat a box lunch and visit individual Congressmen and Sargeant Shriver of the Office of Economic Opportunity.

At 2:00 p.m. the group is scheduled to meet with Congressman Peter W. Rodino of New Jersey in the caucus room of the Capitol, and the meeting will continue to 5:00 p.m. at which time the group is scheduled to return to Newark, New Jersey by bus.

This group is distributing a leaflet in Newark entitled "Join us in a call on President Johnson and other Government Officials - September 26, 1966".

The Capitol Police have queried Congressman Rodino's office to determine if any of the demonstrators will appear at the White House. The Congressman's office stated that none of the demonstrators are scheduled to go to the White House; however, it is entirely possible that some of the more militant and vocal members may demonstrate outside the White House.



The turnout and response for the meeting today was poor and they did not mention any picketing at the Fairmont Hotel either today or tomorrow. They again stressed they would just be picketing.

At this time we have no indication that there will be picketing in Monterey; if so it would be a very small group. This is because Joan Baez is in Granada, Mississippi and we feel that there isn't anyone there that could organize a group that could have any effect on us.

Information has been received from the FBI that four Puerto Ricans departed San Juan at 7:30 A.M. on September 14, 1966, en route to Washington, D. C., for the purpose of staging a "hunger strike" at the Capitol and the White House. The strike is said to be in protest of the drafting of Puerto Rican men for military service in Viet Nam. The individuals are: Peterson Ortiz-Terreforte; Rosana Ortiz; Enrique Rodriquez-Ruiz; and Rodolfo Rivera. None of them are of prior record in the files of the Secret Service Intelligence Division. Precautions are, of course, being taken and if there are any further developments you will be advised. None of the individuals have arrived as of the writing of this report.

#### MR. MARVIN WATSON

The following information has just been received from our Secret Service Agents in San Francisco, California:

Approximately 150 students and others met last night at the Leconte School in Berkley, California, for the purpose, among other things, of planning demonstrations during the visit to California of the First Lady. The moderator was Peter Camejo who has been associated with the Viet Nam Day Committee (VDC) and the Free Speech Movement. It was agreed that picketing would take place at the hotel and opera house and those in attendance were requested to recruit as many sympathizers as possible for this purpose.

There was an indication that efforts would be made to infiltrate the opera house and there was some talk of an attempt to block the routes of travel if they could be pre-determined. There was no talk of demonstrations by this group at either Point Reys or Crissey Field. The general feeling was that there would be no civil disobedience.

This particular group is called United Committee Against War and is composed of persons also associated with the VDC, the Free Speech Movement; the Socialist Workers Party; and the Progressive Labor Party. At the present time the number of pickets who will participate can not be determined.

At the police meeting this morning the police indicated that this group at the present time does not know where the First Lady will be staying. They have appointed a committee to find this out. Relative to the hotel, the police indicate that they could stop some of the pickets from going into the lobby if they are carrying placards; however, that is the only way. They plan to have an area set aside for them at both locations (opera house and the hotel).

If they are able to infiltrate the opera house (sold out at this time) some will stand-up when the First Lady enters and "BOO".

The local police have informants in the above named groups and we will be able to stay abreast of any plans made by these groups.

Attached is a handbill which is currently being distributed on the campus of the University of California at Berkley, which is a suburb of San Francisco.

#### MR. JACOBSEN

Protective Intelligence, Washington, advised at 1:07 p. m., this date, 60 to 100 members of the DuBois Club are leaving the Sylvan Theatre area. They reportedly intend to "be disorderly" in front of the White House.

1:25 p. m. Protective Intelligence, Washington, advises 250 pickets in front of the White House. They are reportedly carrying signs protesting the arrest of Robert Watts and "Police Brutality." They are orderly at this time.

Robert Watts had two ounces of Marijuana in his possession when arrested.

1:49 p. m. Protective Intelligence reports the demonstrators departed at 3:45 p. m., Washington time. Their leader, using a portable speaker, addressed the crowd as though the President was in residence. Objectionable comments by most standards but no threats.

#### JAKE JACOBSEN

Just thirty (30) minutes ago, with authorization from the U. S. Attorney's Office, Washington, D. C., the Secret Service arrested one Robert Watts for making a Threat Against the President of the United States.

This case developed in the following manner -

Yesterday and today, the DuBois Club has been holding meetings in Washington, D. C. at the Sylvan Theatre. At one of their "workshop meetings" yesterday afternoon, Robert Watts stood up and said approximately the following:

I received my draft notice; I'm to report for a physical on Monday - I'm not going to. If they draft me, the first guy I'll get in the sights of my M-I rifle will be LBJ. I'm not going to fight my black brothers.

These statements were overheard by an Army Intelligence Agent and a Park Police Officer, and reported to the Secret Service. The U. S. Attorney's Office, Washington, D. C. was consulted at 9:0 OA.M. (ranch time) and authorized prosecution. Robert Watts was then arrested at 9:30AM (ranch time) and is now in custody of the Secret Service.

The defendant is described as -

Robert Watts born 4-4-48, chlored male resides at 103 W. 129 St. New York City, N.Y.

#### MARCH ON WASHINGTON AUGUST 27-28, 1966

The W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America, a communist-inspired, Marxist-oriented youth group, held its second national convention at Chicago, Illinois, on June 17-19, 1966. At that convention, the delegates decided to sponsor a march and national youth conference at Washington, D.C., on August 27-28, 1966, for "jobs, peace and freedom." According to a spokesman for the group, the conference will be held "to tell the people we've elected what we have learned this summer, to end the war in Vietnam, to begin the real war on poverty, and to stop discrimination against all minority people, including youth." It is planned that on August 27, 1966, workshops will be held to discuss the various problems and to plan action around them. That evening the participants will camp and have entertainment. On August 28, 1966, the reports of the workshops will be presented to a mass assembly of the demonstrators and a march will then follow.

Subsequent announcements have listed the cosponsors of this event as the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, a militant civil rights group; Students for a Democratic Society, a militant youth group which has received support from the Communist Party; the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, which was expelled from the Congress of Industrial Organizations in 1950 on the grounds that it was communist-dominated; the Young Adult Action group, New York City; the Southern Student Organizing Committee, Nashville, Tennessee, which was organized in 1964 for the purpose of serving as a coordinating body for campus organizations in the South; the Harlem Council for Jobs and Freedom, New York City, the governing board of which consists of members of the Communist Party; Jovenes Progresistas, New York City, which is directed by Jose Sanchez who attended the founding meeting of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America; the National Coordinating Committee to End the War in Vietnam, Madison, Wisconsin, the

Steering Committee of which includes members of the Communist Party; and the Independent Committee to Elect Herbert Aptheker to Congress. Aptheker is a member of the Communist Party, USA, National Committee.

On August 5, 1966, the Communist Party, USA, prepared a letter to all Communist Party Districts urging that every District give top priority to mobilizing neighborhood youth to attend the march on Washington. This letter instructs that the Communist Party youth in each District be relieved from all other responsibilities and do nothing but visit young people in order to persuade them to participate in this activity.

Chapters of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America in New York City have begun a drive to insure that a large contingent from New York City will participate in the march. A caravan which will stop in various cities between New York City and Washington, D.C., is being considered. Participants in the caravan will hold rallies en route in the hope of enlisting additional participants. A representative of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America stated that buses from Los Angeles, California; Chicago, Illinois; and "other points" are expected to arrive in Washington for the conference. In this connection, a caravan is expected to leave Chicago on August 22, 1966, and hold rallies in Detroit, Michigan; Cleveland, Ohio; and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, while en route to Washington. Tentative arrangements have been made to charter ten buses to proceed from New York City to Washington on August 27, 1966.

A leaflet issued by the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America urges that church youth groups, street gangs, civil rights groups, peace groups, poverty protest groups, and trade unionists be contacted to participate in the conference and march and to furnish financial assistance to the Clubs.

A representative of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America contacted the National Park Service, Washington, D.C., and asked for permission for 1,500 persons to camp in Lafayette and Lincoln Parks, Washington, D.C., on August 27, 1966. A request was also made for the use of the Sylvan Theater as a workshop area. The use of Lafayette and Lincoln Parks as a camping area was denied. Subsequently, a request was made for the use of the Sylvan Theater and Anacostia Park on August 27-28, 1966, for "some 2,000 persons." The

request indicated that a march is planned to the Capitol on the afternoon of August 28, 1966, from the Park and the Theater. In answer to this request, it was pointed out by the National Park Service that there are no camping grounds available within the District of Columbia and therefore Anacostia Park cannot be used for this purpose. To date, no additional request has been received.

A representative of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America at Los Angeles, California, has stated that the demonstration in Washington is now being planned on a smaller scale. It is to take the form of a "poor people's conference" with emphasis on the problems of Negroes and other minority groups. The participants will consist mainly of Negroes who have been contacted by the Communist Party and the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America during the summer. According to this representative, the National Office of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America instructed that white students were not to be sent to Washington as delegates to the conference. However, eight members of the Communist Party youth group at Los Angeles will probably attend the march on Washington.

It was also reported that photographers from "Life" magazine have contacted W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America headquarters and have suggested that the marchers hold a torchlight parade at night around the Washington Monument, the Lincoln Memorial, and the Reflecting Pool so that "Life" can use the photograph as a magazine cover.

The Young Adult Action Group, which was listed by the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America as one of the cosponsors of the conference and march, has been described as "furious at the use of its name" as it has no desire to be a cosponsor of this event. The Young Adult Action Group is reportedly sending a letter to the national office of the W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America demanding that it cease using the name of the Young Adult Action Group as a sponsor. In addition, the leader of the New York Chapter of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee is reported to be angered at the use of his group's name as a sponsor and is considering demanding that it be deleted.
