## **Biographical sketch:**

George Edward Reedy (1917-1999) was an educator, author, and lecturer who served as a staff consultant to the armed services preparedness subcommittee, staff director of the minority policy committee, and staff director of the majority policy committee for the U.S. Senate. He served as a special assistant to Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson, as well as press secretary and special consultant to President Johnson.

### Scope and content note:

This collection consists of correspondence, photos, articles, publications, speeches, clippings, lecture notes, appointment books, diaries, awards, manuscripts, and other papers collected by George Reedy during his time as lecturer at Marquette University and as a consultant. In addition to the lectures given by Reedy as a professor, there are materials related to talks, papers, and lectures that Reedy gave at various conferences, seminars, and symposia on the topics of journalism, ethics, public relations, politics, and government. There is correspondence related to invitations to speaking engagements that Reedy accepted, as well as the invitations he declined. There are also various drafts and notes for the books published by Reedy, as well as articles he prepared for publication in magazines and journals. In addition to material related to Reedy's career, there are personal materials collected by Reedy related to his travel and his financial records. A small portion of the material is related to the campaigns of Jack Hightower and Sam Hall, Jr.
