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| Putongan | - A Philippine custom of welcoming distinguished visitors by crowning them with flowers. |
| Bumayah | - A festival dance of the Ifugaos, Mountain Province. It is a thanksgiving to the gods for a good harvest. |
| Kzadoratan | - A stately dance, much favored by members of the royal court in Lanao, as a preparation for an important event. |
| Putritos | - A very lively festival dance from Atimonan, Quezon. Partly romantic, partly nostalgic, and full of beautiful figures and steps. |
| Kalapati | - Kalapati means "dove". The performers, therefore, imitate the movements of doves as they peck, bill and coo. |

Barrio Fiesta, cont'd. . . .

- Tinikling - The whole village joins to cheer the dancers in the celebrated dance, in which the performers imitate the skipping of the tinikling birds between the bamboo poles.
- Kaisahan - Literally means unity. This number features glimpses of the indigenous and primitive character of many lands. Dances interweave to signify peace and progress through international cooperation.
