Entry No.	Time	Activity
①	7:15	Jean-Louis to the White House for shampoo & set.
	9:05	Departed the White House for National Airport and departed for New England trip. (At the airport, met Mr. Hartzog. Sec/M Udall & Liz -- had picture taken.)
		En route to Quincy, Mass., reviewed John Adams' "Familiar Letters."
②	10:55	Arrived at South Weymouth, Mass., airport where greeted by Mayor/M McIntyre -- their daughter, Elizabeth Ann (6), presented roses and then made her little speech in the car en route to the Adams' home. There were several crowds along the parade route, especially several groups of schoolchildren.
	11:30	Arrived at the Adams' home and was greeted by M/M Charles F. Adams and other members of the Adams family -- went on tour of the house, admiring much of Abigail Adams' original porcelain and glassware.
	12:25	Sherry in the Long Room out of Abigail Adams' glasses -- when Mrs. Abigail Adams Homens (88-yr-old great-great-granddaughter of John Adams) dropped her glass, it broke and she exclaimed "Hell! I hope it wasn't historical." Ctg used cranberry goblet owned by Abigail Adams.
		During lunch in the Dining Room the Middle East, Torrey Canyon were discussed, as were the flatware and the table napkins that Abigail Adams herself had hemmed. Ctg gave a toast to the Adams family and Charles Francis Adams responded "to the President of the United States."

Entry No.	Time	Activity
③	1:30	To the Garden to present photo to the Adams house -- also elm seedlings; received some rose plants and has many photos taken. Then went into the Library for coffee and to admire the Adams family book collection.
	2:00	Left the Adams home for the airport; 2:30 departed South Weymouth en route for Burlington -- discussed Adams home with Liz and Sec. Udall.
	3:20	Arrived at the Burlington airport in 83° heat -- greeted by Gov M Hoff; shook hands along the fence before beginning motorcade to the base of Mount Mansfield.
	4:25	Arrive ski lift, base of Mount Mansfield -- greeted by Gov M King (N.H.) and Gov M Curtis (Maine) -- rode ski lift to the top of the mountain, noticing various local flora and fauna en route.
	5:10	At the Lookout (3600') posed for pictures and saw as much of the panorama as the distant fog would permit. Then tasted "sugar and snow" before departing for the base of the mountain via lift. Returned to Lodge to rest and freshen up.
④	6:58	Left the Lodge with Gov M Hoff to visit New England Crafts Show -- blacksmith, glassblowing, pottery wheel, etc. There was general mixing and mingling with cocktails and hors d'oeuvres during the display.
	8:15	Left the Craft Show for dinner at the Spruce House.
	10:30	After dinner, all of the men at the head table made brief speeches of welcome.
	11:10	Skitch Henderson and a few local musicians gave a short presentation of some American songs.
	11:45	Left the Spruce House.
