①	8:40	Stopped at the Toll House Inn after departing the Lodge to say good-bye to the Tweedys -- motorcade to Burlington.
	9:40	Airborne -- read the paper and visited with Mrs. McIntyre en route.
②	10:35	Arrived Pease AFB -- there was a red carpet at the foot of the airplane steps which had been bought from the Wentworth Hotel -- it had been made for the visit of Queen Elizabeth to Ottawa in 1957 (design: crowns and white ermine tails). Greeted by Mayor Quinn -- shook hands along fence. Very hot day!
	10:45	Began motorcade to Strawberry Banke.
③	11:05	Arrived at Strawberry Banke -- greeted by Mr. Margeson and Captain Johnson. Had opening ceremonies for the General Store and the Post Office -- then went into the store and made the first purchase (some thread and books for Lynda); mailed the first letter (to Mrs. Bybbe) in the post office; made a walking tour of the Strawberry Banke restoration project, including the John Clark House.
	12:10	Departed Strawberry Banke for Maine. <i>Mr. Duway knew Tony</i>
④	1:20	Arrived at the Two Lights State Park, Cape Elizabeth, Maine, for a demonstration of lobster trapping and an open-fire clambake -- Delicious fresh seafood! Before eating, planted a pine tree; was greeted by Wanda Griffin and five other members of the local Job Corps.
		During lunch, Jimmie Rodgers sang folk songs; afterwards, Governor Curtis made a few welcoming remarks to which CJ responded.

	3:20	Depart Two Lights Park for Portland.
	4:00	Depart Portland airport. Read the paper en route -- bumpy ride.
	5:00	Arrived at Lebanon, New Hampshire. Made a slight detour with the motorcade to the opposite side of the field where the crowd was waiting -- then continued on to Hartland Dam area.
5	5:40	Arrived at the Hartland Dam Project -- welcome and explanation of the project by Colonel Renier. Unveiled a plaque and then walked down to the water's edge. This was a particularly beautiful spot, with great, open green spaces and whispering trees on the opposite shore. Afterwards, shook hands with crowds along rope barrier.
6	5:55	Departed Hartland Dam area; made brief stop to walk through the old, red covered bridge at Taftsville; then directly on to the Town Hall in Woodstock, Vt.
7	6:35	Was greeted by the mayor; was given a golden litter bag by Woodstock's "Litter Boy", Bobby Frick. After shaking hands and mingling with a large crowd (in this case, there was a particularly large number of children), went on to the Laurance Rockefeller's mansion for a private evening. Cocktails; dinner; followed by a tour of the house!
