	10:15	Depart the Coolidge home for delightful drive through the mountains to return to Woodstock.
②	10:35	Arrived at the <u>First Congregational Church</u> for services. Sermon topic: "God loves Sinners."
③	11:40	Departed church; walked to the Woodstock Historical Association, 2 blocks down the street, to see New England furniture.
	12:10	Leave the historical Association for a ride in the <u>Stanley Steamer</u> -- tour of Woodstock. <i>with Mrs. Johnson &amp; many others</i>
