②	10:35	To the Rose Garden for pictures with Nancy Gates Hayes, her husband Bill, and children: Jeff, Chip, Cindy & Cathy.
	10:43	Left the White House for New York City.
	11:50	Arrived in New York in Eastern shuttle.
③	12:30	Arrived at the Hotel Pierre. Lunch with Rita Wohlman.
	1:30	Saw Miss Treyz and Marquise.
	2:30	Mollie Parris.
④	3:15	Left the Pierre with Bess in Engelhards' car.
	4:45	Arrived at the Engelhards' home, "Cragwood," Far Hills, New Jersey. Sat on the terrace -- tea with Jane, Bess, Barry Birand ^{Birand} (Mrs. E's sister), Miss Bissell (Mrs. E's secretary); and the curator. Then Jane took us on a tour of the house -- saw many paintings.
