PERSONAL PAPERS OF JAMES J. ROWLEY

Creator: Rowley, James J. (James Joseph), 1908-1992

Biographical sketch:

James Joseph Rowley began his career with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, but he soon transferred to the U.S. Secret Service. He was Director of the U.S. Secret Service from 1961 to 1973. After the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in 1963, he reorganized and modernized the Secret Service, improved training procedures, and updated the use of electronic surveillance.

Scope and content note:

This collection consists of speeches delivered by James J. Rowley while he was serving as Director of the Secret Service under President Lyndon B. Johnson. The speeches were delivered at graduations, banquets, ceremonies and other functions for law enforcement groups, educational institutions, civic groups and other public and private organizations. The speeches discuss crime, law enforcement, recruiting for law enforcement organizations, and the Secret Service.
