PERSONAL PAPERS OF BESS W. SCOTT

Creator: Scott, Bess Whitehead, 1890-1997

Biographical sketch:

Bess Whitehead Scott was a journalist who taught high school English and Latin in Houston for two years and at Howard Payne College for one year. She returned to Houston in 1915 and obtained a position as a reporter at the Houston Post newspaper. She married Hubert Clark Scott in 1918 and they had two children. Scott followed her husband in his career but after their divorce she returned to journalism at the Houston Press, and later the Houston Post. In addition to her career as a journalist Scott published textbooks on journalism, helped establish and edit the publication Texas Woman for the Texas Federation of Business and Professional Women, and published her memoir at the age of 99.

Scope and content note:

This collection consists of an article by Bess W. Scott with the title "The Lyndon I Knew". The article tells about how Ms. Scott met Lyndon B. Johnson when he was a debate teacher in Houston in the 1930s
