PERSONAL PAPERS OF A. GOULD LINCOLN

Creator: Lincoln, Gould, 1880-1974

Biographical sketch:

George Gould Lincoln was a political reporter who started his career with the Washington Times from 1903 to 1909. He was an editor and columnist for the Washington Evening Star (which later became the Washington Star-News) from 1909 to 1974. President Richard M. Nixon awarded Gould the Presidential Medal of Freedom on April 22, 1970.

Scope and content note:

The Papers of Gould Lincoln contain letters to Lincoln from Richard Nixon, John F. Kennedy, Herbert Hoover, Lyndon B. Johnson, Lady Bird Johnson, Hubert Humphrey, G. Mennen Williams, Wilton B. Persons, Thomas E. Dewey, Dwight Eisenhower, John W. McCormack, and James A. Farley. Many of the letters concern newspaper articles written by Lincoln. Gould Lincoln's manuscript, "The President Looks at the Press," is included in the series, as well as several newspaper articles written by Lincoln regarding elections, politics, Herbert Hoover, and Franklin D. Roosevelt.
