Biographical sketch:

Mary Kaltman was a home economist and restaurateur from San Benito, Texas. She authored the book: "Keeping Up With Keeping House" (Doubleday) – 1971. She served as executive housekeeper and food coordinator for the White House from 1965 to 1969.

Scope and content note:

This collection consists of correspondence, speeches, newspaper clippings, and publications collected by Mary Kaltman which are related to her service as a White House food coordinator and executive housekeeper during the Administration of Lyndon B. Johnson. The papers cover Ms. Kaltman's professional career and accomplishments, as well as White House events, menus, and guests.
