Talked with Tony Day of the Philadelphia Bulletin^X about his views after a school year's absence on a Harvard fellowship. He said he found he was most surprised by the disarray of the Congress. Jerry Ford is not very smart, but he's out-smarting the Democratic leadership in the House, Tony said. He spent last week on the Hill, mainly to catch up after his absence, and he said that the Democratic majority in the House was "a shambles."

Tony's view is that "the Speaker is unaware of problems, ^{HALE} Albert is ailing, and ^{CARL} Boggs just keeps getting fatter." He said the whip system is almost inoperable and noted "it's a rare day when the five Philadelphia Democrats are all present for even an important vote." He said he'd talked with some of those Philadelphia Democrats, and that one gave him a typical answer "We generally get phone calls on the major votes, and we generally try to get to the floor." Tony's observation was that "Discipline isn't very good if they only respond 'generally'."

I talked to Sheldon Cohen about the attached letter from the Women's National Democratic Club concerning contributions to the Sam Rayburn Lounge.

Cohen says that they never heard of this. He also said that his office does not provide legal rulings on the Federal Corrupt Practices Act; rather, this is done by the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. He did note, however, that even if corporate checks were permissible under the Federal Corrupt Practices Act, this would not be a legitimate deductible contribution for income tax purposes.

I then talked to Fred Vinson. He said that the Department of Justice had issued no such legal ruling and he speculated that the legal ruling referred to was probably given to the Club by their own counsel. Fred noted that the ruling was probably correct, though, because this Club is more social than political. But, the Department of Justice does not give legal opinions to private groups. So, no such ruling would ordinarily be given in this type of case.

I then talked to both Mrs. Hale Boggs and Mrs. Irving Hoff about the legal ruling obtained by the Women's National Democratic Club.

They said that in view of the fact that their Club was considered to be educational rather than political, Mrs. Abe Fortas had repeatedly expressed the oral opinion that corporate checks could be given without violating the Federal Corrupt Practices Act.

At the suggestion of Mrs. Fortas the Club obtained a written opinion to this effect from Mr. Joe Morgan, Jr., a Washington lawyer and the attorney for the Club. But, all parties seem to agree that any contribution to this fund is not a charitable contribution subject to income tax deduction.
