He spent last week on the Hill, mainly to catch up after his absence, and he said that the Democratic majority in the House was "a shambles."

He said the whip system is almost importable and noted "it's a rare day when the five Philadelphia Democrats are all present for even an important vote." He said he'd taked with some of those Philadelphia Democrats, and that one gave kin a typical answer "We generally get phone calls on the major votes, and we generally try to get to the floor." Tony's observation was that "Disciplimisn't very good if they only respond "generally."



I suggest the following topics for discussion:

1. Appropriations:

Independent Offices - HUD. This conference report will be on the House floor Tuesday afternoon. Participating Certificates are included in the conference report which will be voted on before the two items in disagreement - Rent Supplements and Model Cities - are separately voted on.

We know of no problems in the Senate on any of these three items. We need to have the House accept the full Senate figure - which is the budget figure - on Participating Certificates, and to come as close as possible to the Senate figures on Rent Supplements and Model Cities.

We are assuming that there will be a Republican motion to recommit the conference report with instructions to insist on the House position. We believe that we can win this but it may be close.

Mahon's strategy on Rent Supplements and Model Cities is to ask the House to insist on its position without a record vote, return to conference, and then come back to the floor in a few days with compromise figures on both items.

I talked to Sheldon Cohen about the attached letter from the Women's National Democratic Club concerning contributions to the Sam Rayburn Lounge.

Cohen says that they never heard of this. He also said that his office does not provide legal rulings on the Federal Corrupt Practices Act; rather, this is done by the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. He did note, however, that even if corporate checks were permissible under the Federal Corrupt Practices Act, thus would not be a legitimate deductible contribution for income tax purposes.

I then talked to Fred Vinson. He said that the Department of Justice had issued no such legal ruling and he speculated that the legal ruling referred to was probably given to the Club by their own counsel. Fred noted that the ruling was probably correct, though, because this Club is more social than political. But, the Department of Justice does not give legal opinions to private groups. So, no such ruling would ordinarily be given in this type of case.

I then talked to both Mrs. Hale Boggs and Mrs. Irving hoff about the legal ruling obtained by the Women's National Democratic Club.

They said that in view of the fact that their Club was considered to be educational rather than political. Mrs. Abe Fortas had repeatedly expressed the oral opinion that corporate checks could be given without violating the Federal Corrupt Practices Act.

At the suggestion of Mrs. Fortas the Club obtained a written opinion to this effect from Mr. Joe Morgan, Jr., a Washington lawyer and the attorney for the Club. But, all parties seem to agree that any contribution to this fund is not a charitable contribution subject to income tax deduction.
