





I share your "grief and disappointment" that I was forced to veto H.R. 11089, the life insurance bill which you sponsored in the Senate. Those emotions, however, are not so serious as public disagreement between us on figures. When you and I disagree on figures, one of us must start from a faulty premise.

In your speech on the Senate floor, yesterday, you said you were disturbed because my veto message contained some serious inaccuracies, which indicate that I have "wrong and slanted information."

The intent of my insurance veto messages, both this year and last, was to call attention to the relationship between increases in salary and increases in life insurance. This is a point which many people do not understand.

Let us take two cases, a GS-5 employee and a PFS-4 postal employee, grades which include a large proportion of Federal employees covered by the insurance program.

In 1957 the GS-5, entering Federal service, earned \$3670 per year. Taking into account both pay raises and progression through the steps of his grade, that same GS-5 -- without promotion -- now is earning \$6563 per year, an increase of 79 percent in ten years. His insurance coverage has risen from \$4000 to \$7000, a rise of 75 percent.

Almost exactly the same figures apply to the PFS-4 postal worker. His pay has risen by 79 percent and his insurance coverage by 75 percent over this period.

WARREN G. Neither Senator Magnuson, nor Senator Bartlett, nor Senator Brewster, Daniel 3. is in town.

You may wish to use this opportunity to ask Garmatz to oppose -- or at least not support -- the so-called Byrnes amendment to the DOD Conference report. Garmatz spoke in favor of this amendment when it was offered on the floor June 13 during debate on the DOD appropriation, and was adopted by division vote, 119-61.

The Senate defeated a similar amendment and the Conference agreed to report this back as a separate item in disagreement so that there can be a separate vote.

You will recall that Secretary McNamara and Chairman Mahon believe it is most important that the Byrne amendment be defeated.

It will be voted on next Tuesday, September 12, when the DOD Conference report is before the House.

The effect of the amendment is to prohibit purchase by this country from Great Britain of mine sweepers worth \$62.5 million. If the amendment stands McNamara feels that the British agreement to purchase over \$2 billion in aerospace equipment in this country is endangered.

Garmatz can be key on this vote. At best we need his support and his help with the members of his committee. At the minimum we want him to be inactive.

Thank you very much for your letter and your recommendation of Mr. J. Homer Ramsberg for an appointment to the Federal Farm Credit Board.

I have checked into this matter and have expressed your interest and concern in this nomination. I am informed that the next vacancy on the Board will not occur until next year. Under the Federal Farm Credit legislation, the President must before making any appointments, receive nominations from three areas: the national farm loan associations in the district of the vacancy; the production credit associations in the district of the vacancy; and the cooperatives which are stockholders on the guaranty fund of the bank for cooperatives of the district in which the vacancy occurs.

In the meantime, the appropriate officials have have your recommendation of Mr. Ramsberg and I know he will be given careful consideration.

As co-sponsor of the Public Broadcasting Act (S. 1160), I would like to request that Dr. Frederick Breitenfeld, Jr., and Mr. Ellery B. Woodworth of the Maryland Educational-Cultural Broadcasting Commission, be included on the list of individuals to be invited to the signing ceremony for this legislation.

During the past year, the State of Maryland has embarked on a far reaching program for the development of a statewide educational television facility. With central production facilities in Baltimore County, the state network, when completed, will include seven transmitting stations to provide open circuit broadcast throughout all of Maryland.

Dr. Breitenfeld has been a leader in the development of educational television throughout the United States for the past ten years. Before coming to Maryland, he served as Associate Director of the Educational Television Stations Division of the National Association of Educational Broadcasters. Before that he was a consultant to the government on television installation and utilization at Cape Kennedy.
