

MEMORANDUM FOR BAREFOOT SANDERS

Barofoot,

Last night I chaired the United Jewish Appeal Government Division Dinner.

Senator Daniel B. Brewster was the speaker. Prior to his speech the Senator refused to be drawn into a discussion of "reassessments."

His speech regarding Israel was hostile to the Administration.

He said that if we had a commitment to honor in Southeast Asia, then we certainly should honor our commitment to Israel.

He insisted that we should supply Israel with aircraft. He said the need was great not only because of Russian aircraft now available to the Arabs, but also because of the surface-to-surface missiles which the Russians have given to the Arabs.

He deplored our sale of tanks to Jordan and said he could not understand Prime Minister Eshkol's acquiescence.

He had some vague suggestions for settling the refugee problem involving irrigation.

He also made vague sounds about the need for greater U.S. pressure to insure peace for Israel including use of the Suez Canal.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Possible Appointments for Senator Daniel Brewster

I understand you are meeting with Senator Brewster at 6:00 p.m. today and there may be a discussion about future public service assignments for the Senator. I have made a quick review of appointment possibilities which you might wish to consider in this conversation.

There are no full-time executive appointments available for recess appointment for which Senator Brewster would qualify.

You may wish to consider the following part-time assignments for him:

- 1) The Board of Trustees of the John F. Kennedy Center There are two remaining vacancies available to you for filling. These are ten-year terms with no compensation but with periodical Board and Committee meetings.
- 2) The Highway Safety Advisory Committee There is one vacancy per term expiring in March, 1970. Members of this Committee are compensated at the rate of \$100 a day for periods of actual service. The Committee meets on call of the Secretary of Transportation when he has new safety standards to present to them for advice, probably twice a year.
- 3) Board of Visitors. Naval Academy Senator Brewster presently serves ex-officio in his capacities as Maryland Senator on this Board. He could be appointed to fill a three-year Presidential appointment which will become available December 30. Members of this Board receive \$5 a day when attending meetings which occur three or four times a year.
- 4) <u>Visitor Facilities Advisory Commission</u> There are three appointments to be made for service at the pleasure of the President in connection with the National Visitors Center in Washington. The members may be compensated at the rate for experts and consultants.
