Dear Dr. Patterson; *Frederick D.*

The President has asked me to thank you for your letter of December 23 concerning financial support for African students seeking undergraduate education in this country.

The President deeply appreciates the fine work the Phelps-Stokes Fund is doing to assist African students who are already enrolled in American institutions. The substantial support given to this work by the Department of State and the Agency for International Development is an indication of this Government's awareness of the situation and its very real interest in seeing that non-sponsored African students return home having achieved their academic goals. Admittedly the funds are limited, although the Department of State informs me that, with the earlier grant of \$90,000 from the Department and the recent \$75,000 grant from AID, scholarship funds for the first semester of the 1964-65 academic year and the administrative costs of the Fund through the second semester will be covered. I also understand that AID has assured you it will give immediate consideration to second semester needs. Future participation in this endeavor is subject, of course, to the availability of appropriate funds, but there is no intention to abandon this program while there is still a real need.

The financial support given the Phelps-Stokes Fund by the Department of State and AID is just one of the activities they sponsor for African students -- not to mention their program for students in other developing areas of the world. We understand the motives of the many Africans who sought their education in this country several years ago and are now being partially assisted by the Fund. It may not be in the best interests of the United States or of students themselves, however, for the United States Government to

encourage students from Africa or any other area of the world to come to the United States for study without proper academic preparation and adequate financial resources.


Dear Dr. Patterson:






