1. EMBASSY REQUESTED TO TRANSMIT TO PRESIDENT SENGHOR FOLLOWING QUOTE:

I AM DEEPLY GRATEFUL FOR YOUR CONGRATULATORY MESSAGE ON THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE. I AND ALL OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE SINCERELY HOPE THAT THE RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES WILL CONTINUE TO PROSPER IN THE YEARS AHEAD. THE BONDS OF COOPERATION EXISTING BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES WILL BE STRENGTHENED BY OUR COMMON DESIRE THAT A JUST AND LASTING PEACE WILL BE ESTABLISHED THROUGHOUT THE WORLD. FOLLOWING IS TEXT OF PRESIDENT SENGHOR'S MESSAGE: QUOTE ON THE OCCASION OF YOUR COUNTRY'S NATIONAL HOLIDAY, I TAKE PLEASURE IN EXTENDING TO YOU, IN MY OWN NAME AND ON BEHALF OF THE SENEGALESE PEOPLE, OUR WARMEST WISHES FOR YOUR PERSONAL HAPPINESS AND FOR THE PROSPERITY OF THE GREAT PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES. WE FERVENTLY WISH THAT THE BONDS OF COOPERATION EXISTING BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES MAY BE STRENGTHENED IN THE DIRECTION OF THE IDEALS OF LIBERTY AND JUSTICE, IN ORDER TO GIVE EXPRESSION TO THE NECESSARY SOLIDARITY OF ALL THE PEOPLES OF THE EARTH. ON THIS OCCASION, WE EXPRESS OUR PROFOUND HOPE FOR THE DAWNING OF AN AGE OF PEACE AND THE TRIUMPH OF BROTHERHOOD AND MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING. WITH THE RENEWED EXPRESSION OF MY CORDIAL BEST WISHES, I BEG YOU TO ACCEPT THE ASSURANCES OF MY VERY HIGH CONSIDERATION. SGD LEOPOLD SEDAR SENGHOR

CHEIKH IBRAHIMA FALL

Cheikh Ibrahima Fall was born in Dakar on February 4, 1930. He pursued his secondary studies at the Lycee Faidherbe in St. Louis, Senegal and, after obtaining his baccalaureate in 1953, became a teacher at the Lycee Van Vollenhoven in Dakar. He returned to his studies at the Institut des Hautes Etudes, Dakar in 1954 and subsequently at the University of Rennes in France. He completed his university training as a "Laureate of the Faculty of Law," received his Law "Licence" in June 1955, returned home, and entered the then-French civil service in Dakar.

From February 1956 to September 1957, Fall served as Deputy Chief for Production in the French High Commission of French West Africa's Directorate General of Economic Affairs. During this period he was also Director of French West Africa's Cotton Price Stabilization Fund. He became a technical advisor in the Office of General Economy, Plan and Economics Ministry (French West Africa) and Director of the important Peanut Stabilization Fund in September 1957, serving to October 1959. The following month he was appointed Cabinet Director to the Minister of Commerce and Industry, remaining in this position to February 1960, when he became Director of Economic Services in the same Ministry.

He was named Director of Commerce in the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Handicrafts (of an independent Senegal) in March 1962 and accompanied a Senegalese delegation which visited the Soviet Union, Poland, Czechoslovakia and Hungary in June of that year. Prior to October 1962, Fall had visited Scandinavia, Switzerland, France and Italy with another official Sengalese mission. From July 1963 to January 1964 Fall served as Director of External Finance in his

country's Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs. He visited the United States in 1963 to study United States financial methods, and was appointed Ambassador to Germany (and Holland) in January 1964. In March of that year Mr. Fall attended the first United Nations Conference on Trade and Development. He was a member of the Senegalese Delegation to the 37th Session of the Economic and Social Council (presumably of the UN), was named his country's Ambassador to Moscow in September 1966, and accredited also to Poland in February 1967.

Mr. Fall is married. He speaks French, but nothing is known in Washington about his family, religion, personal habits and interests.

Members of the Welcoming Committee are requested to arrive at the South Lawn of the White House by 11:20 a.m., entering the White House grounds at the Southwest Gate and proceeding to the Diplomatic Entrance.

Arrival Ceremonies

At 11:35 a.m., President Johnson will depart from his office in the White House. The trumpets will play four ruffles and flourishes and "Hail to the Chief." During the playing of "Hail to the Chief" the President will walk to the vicinity of the platform to await the arrival of President Senghor.

At 11:40 a.m./

At 11:40 a.m., His Excellency Leopold Sedar Senghor, President of the Republic of Senegal, accompanied by the Chief of Protocol, will enter the Southwest Gate of the White House. The trumpets will sound a fanfare as the cars approach. (See Enclosures 4 and 5). The car carrying President Senghor will stop at the Diplomatic Entrance where Ambassador Symington will present President Senghor to President Johnson. Then Under Secretary Ball and General Wheeler will be introduced. While photographs are being taken of the greetings, protocol officers will assist the members of the Senegalese party to their places to the right of the platform.

Following the photographs, President Johnson will escort President Senghor onto the platform. Others, as indicated below, will take their places on the platform.

When all are in position, the Commander of Troops will bring the Honor Guard to Present Arms.

As the Commander of Troops salutes, the trumpets will sound four ruffles and flourishes and the band will play the national anthem of the Republic of Senegal, followed by the national anthem of the United States. A 21-gun salute will be fired simultaneously with the music.

Upon completion/

Upon completion of honors, the troops will be given Order Arms, the Commander will salute and report, "Sir, the Honor Guard is formed."

President Johnson will escort President Senghor toward the band. The Commander of Troops will take a position to the right of President Senghor and guide him through the inspection. As the inspection party turns in front of the band, President Johnson will take a position to the right of the Commander of Troops.

The band will play appropriate music during the inspection. The inspection will begin at the right front of the band. The inspection party will pass along the front rank of troops. Members of the inspection party will render salutes when passing in front of the Colors. When the inspection party reaches the left flank of the Honor Guard, it will pass around the rear of the formation and around the band. When passing in rear of the Colors, salutes will not be rendered by members of the inspection party.

When the inspection party reaches the right front of the band, the Commander of Troops will halt, salute and report: "Sir, this completes the inspection." President Johnson will escort President Senghor back to the platform. The Commander of Troops will return to his post and bring the Honor Guard to Present Arms. He and his staff will salute President Senghor. After bringing the Honor Guard to Order Arms, the Commander will salute and report: "Sir, this concludes the ceremony."

President Johnson and President Senghor will move to the microphone at the left side of the platform. President Johnson will welcome President Senghor to the United States and President Senghor will respond. The remarks will be interpreted.

Upon conclusion of the remarks, President Johnson will escort President Senghor into the Diplomatic Reception Room. Under Secretary Ball and General Wheeler will join them and a receiving line will be formed on the east side of the room.

Members of the Senegalese party and the Welcoming Committee will be escorted into the Diplomatic Reception Room where they will be presented to President Johnson, Under Secretary Ball, and General Wheeler. After each person has been presented, he will leave by the same door by which he entered.

When the

When the greetings have been completed, President Johnson will take President Senghor to the President's Office. Others attending the meeting will follow.

Members of President Senghor's party who are not attending the meeting will return to the Diplomatic Entrance and enter their cars in the driveway. The cars will proceed to Blair House.

The automobiles of the Welcoming Committee will then come to the Diplomatic Entrance for their departure.

Upon conclusion of the luncheon following the meeting with the President, President Senghor and his party will proceed to Blair House.

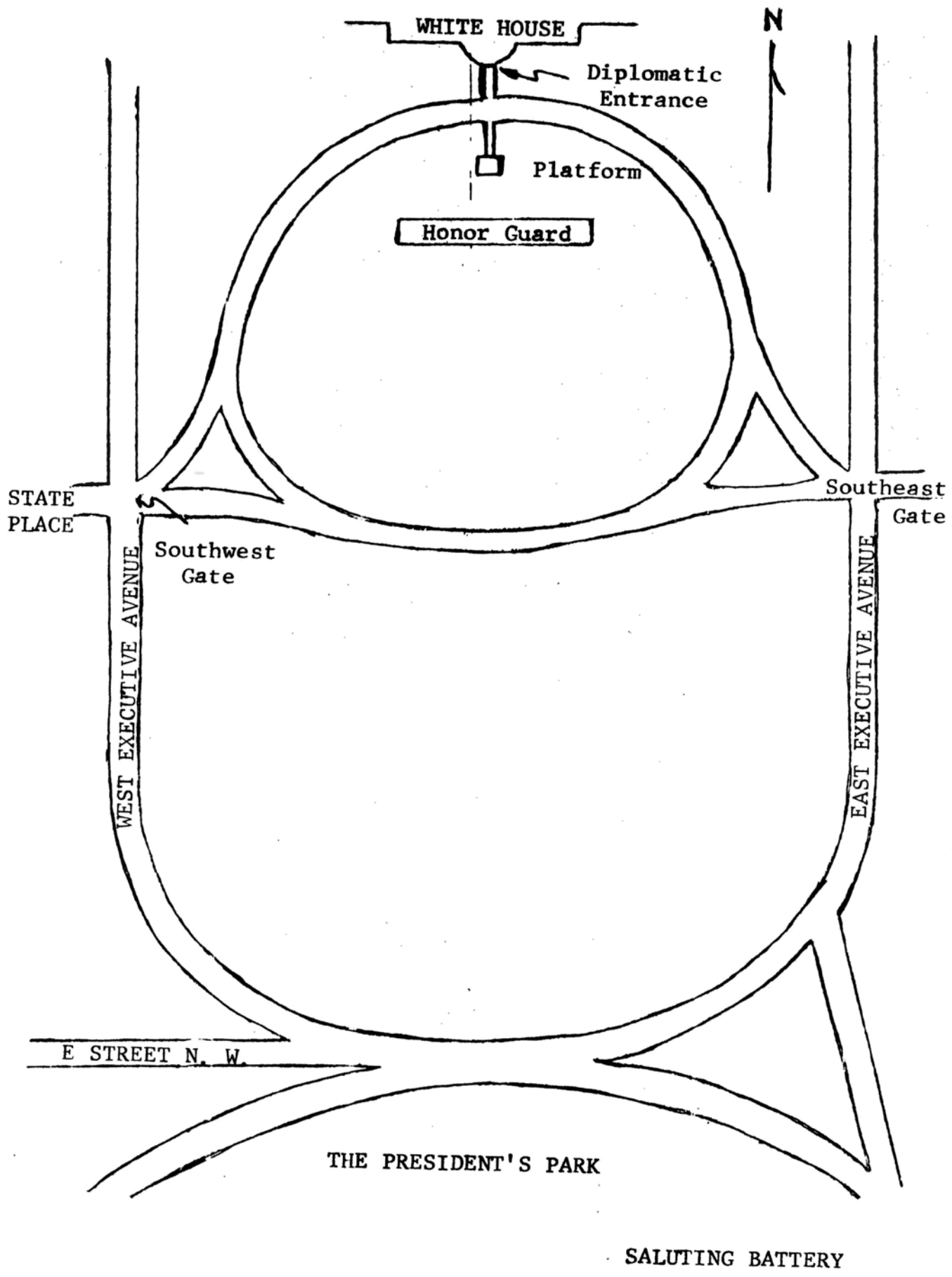

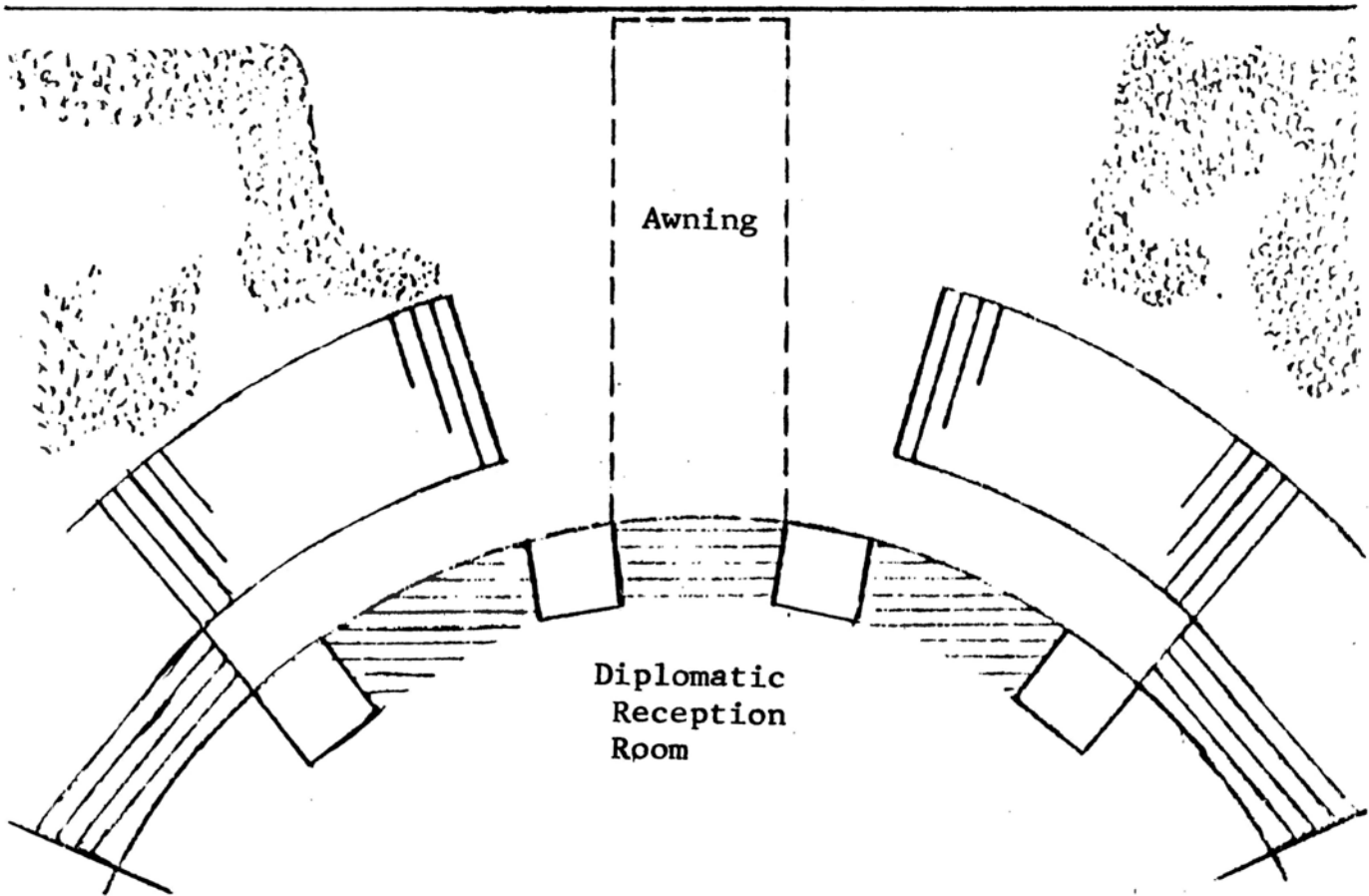
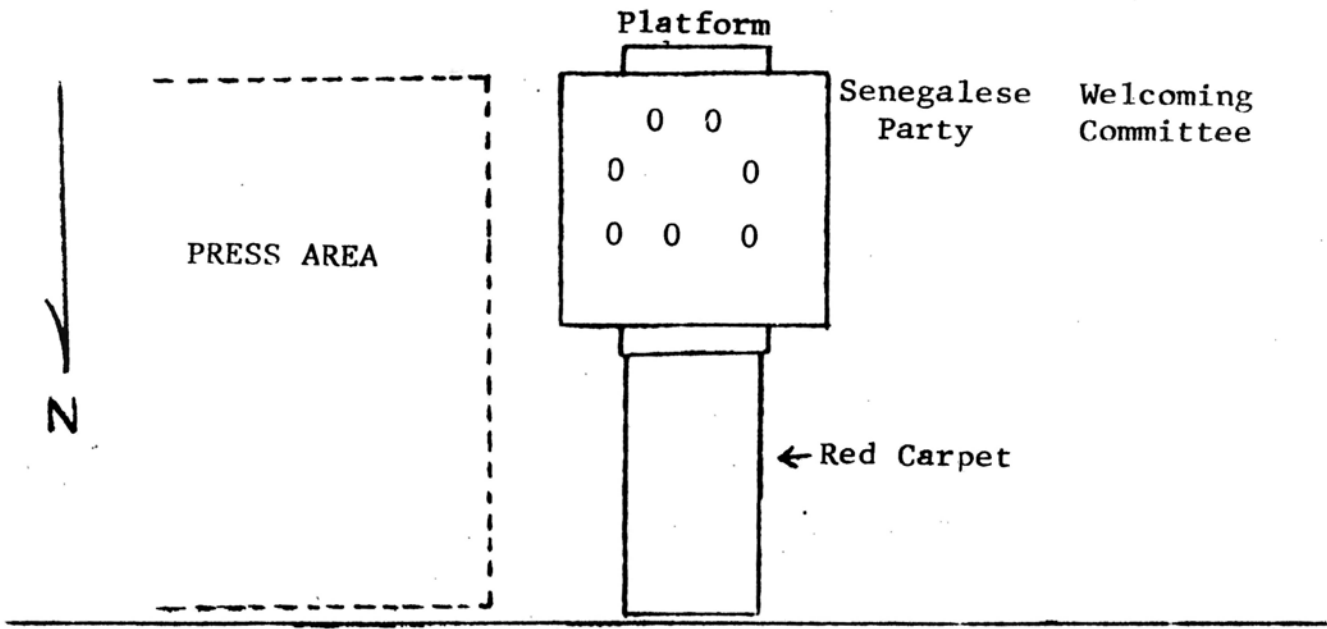

At 11:30 a.m., members of the Welcoming Committee will take their places on the North Portico. Under Secretary Ball and General Wheeler will wait at the front steps.

At 11:35 a.m., President Johnson will arrive at the steps at the North Portico to await the arrival of President Senghor.

The President of the Republic of Senegal and his party will arrive at the North Portico of the White House, by way of the Northwest Gate, at 11:40 a.m. Ambassador Symington will present President Senghor to President Johnson. Ambassador Symington will then present Under Secretary Ball and General Wheeler to President Senghor. During the greetings, other members of the party will be escorted to their places on the North Portico.

Upon completion of the greetings, President Johnson and President Senghor will take their places on the red carpet. The band will play four ruffles and flourishes, followed by the national anthems of the Republic of Senegal and the United States. At the completion of the anthems, President Johnson and President Senghor will move to the microphones, where President Johnson will welcome President Senghor to the United States. President Senghor will respond. (The remarks will be interpreted.) Following the remarks, President Johnson and President Senghor, accompanied by Under Secretary Ball and General Wheeler, will move inside where they will receive the members of the Senegalese party and the Welcoming Committee.

Upon conclusion of the greetings, President Johnson will escort President Senghor to his office in the White House. Others attending the meeting will follow.

Members of President Senghor's party not attending the meeting will leave from the North Portico by automobile and proceed to Blair House.

Members of the Welcoming Committee will leave from the Diplomatic Entrance (South Portico).

His Excellency will arrive at Military Airlift Command Terminal, Washington National Airport aboard a United States Air Force Special Flight at 1120 hours (EDT) on September 28, 1966. Department of the Army is requested to provide baggage handling and surveillance teams and aircraft security on arrival in Washington, D. C. It is requested that the baggage be transported to the Blair House.

Department of the Army is requested to arrange an Armed Forces Full Military Honors Ceremony for His Excellency at the White House at 1140 hours (EDT) on September 28, 1966, utilizing the United States Navy Band. The Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff or his representative has been requested to attend the arrival ceremony. The other Military Services are requested to participate in this ceremony in accordance with Standing Operating Procedures for such occasions and to cooperate fully with the Military District of Washington.

Department of the Army is requested to arrange for a wreath-laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and at the grave of the late President Kennedy at 1015 hours (EDT) on September 29, 1966.

His Excellency will depart from Andrews Air Force Base aboard a United States Air Force Special Flight (VC 137) at 0945 hours (EDT) on September 30, 1966. The United States Air Force is requested to provide baggage handling and surveillance teams and aircraft security on departure from Andrews Air Force Base.

His Excellency will arrive at the Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico, at 1030 hours (MST) on September 30, 1966, and will depart from the same base at 1045 hours (MST) on September 30, 1966. The United States Air Force is requested to provide aircraft security on arrival and departure.

His Excellency will arrive at the Santa Fe Municipal Airport at 1110 hours (MST) on September 30, 1966, and will depart from the same airport at 1425 hours (MST) September 30, 1966. The Department of the Air Force is requested to provide aircraft security on arrival and departure.

His Excellency will arrive at Kirtland Air Force Base at 1450 hours (MST) on September 30, 1966, and will depart aboard a United States Air Force Special Flight (VC 137) at 1500 hours (MST) on September 30, 1966. The Department of the Air Force is requested to provide aircraft security on arrival and departure.

His Excellency will arrive at the Los Angeles International Airport at 1700 hours (PDT) on September 30, 1966, and will depart from the same airport at 1520 hours (PDT) on October 2, 1966. The Department of the Navy is requested to provide baggage handling and surveillance teams and aircraft security on arrival and departure.


