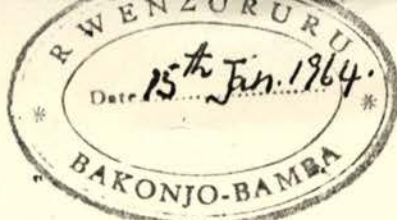

Re: "Rwenzururu Kingdom Government Urgently request U.N.O. Commission of Inquiry".

With reference to the document and the telegram No.6, dated 1st Nov. 1963, which were requesting and advising U.N.O. to remove Batooro Uganda Government Officials, Rifles, Companies and Foreign ~~visiting~~ visitors who are disturbing the Kingdom of Rwenzururu!

Since then the Batooro Uganda Government Officials and Rifles never stopped their wild brutal and malicious actions in collection of unlawful Uganda Government Poll Tax from the innocent Rwenzururians who are not subjects of the Uganda disturbed Government as far as Uganda Constitution 1962 is concerned!
