Diana MacArthur is a co-founder of the Rockville-based Dynamac Corp. She was married to Donald M. MacArthur and is a niece to Lady Bird Johnson. Mrs. MacArthur was appointed by President Clinton to the President's Committee of Advisors on Science and Technology, and has served on numerous boards for organizations including the Los Alamos National Laboratory, the Science and Technology Corporation, and the Lady Bird Johnson National Wildflower Research Center.

Scope and content note:

This collection consists of correspondence, reports, press releases, lists, newspaper clippings, and publications collected by Donald M. and Diana T. MacArthur while they were working for the 1964 Presidential campaign of Lyndon B. Johnson. The papers cover the Scientists and Engineers for Johnson campaign organization and its membership, donors, staffing, finances, platform, planning, and leadership.
