The President today announced the reappointment of the chairman and two members of the Corregidor-Bataan Memorial Commission. Emmet O'Neal of Louisville, Kentucky, was renamed chairman, and Frank Hewlett of Virginia and John H. Leims of Missouri were renamed as members.

The Commission was formed in 1953, and O'Neal has served as its chairman since that time. The Commission was organized to plan and supervise the construction of a War Memorial on Corregidor Island in the Philippines. A law passed by the 88th Congress authorized \$1,500,000 for the construction.

Tentative plans include completion of the construction and dedication ceremony in April, 1967.
