- 2. We have no other hard information to confirm this allegation, and since such a development would be a complete switch from the long standing policy of both the Soviets and the Arabs against foreign bases, the plausibility of the report is in question.
- 3. The Soviets certainly feel compelled to re-equip the Egyptian army. This gesture of support for Egypt may also include a much larger Soviet military training mission, and there seems little doubt that this is one of the topics currently under discussion in Cairo. The same may be said of Syria. Cairo's recent order to terminate all military training in the USSR and pull its personnel back to Egypt may also be an indication that all further training will be conducted in Egypt. The present Soviet military mission in Egypt would be insufficient to carry out greatly expanded training.
- 4. While Soviet bases in the area would give them a greatly increased influence, the resultant political disadvantages both to the Arab Nationalists and the Soviets would seem to preclude their establishment at this time. A greatly expanded training mission might better serve both Arab and Soviet interests without the serious political risks.
