SUBJECT: BRIEFING FOR CONGRESSMAN OTTO PASSMAN(U)

REFERENCE: CINCPAC INSTR 5050.2C, DTD 9SEP65,

FOR: ADM SHARP FROM MG CICCOLELLA.

1. (S) CONGRESSMAN PASSMAN WAS BRIEFED AT HQ MAAG AT 020100Z, MAR 68. BRIEFING INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING MAJOR SUBJECT AREAS:

A. CHINESE COMMUNIST THREAT TO THE ROC.

B. STATUS OF GRC ARMED FORCES.

C. MILITARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FY68 TO INCLUDE FOREIGN MILITARY SALES.

D. REPAIR AND REBUILD PROJECTS ON TAIWAN TO HELP OFFSET MAP CUTS.

2. (S) CONGRESSMAN PASSMAN EXPRESSED SURPRISE AND CONCERN OVER THE 46 MILLION DOLLAR CUT IN THE FY68 MAP FOR ROC. IN ESSENCE, HE STATED THAT IT WAS NOT THE INTENT OF THE CONGRESS OR HIS COMMITTEE TO CUT THE FY68 CHINA PROGRAM. HE CONSIDERS THE CUT TOO DRASTIC, TOO SOON AND AT THE WRONG TIME, PARTICULARLY IN VIEW OF THE SITUATION IN SE ASIA. CONGRESSMAN PASSMAN STATED THAT THE GRC IS ONE OF THE FEW TRUE AND RELIABLE ALLIES OF THE US.

3. (S) THE CONGRESSMAN STATED THAT UPON HIS RETURN HE WOULD TALK TO THE PRESIDENT ABOUT RESTORING SOME OF THE MAP FOR GRC; PROBABLY ON THE ORDER OF MAGNITUDE OF 20 TO 25 MILLION. THIS AMOUNT WAS RELATED TO THE F-5 AIRCRAFT THAT WERE DELETED FROM THE FY68 MAP AND TO THE PROPOSED 20 MILLION ADDITIONAL FMS CREDIT. HIS RATIONALE WAS THAT, RATHER THAN FORCE A SHARP INCREASE IN FMS EXPENDITURES WITH ITS PROBABLE ECONOMIC IMPACT WHICH MAY REVERSE OR SLOW DOWN THE ECONOMIC GROWTH, IT WOULD

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BE BETTER TO PROVIDE MORE GRANT AID.

4. (S) CONGRESSMAN PASSMAN INDICATED THAT HE WOULD PROPOSE TO THE PRESIDENT THAT \$20 MILLION OF THE ADDITIONAL \$100 MILLION REQUESTED FOR KOREA BE ALLOCATED TO CHINA. IF THIS WAS NOT ACCE PTABLE, HE WOULD REQUEST \$20 MILLION IN ADDITION TO THE \$100 MILLION FOR KOREA.

5. (S) CONGRESSMAN PASSMAN STATED THAT IT WAS QUITE PROBABLE THE COMMITTEE WOULD REINSTATE A FORMER POLICY OF REQUIRING CHIEFS SELECTED OF/MAAG'S TO APPEAR BEFORE THE COMMITTEE TO TESTIFY ON THEIR PROGRAMS. HE STATED THAT CHIEF MAAG COULD EXPECT AN INVITATION TO APPEAR BEFORE HIS COMMITTEE IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

6. (U) THE CONGRESSMAN REQUESTED A COPY OF THE BRIEFING BE FORWARDED TO REACH HIS OFFICE NTL 6 MAR 68. REQUESTED BRIEFING WAS MAILED THIS DATE TO CINCPAC AND AN INFO COPY WAS ALSO MAILED TO DOD LEGISLATIVE LIAISON OFFICE WITH REQUEST THAT IT BE TRANSMITTED TO THE CONGRESSMAN

1. THE FOLLOWING REFLECT CHANGES IN CONSIDERATIONS CONTAINED IN REFERENCES (A) AND (B):

4. IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT INITIAL ANNOUNCEMENT OF RETURN OF REMAINS OF DECEASED WOULD OF NECESSITY BE MADE BY COMUSKOREA AT THE TIME OF TURNOVER BECAUSE OF THE EXTREME UNLIKELIHOOD, IF NOT IMPOSSIBILITY, OF SUCH INFORMATION REMAINING UNKNOWN TO REPRESENTATIVES OF OTHER COUNTRIES, AND ANNOUNCED BY THEM, BEFORE ASD(PA) COULD MAKE ITS ANNOUNCEMENT. IF SUBSEQUENT AUTOPSY AUTHORIZED, BASIC INFORMATION CONCERNING SAME WOULD BE MADE BY COMUSKOREA.

B. UNLIMITED PHOTOGRAPHY OF RETURN OF CREW TO HAWAII WOULD BE AUTHORIZED, RATHER THAN RESTRICTED ONLY TO MILITARY PHOTOGRAPHERS.

C. FOR COMNAVFORKOREA: BRIEF MEMORIAL CEREMONY AT AIRPORT PRIOR DEPARTURE OF REMAINS FROM KOREA IS CONSIDERED IN ORDER AND IS AUTHORIZED. GP-4.

1. ((U) REFERENCE CINCPACFLT MSG 242222Z FEB 68.

2. ((S) UPON NOTIFICATION FROM NORTH KOREA THAT MEMBERS OF USS PUELO ARE TO BE RETURNED TO U.S. CUSTODY, THE FOLLOWING UNC ANNOUNCEMENTS ARE SUBMITTED FOR APPROVAL:

A. INITIAL ANNOUNCEMENT: QUOTE: REAR ADMIRAL J. V. SMITH, SENIOR MEMBER OF THE UNITED NATIONS COMMAND COMPONENT OF THE MILITARY ARMISTICE COMMISSION, TODAY MADE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT CONCERNING A NORTH KOREAN ANNOUNCEMENT ABOUT THE U.S. NAVY SHIP PUELO AND CREW: "THE NORTH KOREAN MAC SENIOR MEMBER, MAJ. GEN. CHUNG KUK PAK, HAS NOTIFIED ME BY MESSAGE (TODAY) (YESTERDAY) THAT CREW MEMBERS (AND THE DECEASED SAILOR, FIREMAN D.D. HODGES,) OF USS PUELO WILL BE RETURNED. THIS RETURN IS EXPECTED TO TAKE PLACE AT AN OPEN MAC (SECRETARIES) MEETING AT PANMUNJOM TO BE HELD AT -----(A.M.) (P.M.) ON (DATE) KOREAN TIME.

THE NORTH KOREAN MESSAGE DID (DID NOT) SPECIFY THAT (WHETHER) ALL MEMBERS OF THE CREW WOULD BE RETURNED. THE MESSAGE (DID) (DID NOT) MAKE REFERENCE TO RELEASE OF THE SHIP ITSELF. UNQUOTE.

B. FOLLOW UP RELEASE: QUOTE, THE CREW OF USS PUELO WAS RETURNED TODAY TO U.S. MILITARY CONTROL BY NORTH KOREA. THIS RETURN WAS ARRANGED THROUGH (THE SECRETARIES OF THE MILITARY ARMISTICE COMMISSION,) FOLLOWING EARLIER MEETINGS BETWEEN THE SENIOR MEMBERS OF

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THE RESPECTIVE SIDES.

A COMPLETE LIST OF THE RETURNEES IS ATTACHED.

REAR ADMIRAL J. V. SMITH, UNCMAC SENIOR MEMBER, HAS MADE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT CONCERNING THIS RETURN OF PERSONNEL: "ON BEHALF OF THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, I EXTEND A WARM WELCOME TO THE MEMBERS OF PUEBLO WHO WERE RETURNED TO U.S. MILITARY CONTROL TODAY BY NORTH KOREA. THE PRIMARY CONCERN AT THIS MOMENT IS FOR THE WELFARE OF THE CREW. NECESSARY STEPS WILL BE TAKEN TO INSURE THAT THEY ARE REUNITED AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE TIME WITH THEIR FAMILIES.

WHILE THE U.S. GOVERNMENT WELCOMES THIS ACTION BY NORTH KOREA IN RETURNING THE PUEBLO CREW, THE IMPORTANT MATTER OF OBTAINING THE RETURN OF THE SHIP ITSELF STILL REMAINS. TO ACHIEVE THIS END, THE U.S. GOVERNMENT PLANS TO CONTINUE FURTHER MEETINGS WITH NORTH KOREA THROUGH THE MACHINERY OF THE MILITARY ARMISTICE COMMISSION. THE RETURNEES ARE RECEIVING INITIAL OBSERVATION AT THE ARMY'S JEMST EVACUATION HOSPITAL.

FOR REASONS OF PRIVACY, COMFORT, MEDICAL AND SECURITY REQUIREMENTS, CREW MEMBERS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR NEWS INTERVIEWS OR CONFERENCES UNTIL AFTER BEING DEBRIEF IN HAWAII. UNQUOTE.

3. SINCE DECEASED IN ALL LIKELYHOOD WILL BE RETURNED TO U.S. CUSTODY IN PRESENCE OF FOREIGN AND LOCAL NEWS MEDIA, RECOMMEND THAT THE INITIAL ANNOUNCEMENT ON THE RETURN BE MADE BY CINCPAC VICE JASD/PA AS INDICATED IN CINCPACFLT MSG 242201Z FEB 68. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT ARMY 121ST EVAC HOSPITAL AND KIMPO AIR BASE ARE UNDER CONTINUOUS OBSERVATION BY KOREAN NEWS MEDIA, CONSEQUENTLY IT IS HIGHLY IMPROBABLE THAT THE EVACUATION OF DECEASED COULD GO UNNOTICED EVEN IF THE RETURN AT PANMUNJOM WAS UNOBSERVED BY THE PRESS.

HARRASSMENT BY SOVIET SHIPS IN THE SEA OF JAPAN (S)

1. SINCE THE FIRST OF THE YEAR THE NUMBER OF INCIDENTS IN WHICH U.S. NAVY SHIPS HAVE BEEN HARASSED BY USSR SHIPS IN THE SEA OF JAPAN HAS INCREASED. THE FREQUENCY AND NATURE OF THE INCIDENTS PROVIDE SOUND BASES FOR CONCLUSION THAT MANY OR ALL WERE DELIBERATELY INTENDED.

2. IN ADDITION TO THE TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA INVOLVED, THE INCIDENTS PRESENTED GRAVE DANGER TO LIFE AND PROPERTY. DESPITE THE SKILL AND RESOLUTION WITH WHICH OUR SHIPS ARE MANEUVERED IN SUCH CIRCUMSTANCES, IT MUST BE RECOGNIZED THERE IS POTENTIAL DANGER OF AN INCIDENT INVOLVING SERIOUS INTERNATIONAL CONSEQUENCES. RECENT EXAMPLES OF INCIDENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

A. ON 23 JAN 68 AT 32-54.5N/129-28.8E THE SOVIET ASR GIDROLOG, WHILE PRIVILEGED SHIP IN A CROSSING SITUATION, MANEUVERED SO AS TO FORCE USS ENTERPRISE TO BACK ALL ENGINES TO AVOID COLLISION.

B. ON 25 JAN 68 AT 33-56N/129-35E THE SOVIET DE 803 CLOSED USS O'BANNON TO 700 YDS AND ILLUMINATED WITH SEARCHLIGHT.

C. ON 29 JAN 68 AT 34-04N/129-33E THE SOVIET DE 803 CLOSED USS BANNER TO 450 YDS AND ILLUMINATED WITH SEARCHLIGHT.

D. ON 31 JAN 68 AT 36-02N/130-35E THE SOVIET MERCHANT

3. UNITS OF THE PACIFIC FLEET OPERATE WITHIN THE FULL LIMITS OF THE RIGHT OF FREEDOM OF NAVIGATION ON THE HIGH SEAS, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO CLOSE FOR IDENTIFICATION. THE RIGHT OF SOVIET SHIPS TO DO THE SAME IS ACKNOWLEDGED AND SUPPORTED AS LONG AS THEY MANEUVER IN A MANNER THAT WILL NEITHER EMBARRASS NOR ENDANGER THE SHIP BEING IDENTIFIED. THE UNC SENIOR MEMBER EMPHASIZED THAT THE NORTH KOREANS HOLD THE FUTURE OF THE MAC AND PEACE IN KOREA. HE ASKED PAK TO THINK LONG AND HARD ABOUT THAT.

NO MENTION WAS MADE OF THE USS PUEBLO BY UNC ALTHOUGH PAK DID BRING UP THE MATTER IN HIS CLOSING REMARKS AND OUTSIDE THE CONFERENCE ROOM THE NORTH KOREANS DISPLAYED PHOTOGRAPHS AND COPIES OF ALLEGED HAND-WRITTEN 'CONFESSIONS' BY THE SHIP'S COMMANDER, EXECUTIVE OFFICER, RESEARCH OFFICER, OPERATIONS OFFICER AND A CIVILIAN OCEANOGRAPHER. THE MEETING ADJOURNED AT 2:15 P.M.

THE UNITED STATES INTENDS TO ACCOMPLISH THE RETURN OF THE PUEBLO CREW BY DIPLOMATIC MEANS WITHOUT BECOMING EMBROILED IN A SECOND FRONT WAR IN KOREA. WE ALSO HOPE TO HAVE THE PUEBLO ITSELF RETURNED THROUGH DIPLOMATIC MEANS, ALTHOUGH RETURN OF THE SHIP IS LESS IMPORTANT THAN RETURN OF THE CREW. WE DO NOT INTEND TO TAKE ANY MILITARY COURSE OF ACTION FOR RETURN OF THE PUEBLO CREW BECAUSE WE KNOW OF NO ACTION THAT OFFERS ANY PROMISE OF GETTING THE PUEBLO CREW BACK ALIVE. THE BUILDUP OF AIR AND NAVAL UNITS IS DESIGNED TO SUPPORT OUR DIPLOMATIC EFFORTS WHILE AT THE SAME TIME INCREASING OUR READINESS.

3. YOU HAVE NOT BEEN PERMITTED TO DISCUSS OUR STRATEGY WITH THE ROKS BECAUSE SUCH DISCUSSION WOULD RUN THE RISK OF UPSETTING OUR CAREFUL AND DELIBERATE COURSE OF ACTION. 1. THIS DIRECTIVE ESTABLISHES POLICY, OUTLINES RESPONSIBILI-

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## CORRESPONDENTS.

### SECTION II. GENERAL

2. THE COMMANDER IN CHIEF, UNITED NATIONS COMMAND (UNC), AND THE COMMANDER, UNITED STATES FORCES KOREA (USFK), ENCOURAGE FREE WORLD NEWS MEDIA INTEREST IN THE ACTIVITIES OF THE UNCMAC AND ITS AGENCIES AND DESIRE TO FACILITATE THE COVERAGE OF SUCH ACTIVITIES.

### SECTION III. RESPONSIBILITIES

3. THE PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICER (PAO), UNC/USFK, IS RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- A. SUPERVISION AND COORDINATION OF ALL PRESS VISITS IN CONNECTION WITH ACTIVITIES OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES.
- B. ACCREDITING CORRESPONDENTS IN KOREA IN ACCORDANCE WITH UNC/USFK PD 10-5 ( TO BE PUBLISHED).
- C. ADMINISTRATIVE CONTROL AND COORDINATION, AND LOGISTIC

SUPPORT FOR UNC SPONSORED NEWSMEN WHEN THEY ARE COVERING ACTIVITIES OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES, EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF A FIELD MEETING OF A JOINT OBSERVER TEAM (JOT). IN THE LATTER CASE, MESSING, BILLETING ON A REIMBURSABLE BASIS (IF REQUIRED), AND COMMUNICATIONS WILL BE COORDINATED WITH THE SENIOR MEMBER, JOT. THE COMMANDING GENERAL, EIGHTH ARMY, WILL RENDER NECESSARY ASSISTANCE TO PROVIDE SUCH SUPPORT.

4. THE COMMANDING OFFICER, US ARMY SUPPORT GROUP, JOINT SECURITY AREA (USA SIT GP, JSA), IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING THE FOLLOWING LOGISTIC SUPPORT TO UNC SPONSORED NEWSMEN WHEN THEY ARE COVERING ACTIVITIES OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES AT THE JOINT SECURITY AREA: MESSING, BILLETING ON A REIMBURSABLE BASIS (IF REQUIRED) AND COMMUNICATIONS.

### SECTION IV. PROCEDURES

5. CORRESPONDENTS WILL BE NOTIFIED OF MEETING OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES BY THE PAO, UNC/USFK. NEWS MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES ARE INVITED TO ATTEND ALL SUCH MEETINGS.

6. THE PAO, UNC/USFK, IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ARRANGING TRANSPORTATION OF CORRESPONDENTS TO THE SITE OF UNCMAC ACTIVITIES, IN THE CASE OF MEETINGS OF A JOT, TRANSPORTATION WILL BE COORDINATED

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WITH THE SENIOR MEMBER, JOT.

7. CORRESPONDENTS ATTENDING MEETINGS OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COMMISSIONED OFFICER OR CIVILIAN OF EQUIVALENT GRADE WHO WILL BE DESIGNATED BY THE PAS, UNC/USFK.

8. THE DESIGNATED ESCORT OFFICER WILL:

A. BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PRESS ACCREDITATION AND FOR ARRANGING JSA CLEARANCE FOR CORRESPONDENTS ENTERING THE AREA.

B. INSURE THAT UNC PRESS ARMBANDS ARE WORN AND REQUIRED IDENTIFICATION IS CARRIED BY ALL NEWSMEN ENTERING THE JSA.

C. INSURE THAT ALL CORRESPONDENTS ARE FAMILIAR WITH THE RESTRICTIONS AND PRIVILEGES REGULATING BEHAVIOR IN THE JSA (KUNC FORM 59-1).

9. CORRESPONDENTS' MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE JSA.

A. ACTIVITIES OF CORRESPONDENTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO INTERFERE WITH OR DELAY OPERATIONS OF AGENCIES OF THE UNCMAC.

B. NEWSMEN WILL BE PERMITTED FREE MOVEMENT WITHIN THE JSA OF THE HEADQUARTERS AREA OF THE UNCMAC, EXCEPT AS LIMITED BY PARAGRAPH 10.

C. UNC SPONSORED NEWSMEN WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE CONFERENCE ROOM IN THE JSA OF THE UNCMAC WHEN THE

UNCMAC OR ANY OF ITS AGENCIES ARE IN SESSION.

10. CONVERSATION WITH KPA/CPV AND POLISH/CZECH PERSONNEL.

A. ROK CORRESPONDENTS MAY ENGAGE IN INFORMAL CONVERSATION WITH THE KOREAN PEOPLE'S ARMY/CHINESE PEOPLE'S VOLUNTEERS (KPA/CPV) PRESS AT MEETINGS OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES.

B. UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS (TO INCLUDE ROK AND OTHER) MAY ENGAGE IN INFORMAL CONVERSATION WITH POLISH AND CZECH MEMBERS OF THE NEUTRAL NATIONS SUPERVISORY COMMISSION (NNSC) AT MEETINGS OF THE UNCMAC OR ITS AGENCIES.

C. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE PROVISIONS OF A AND B ABOVE, NO UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENT (ROK OR OTHER) WILL RESPOND TO REMARKS FROM, OR ENGAGE IN CONVERSATION WITH, KPA/CPV PERSONNEL (MILITARY OR CIVILIAN) IN THE JSA WHILE COVERING UNCMAC MEETINGS

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OR AGENCIES.

D. TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS AND TO PREVENT INCIDENTS, THE ESCORT OFFICER AND ASSIGNED MILITARY POLICE WILL MAINTAIN CLOSE SURVEILLANCE OF SUCH AUTHORIZED CONVERSATION TO INSURE THAT THEY ARE CONDUCTED IN A QUIET MANNER, IN THE OPEN, AND IN THE IMMEDIATE VICINITY OF THE UNCMAC CONFERENCE

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BUILDING OR JOINT MEETING PLACE.

E. UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER COMMUNIST BUILDINGS IN THE JSA, EXCEPT FOR THE COMMUNIST BUILDING IN WHICH THE NNSC GENERAL SERVICE OFFICES ARE LOCATED. THEY MAY ENTER THIS BUILDING IN THE JSA AT THE INVITATION OF NNSC PERSONNEL OF EITHER SIDE. UNC JOINT SECURITY FORCE PERSONNEL WILL MAINTAIN CLOSE SURVEILLANCE OF THIS BUILDING WHILE UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS ARE INSIDE TO PREVENT INCIDENTS AND TO INSURE THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS.

F. KPA/CPV PRESS REPRESENTATIVES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE UNC PRESS BUILDING. IN THE EVENT A UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENT TRIES TO BEING A KPA/CPV PRESS REPRESENTATIVE INTO THE BUILDING, SUCH ENTRY WILL BE POLITELY DENIED BY UNC JOINT SECURITY FORCE PERSON-

NEL, WITH AN EXPLANATION THAT IT IS CONTRARY TO UNC POLICY. THE ESCORT

OFFICER WILL BE NOTIFIED IMMEDIATELY IF THIS HAPPENS.

G. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE PROVISIONS WILL BE GROUNDS FOR THE REVOCATION OF ACCREDITATION OF THE CORRESPONDENT CONCERNED.

11. IF UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS REQUEST A PRESS CONFERENCE FOLLOWING A MEETING OF THE UNCMAC, IT WILL BE HELD IN THE UNC PRESS BUILDING IN THE JSA. ONLY UNC SPONSORED CORRESPONDENTS

1. TO PROBE FURTHER WHETHER HUNGARIANS, AS SELF-APPOINTED SPOKESMEN FOR NORTH KOREANS, COULD SHED ANY FURTHER LIGHT ON KOREAN ATTITUDE TOWARD PUEBLO CASE, I HAD AMB CSATORDAY TO LUNCH IN RESIDENCE TODAY.
2. HE CONFIRMED SAME POINTS HE HAD CONVEYED THROUGH CANAD AMB, REPORTED REFTEL.
3. HE BEGAN, HOWEVER, BY EXPRESSING DISMAY AT PRESS LEAKS RE PREVIOUS COMMENTS HE HAD MADE IN PRIVATE CONSULTATIONS HERE. IN PARTICULARLY, HE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT NY TIMES STORY TODAY REPORTING HIS EARLIER SUGGESTION THAT ENTERPRISE BEING MOVED. HE INDICATED THAT HE HAD ALREADY MADE INQUIRIES AND REALIZED CORRESPONDENT CONCERNED, SHEEHAN, NORMALLY COVERS PENTAGON BEAT. I ASSURED HIM WE WERE MAKING EVERY EFFORT ASSURE AGAINST SUCH LEAKS AND THAT STATE DEPT AND DOD WOULD BOTH BE RESPONDING WITH "NO COMMENT" TO QUESTIONS ABOUT THE TIMES STORY.
4. PERHAPS MOST SIGNIFICANT OF CSATORDAY'S COMMENTS WAS HIS CATEGORIC STATEMENT, BASED ALLEGEDLY ON HIS INFO FROM PYONGYANG, THAT NORTH KOREANS WANT PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT OF PUEBLO CASE. HE SAID THIS MAY TAKE SOME TIME AND URGED AS HE HAD IN PAST THAT PROCESS CLD BE EXPEDITED BY REDUCING CHARACTER OF US MILITARY "THREAT". HE NOTED THAT ACCORDING TO TIMES, EVEN THOUGH ENTERPRISE MOVED OUT OF SEA OF JAPAN, IT WAS STILL WITHIN AIRSTRIKE RANGE OF NORTH KOREA. HE ADVOCATED WITHDRAWAL TO PEARL HARBOR OF US VESSELS THAT

HAD BEEN SENT TO AREA SINCE PUEBLO INCIDENT, SUGGESTING THIS BE DONE QUIETLY AND WITH NO ANNOUNCEMENTS EXCEPT PERHAPS PRIVATE COMMUNICATION TO NORTH KOREANS THAT WE WERE DOING SO.

5. AT ONE POINT, CSATORDAY SAID HE THOUGHT DIRECT US - NORTH KOREAN TALKS OUTSIDE OF MAC WLD BE MORE PRODUCTIVE. HE DID NOT PURSUE THIS HOWEVER, PARTICULARLY WHEN I RECALLED WE HAD PURSUED THIS MECHANISM IN RESPONSE TO OPEN NORTH KOREAN STATEMENT SUGGESTING PREVIOUS PRACTICES BE FOLLOWED.

6. IN RESPONSE TO QUESTION, CSATORDAY SAID HIS EARLIER COMMENT TO IGNATIEFF THAT MOST IMPORTANT ELEMENT IN SOLUTION MIGHT BE ASSURANCES RE NO FUTURE VIOLATION OF KOREAN TERRITORIAL WATERS WAS HIS OWN PERSONAL ASSESSMENT OF SITUATION AND DID NOT (REPEAT NOT) REFLECT ANY SPECIFIC INDICATION HE HAD FROM PYONGYANG THAT THAT WOULD BE THE CRITICAL POINT IN THEIR NEGOTIATING POSTURE.

7. HE OFFERED TO BE OF ANY POSSIBLE ASSISTANCE IN FACILITATING DIPLOMATIC SOLUTION, SAYING HIS INSTRUCTIONS GIVE HIM BROAD LATITUDE IN THIS REGARD.

8. WE HAD LONG GIVE AND TAKE ABOUT ALLEGED VIOLATION OF KOREAN TERRITORIAL WATERS BY PUEBLO; HE ALLEGED NORTH KOREANS HAVE INFO SHOWING VESSEL INTRUDED THEIR WATERS 5 TIMES DURING RADIO SILENCE. I EMPHASIZED THAT RELEVANT LEGAL QUESTION IS WHERE SHIP WAS SEIZED, THAT WE HAVE INCONTROVERTIBLE EVIDENCE IT WAS IN INTERNATIONAL WATERS WHEN APPREHENDED AND SEIZED AND THAT WE HAD NO (REPEAT NO) EVIDENCE IT HAD EVER INTRUDED. I STRESSED OPERATIONAL ORDER TO CAPTAIN REQUIRED HIM REMAIN 13 MILES FROM KOREAN SHORELINE INCLUDING ISLANDS. HE PLACED FAR LESS EMPHASIS ON CONTENTION SHIP SEIZED IN KOREAN WATERS THAN ON ARGUMENT IT HAD PREVIOUSLY VIOLATED THEM, FAILED ACKNOWLEDGE NATIONALITY AND OFFERED RESISTANCE WHEN CHALLENGED.

NORTH KOREANS COULD MAKE SUPERFICIAL ARGUMENT THAT BLUE HOUSE RAID AND PUEBLO SEIZURE WERE IN RETALIATION FOR THE ROK (ALLEGEDLY US/UNC) "AGGRESSIONS." SUCH ARGUMENTS MIGHT BE USED BY NORTH KOREA IN UN FORUM AND MAY EXPLAIN MORE HARD-NOSED SOVIET SUPPORT OF NORTH KOREA RECENTLY.

3. I BELIEVE SUCH NK PROPAGANDA ARGUMENTS TO BE ESSENTIALLY UNTRUE BECAUSE THE DEVELOPMENT OF NORTH KOREAN STRATEGY FOR ANTI-ROK OPERATIONS, SUBVERSION AND POROUS WAR CAN BE CLEARLY TRACED BACK TO EARLY 1965, AS CAN THE RAPID BUILDUP OF MASSIVE UNCONVENTIONAL WARFARE RESOURCES IN HIGHLY TRAINED PERSONNEL, FAST AGENT BOATS, COMMO FACILITIES AND MORE ORTHODOX ESPIONAGE AND AGITATION CAPABILITIES. ALSO FROM THAT DATE CAN BE TRACED THE NORTH KOREAN WIDESPREAD PROGRAM FOR INCREASED READINESS FOR OPEN WARFARE, INCLUDING MODERNIZATION AND

B. SOURCE SAID MANY UNTHINKING, NAIVE PRESSMEN DO NOT PARTICULARLY CARE IF THERE IS ANOTHER KOREAN WAR. MANY PRESSMEN EVADED MILITARY SERVICE DURING KOREAN WAR AND FULL IMPACT OF SUFFERING NOT BROUGHT HOME TO THEM, SOME IMAGINE A SECOND KOREAN WAR MIGHT BE LOCALIZED AND LEAD TO U.S. PUSH TO YALU AND KOREAN UNIFICATION.

C. 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MARCHING TOWARD FREEDOM BRIDGE. APPROXIMATELY 100 FORCED THEIR WAY ACROSS TO THE NORTH SIDE OF THE BRIDGE. MEMBERS OF THE 3/23, 2D INF DIV, FIRED WARNING SHOTS OVER THE HEADS OF THE MARCHERS. A QRF WAS IMMEDIATELY DISPATCHED AND ASSUMED BLOCKING POSITIONS. THE QRF MANAGED TO FORCE THE CROWD BACK AWAY FROM THE SOUTH END OF THE BRIDGE, AND ALSO ESCORTED APPROXIMATELY 100 KOREAN NATIONALS BACK TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE BRIDGE. BY 1300 HRS, THE SITUATION WAS UNDER CONTROL AND THE MARCHERS WERE BEING LOADED INTO TRUCKS AND MOVED OUT OF THE AREA. THE MARCHERS WERE 95 PER CENT HIGH SCHOOL AGE GIRLS AND WERE REPORTEDLY MEMBERS OF THE MUNSAN METHODIST CHURCH. THEY REPORTED

THEY PLANNED TO WALK TO THE PANMUNJOM AND HOLD A PROTEST DEMONSTRATION. NONE OF THE MARCHERS WAS ARMED AND NO ONE WAS INJURED.

COMMENT: THE PROPAGANDA BROADCAST QUOTED ABOVE WAS PRESUMABLY BY A CREW MEMBER OF THE USS PUEBLO.

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OF OUTLAWING THE COMMUNISTS'. THE RULING PARTY ALSO REPORTEDLY WILL DEMAND THAT THE NORTH KOREAN INCURSION INTO SEOUL BE BRANDED AS AN ACT OF AGGRESSION AND THAT THE U.S. CALL OFF THE TALKS AT PANMUNJOM. FOLLOWING A 5 FEBRUARY JOINT MEETING OF THE DRP LEADERS AND CABINET MEMBERS, A DRP SPOKESMAN SAID THAT HIS PARTY IS DISMAYED THAT THE U.S. IS CONDUCTING 'HUMILIATING' NEGOTIATIONS WITH NORTH KOREA ONLY FOR RELEASE OF THE PUEBLO WHILE PUTTING ASIDE THE NORTH KOREAN INFILTRATION INTO SEOUL ON 21 JANUARY. THE DRP SPOKESMAN CHARGED THAT THE U.S. FIRST CLAIMED THE PUEBLO WAS SEIZED IN INTERNATIONAL WATERS BUT IS NOW SAYING THAT IT IS NOT CLEAR WHETHER THE INCIDENT OCCURRED IN INTERNATIONAL WATERS OR IN NORTH KOREAN TERRITORIAL WATERS. HE REPORTEDLY POINTED OUT THAT SUCH A 'TIMID' ATTITUDE WILL ENCOURAGE NORTH KOREA TO FURTHER PROVOCATIONS. THE RULING PARTY ALSO EXPRESSED DISCONTENT OVER THE FACT THAT U.S. AMBASSADOR WILLIAM J. PORTER HAS BEEN CONTACTING PRESIDENT PAK CHONG-HUI DIRECTLY WITHOUT RECOURSE TO PROTOCOL CHANNELS. THE SPOKESMAN REPORTEDLY SAID HIS PARTY HAS ASKED THE GOVERNMENT TO WARN THE AMBASSADOR TO GO THROUGH PROPER CHANNELS IN CONTACTING THE ROK GOVERNMENT.

2. (C-NF) ROK GOVERNMENT REACTION. ACCORDING TO A 5 FEBRUARY HAPDONG NEWS AGENCY DISPATCH, THE ROK GOVERNMENT HAS EXPRESSED SURPRISE AT FOREIGN NEWS DISPATCHES THAT SECRETARY OF STATE DEAN RUSK AND DEFENSE SECRETARY ROBERT S. MCNAMARA ADMITTED IN A 4 FEBRUARY TELEVISION PROGRAM SUNDAY THAT THE PUEBLO MAY HAVE BEEN WITHIN THE 12 MILE LIMIT WHEN SEIZED BY NORTH KOREAN SHIPS. NO ELABORATION ON THE SUBJECT WAS GIVEN. ACCORDING TO THE DISPATCH, EXCEPT THAT FOREIGN MINISTRY OFFICIALS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE SAID THE U.S. IS GIVING THE IMPRESSION OF BEING TOO EAGER FOR A HASTY SOLUTION OF THE PUEBLO INCIDENT.

3. (C-NF) OPPOSITION REACTION. STATEMENTS CRITICAL OF U.S. HANDLING OF THE PUEBLO INCIDENT WERE ALSO ATTRIBUTED TO NATIONAL ASSEMBLYMEN OF THE OPPOSITION NEW DEMOCRATIC PARTY IN 5 FEBRUARY PRESS REPORTS. IN ADDITION, THE PARTY OF THE MASSES, A SPLINTER OPPOSITION GROUP, ISSUED A STATEMENT CRITICIZING THE NEGOTIATIONS AT PANMUNJOM. SOURCE: PRESS REPORTS, 5 FEBRUARY 1968.

4. (C-NF) COMMENT ON PARAS 1-3. THE STATEMENTS ATTRIBUTED TO GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND RULING PARTY LEADERS IN TODAY'S NEWS DISPATCHES APPEAR TO REFLECT AN UNOFFICIAL POSITION OF THE ROK GOVERN-



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MENT BASED ON THE VIEW THAT THE INTERESTS OF THE ROK WILL BE SERVED BEST BY A PROLONGED CONFRONTATION BETWEEN THE U.S. AND NORTH KOREA. INITIALLY SUCH STATEMENTS WERE MADE BY NATIONAL ASSEMBLYMEN AND RULING PARTY MEMBERS AS INDIVIDUALS, BUT THE STATEMENTS REPORTED ON 5 FEBRUARY WERE ATTRIBUTED TO FOREIGN MINISTRY OFFICIALS OR ADVANCED AS THE

POLICY OF THE DRP.

5. (C-NF) PRESS REACTION. FIVE OF SEOUL'S SIX AFTERNOON PAPERS ON 5 FEBRUARY CARRIED FRONT PAGE ARTICLES ALLEGING THAT MINISTER OF NATIONAL DEFENSE KIM SONG-UN SERVED GENERAL BONESTEEL WITH A STRONG PROTEST AGAINST CURRENT U.S.-NORTH KOREAN NEGOTIATIONS AT A MEETING AT THE DEFENSE MINISTRY ON 4 FEBRUARY. THE ARTICLES DESCRIBED THE NEGOTIATIONS AS BEING CONDUCTED WITHOUT ANY PRIOR NOTIFICATION TO THE KOREAN SIDE. SEVERAL SOUTL DAILIES ALSO CARRIED EDITORIALS WARNING AGAINST THE ILLUSION THAT SETTLEMENT OF THE PUEBLO INCIDENT ALONE WOULD PUT AN END TO TENSIONS IN KOREAN AND PREDICTING THAT APPEASEMENT WILL ONLY ENCOURAGE NORTH KOREA TO EMBARK ON FURTHER PROVOCATIONS.

6. (C-NF) OTHER POLITICAL DEVELOPMENTS. THE RULING AND OPPOSITION PARTIES ON 5 FEBRUARY AGREED IN PRINCIPLE TO HOLD DEFENSE MINISTER KIM SONG-UN AND HOME MINISTER YI HO RESPONSIBLE FOR THE NORTH KOREAN INFILTRATION INTO SEOUL ON 21 JANUARY. ACCORDING TO PRESS REPORTS THE AGREEMENT WAS MADE A MEETING OF FLOOR LEADERS OF BOTH PARTIES, BUT WHILE THE OPPOSITION NEW DEMOCRATIC PARTY IS PRESSING FOR IMMEDIATE RESIGNATIONS, THE RULING DEMOCRATIC REPUBLICAN

PARTY HOLDS THAT THE RESIGNATIONS SHOULD BE POSTPONED UNTIL AFTER SETTLEMENT OF THE PUEBLO INCIDENT AND NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE U.S. FOR MODERNIZATION OF THE ARMED FORCES. position in less than five minutes. It is apparent that the North Koreans intend their SAMS for point defense and will rely mainly on fighter aircraft for area defense.

PART TWO: No changes have been noted in the array of naval units shadowing the three U.S. Task Groups now in the southern Sea of Japan. The USSR has not yet reacted publicly to the 31 January collision of the Soviet Merchantman "Kapitan Vislobokov" and the U.S. destroyer "Rowan" about 100 miles off the South Korean coast.

PART THREE: Activity in the DMZ area remained light with only one chance encounter and one sighting of suspected intruders reported; no weapons were fired. COMUSKOREA'S assessment states that "North Korea is also expected to continue to penetrate the ROK through the DMZ for reconnaissance purposes and to engage in hostile acts against UNC forces and against other installations and elements within the ROK. Although North Korea has the capability to renew conventional hostilities utilizing ground, naval, and air forces, it is unlikely to do so. However, the possibility cannot be discounted that the North Koreans may act in an irrational manner."

PART FOUR: In the first South Korean government statement since the Pueblo seizure, Prime Minister Chong IL-Kwon reportedly told

the national assembly on 1 February that North Korea would launch "large-scale raids" across the DMZ "next year" to pave the way for the reunification of Korea by force. He stated that 1968 would see intensified raids against selected targets--probably of the same type as that on the presidential mansion in Seoul--to lay the groundwork. This strategy would be in keeping with Pyongyang's announced plans to reunite the country by 1970. Chong reportedly also said that specialized units of commandos, spies, and airborne troops totaling 15,000 men were being trained as the vanguard of the operations planned for the next two years. Meanwhile South Korean President Park Chong-Hui warned that his country might retaliate if North Korea renewed its provocations. In his statement, which cited both the raid on Seoul and the capture of the Pueblo, he said that, while South Korea rejected force as a means of reunifying the country, its patience was wearing thin. 1. The Department of Defense today (2 February) issued  
the following statement:

"The Soviet merchant ship Kapitan Vislobokov and the  
destroyer USS Rowan (DD-782) had a minor collision in the Sea  
of Japan approximately 95 miles east of Pohang, South Korea,  
at 1:53 p.m., EST, on Wednesday, January 31.

"There were no personnel casualties aboard the destroyer  
Rowan and no personnel casualties were reported by the  
merchant ship. The Rowan sustained 'minor damage,' a  
three-foot hole above the water line on the port bow. When  
queried by flashing light, the Vislobokov signaled 'no assistance  
required' and 'damage to my stern two meters in length.'

Part 3. Canadian Press Reaction: The American Consul in Winnepeg, Canada, has reported the following Canadian press reaction to the Pueblo incident: Quote: On Jan 31, the Winnepeg Free Press editorial noted <sup>that the</sup> ~~apparent~~ <sup>es</sup> interest in settling Pueblo question could be calm before the storm. US realized it would be inopportune to open second front in Korea. Plan of North Korea is imponderable. Many believe new offensive is being launched to bring South Korea under communist rule. Crisis may be kept simmering until outcome of Khe Sanh is decided. If North Vietnamese are defeated at Khe Sanh, US will have time and means to deal with North Koreans. If US forces are made to retreat, American public may demand decisive action and many things could happen. End quote. (Unclassified, for background use only).

Part 4. The Japanese press has reported the first-hand impressions of a Japanese businessman who was in Pyongyang during the first week of the Pueblo crisis. These impressions were summarized as follows: (1) the feeling of tension in Pyongyang rose to an extreme level after the Pueblo Incident; (2) apparently the North Korean people doubted that the

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US would attack them; (3) in their relations with China and the Soviet Union, the North Koreans lean toward the Soviets but in case war occurs they would probably accept assistance from both. *The following quotes are taken from the article:*

At present in North Korea complete mobilization of the people and conversion of the nation into a fortress is being undertaken in response to the intensification of the war in Vietnam. One example of this is the modification of the seven-year plan. This plan should have been completed last year but it has already been postponed for three years. There are those on the western side who will view this as a failure of the plan but high officials of the North Korean Govt I have talked to said that Qte because tensions are being increased at present on the 38th parallel, the seven year plan was revised and extended to permit us to carry out both a national defense economy and consumer economy at the same time. During the earlier Korean War we were grinding our teeth when the American troops were in front of our very eyes and we were short of arms and ammunition but this time every person in the country is armed. These preparations are complete. *UNQTE.* Further, they say that defense industries and heavy industries have been located underground to withstand any kind of attack. Essentially their posture is qte let them come anytime unqte. I believe that this North Korean policy of total national mobilization is related to the war in VietNam because it was begun about a time ROK troops participated in the war in Viet Nam about a year ago. *GP 4*
