'Sick, Empty People Now Come to Life'

Lillian Smith Raps New Authors

Novelist Lillian Smith who is fighting her own war against cancer could not be present last night to accept the Queen Esther scroll, in a handcarved cedar case, bestowed on her by the Women's Division of the American Jewish Congress. Instead, she sent an acceptance speech that was sharply critical of current poets, playwrights and novelists.

The 67-year-old author made no mention of her own controversial novel, "Strange Fruit," that was banned in Boston 22 years ago because of obscene language, but she charged that today's writers, poets, and dramatists "have forgotten what every real artist knows: (that) men imitate art, art does not imitate men."

IN HER SPEECH, read by actress Eugenia Rawls of New York City, a close friend, Miss Smith accused the poets, playwrights and novelists of being demagogues "guilty of arousing fear and despair," of treating "hope as the four-letter

word you must never be caught using.

"They are still talking the old nihilisms of the 19th Century; they are still moaning about the human condition and the tragic absurdity of man's plight, the hideous lack of cosmic purpose," she declared.

"I cannot think of one who is creating characters who might have qualities needed for this adventurous age. Instead, they are giving us fragmented sketches of sick people; they hold before us in play and story a never-ending view of miserable, lost, lonely schizophrenics."

TO SEE THE effect this is having on the young, Miss Smith continued, "All we need do is look around us: at the beats and the smokers of pot and the kids in high school who are now drug addicts, and the young homosexuals flaunting their deviations.

"They are the characters in the plays now come to life; they are now acting out in real homes and real streets the splintered fanta-

However, she explained, "It is not the presence of these splintered, sick, empty people in books and on

stage that is wrong; it is acting as if there is nobody else in the world . . ."

MISS SMITH said only the poet can look beyond the details of today's problems—police brutality and capital punishment, school dropouts and drug addiction of the young, housing and unemployment, ghettos and poor schools, violent death of the good and valiant young who are trying to win dignity and freedom for others—at the total picture.

It is the poet's job, she continued, "to scoop up the debris of our times and show us the giant outlines of the human spirit becoming more able to relate to the unknown and the unseen."

If the great poets and artists do not appear, then it is up to "every sensitive person to bring the poet inside you alive . . . to span with imagination great segments of time and space" to see the victories that the future must hold.

Miss Smith was honored by the Jewish women "for courage and commitment in advancing human freedom."

OTHER highlights of yesterday's activities:

- Dr. Joachim Prinz, president of the American Jewish Congress, scored East Germany for support of Arab "adventures" while saying that West Germany has "at least begun the great task of moral redemption."

- Sen. George McGovern (D-S.D.) said a "peace offensive as well as a military offensive" is needed in Viet-Nam. He asked for a ceasefire, gradual withdrawal of all foreign troops to be replaced by a U.N. peace-keeping force and the promise of elections in both North and South Viet-Nam.

- Women delegates sent a message to President Johnson, endorsing his talk on voting rights and asking Federal enforcement of the Constitution in Alabama. In addition, they wrote Gov. George Wallace, asking him to allow peaceful demonstrations in Alabama.

NO RIGHT-THINKING AMERICAN CAN READ THE DISPATCHES OF THE VIOLENCE IN SELMA, ALABAMA, WITHOUT A FEELING OF REPULSION AND SORROW THAT HIS FELLOW CITIZENS CAN BE SUBJECTED TO SUCH PAIN AND HUMILIATION IN AN EFFORT TO SECURE THE RIGHTS DUE THEM UNDER OUR CONSTITUTION. THE VICIOUS TREATMENT OF DEFENSELESS, ORDERLY MARCHERS, INCLUDING WOMEN AND CHILDREN, BY STATE TROOPERS IS

UNWORTHY OF A SOVEREIGN STATE OF THESE UNITED STATES AND PUTS ALABAMA OUTSIDE THE PALE OF CIVILIZED SOCIETY. THE CHALLENGE TO OUR DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPLES BY THE RACIST ALABAMA GOVERNMENT CAN BE TOLERATED NO LONGER BY THE REST OF AMERICA. THE NATIONAL CONSCIENCE DEMANDS VIGOROUS ACTION TO SAFEGUARD HUMAN RIGHTS AND DIGNITY AGAINST BRUTAL OFFICIALS WHO ARE DEVOID OF ELEMENTAL DECENCY OR COMPASSION. INACTION BY FEDERAL GOVERNMENT CAN RESULT ONLY IN ADDITIONAL TRAGEDIES TO HELPLESS CITIZENS WHO MUST LOOK TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR PROTECTION IN THEIR DESPERATE FLIGHT. I RESPECTFULLY APPEAL TO YOU TO EXERCISE THE FULL MIGHT

OF FEDERAL AUTHORITY TO IMPRESS UPON THE ARROGANT GOVERNOR
WALLACE THAT HIS DEFIANCE OF THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE
UNITED STATES MUST END FORTHWITH. LET GOVERNOR WALLACE KNOW
