The People to People Program was initiated in 1954 by the Federal Government to further the cause of world understanding and peace. People to People, Inc. was established in November of 1961 as a private, non-profit organization to provide centralized leadership to the People to People Program. This category contains material on the personnel of the People to People Program, organizing on college campuses, national conventions and meetings of People to People Program, sister city projects, and the President's acceptance of the honorary chairmanship. Includes proposals for Citizen Exchange Corps and additional projects for revitalization of the program; and reports on specific People to People projects, such as Operation Brotherhood, Americans at Home, citizen exchange groups, and good neighbor missions. 3 1/2". |
