Congressman and Mrs. Kleberg To Be Official Guests At Monterrey Fiesta

Congressman Richard M. Kleberg
and Mrs. Kleberg will leave Satur-
day morning for Monterrey where
they will spend several days, re-
turning here Monday or Tuesday.

In Monterrey Mr. and Mrs. Kle-
berg will be official guests at the
fiesta Sunday afternoon which will
mark the opening of the October
fair and the third annual Agricul-
tural and Livestock exposition. The
official invitation was extended to
them by Juan S. Farias of the Mon-
terrey chamber of commerce and
secretary of the fair exposition as-
sociation.

People of the Corpus Christi sec-
tion and of all South Texas should
develop an active interest in Mon-
terrey's fair and should show that
interest by attendance at the expo-
sition. Kleberg declared here this
morning. He is an earnest advo-

cate of the development of a great-
er understanding between the peo-
ple of South Texas and the peo-
ple of Northern Mexico and feels
that real understanding and friend-
ship can be built only on the
knowledge which is gained from the
intermingling of peoples.

Kleberg has been highly com-
mended by Mexican and Monterrey
officials for the interest he has
shown in improving the under-
standing between the two groups
and for the personal friendship he
always has shown for the Mexican
groups.

A considerable number of Corpus
Christi people have shown inter-
est in the Monterrey fair and it
is expected that a number of par-
ties will visit there during the fair
period which is from Sunday, Oc-
tober 21, through Sunday, Octo-
ber 28.
